WORDS OF THE RABBI Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

Divine Wonders and Masterpieces Grace the Palace

The Baal Shem Tov, the 18th century spiritual master who founded the Chasidic movement, once recited the following parable. Two men went into the royal palace to see the king. At the entrance, though, they were informed that the king was not holding court that day. One left immediately, but the other asked permission to visit the palace, and view its beautiful paintings and works of art.

This, explained the Baal Shem Tov, is very similar to our relationship with G-d and the Torah. Within each of us is a seeker, someone who longs for contact with the Divine. We seek to enter the palace. But we experience that the Divine King is not holding court today. We have trouble finding our way in. We don't seem to have the facility to march right into the Divine King's chambers. Indeed, the fact that the Baal Shem Tov felt it necessary to tell this story to his followers seems to indicate that even back then, our ancestors had the same problems that we do. Or as the saying goes, "we're not as spiritual as we used to be, but then again, we never were!"

In any case, those who have immediate access to the Divine are few and far between. That's just the way things are. The crucial issue is, what do we do when we find our way to the Divine King blocked? Do we just walk away? All too often, the answer is yes. I know a camera buff who once showed me one of the new cameras that loads the film for you, adjusts the light for you, focuses the lens for you, adjusts the F-stop for you, and on and on. It wouldn't have surprised me if the thing could cook dinner for you. And my camera buff friend said, "If they can make cameras this easy, they could make Judaism this easy." And since they didn't (whoever "they" is), he had basically turned his back on our tradition.

But, of course, there's a difference. The camera with all the bells and whistles can do just about everything—except make you a great photographic artist. For that, you need inspiration. And inspiration comes from G-d. So, in other words, what Judaism has to offer begins where the camera's contribution ends.

But we'll never get to experience that inspiration if we just walk away

from the palace. We need to take advantage of those Divine wonders and masterpieces that grace the palace, even if we don't get to see the King himself. And in Judaism, those Divine wonders and masterpieces are found in the study of Torah and immersion in the richness of Jewish culture. At Bnai Tikvah, you can find all of this in abundance. And you will be able to enjoy the fellowship of other seekers like yourself.

Our tradition teaches us that when two sit together to study Torah, the Presence of G-d is with them—so who knows, you might just get a glimpse of the King himself after all!

PayPal @ B'nai Tikvah

We've been talking about it in various committee and Board meetings for quite some time. Now it's a reality.

We are now registered with PayPal as a "Charitable Organization", which means we pay considerably less in transaction fees than a typical business for the same level of service. In addition, because we do our own website integration, we pay absolutely no overhead fees or monthly service charges. The cost to the synagogue per transaction is 2.2% +30 cents, which, in the case of a \$42.00 Lulav & Etrog purchase, comes out to be \$1.22.

If you are involved in a committee that raises funds for the synagogue, consider the benefit of adding PayPal to your on-line order forms. The feedback received from the Giants Raffle, was very positive. The committee felt that *many tickets were sold, solely based on the ease at which some people were able to make the purchase online.*

ANOTHER VIEWPOINT

Sweating it Out

The long term weather reports issued for sailors, said that rain and thunderstorms were predicted for Sunday, September 14th. All the work and time and out of pocket expenses of the members of the Rejoice 2008 committee would be for naught. The e-mails were flying back and forth among the committee day and night. How many vendors do we have as of today? Where should the stage be placed and at what angle? Do we have to feed the bands and other entertainers? Where did we store the t-shirts and where can we get the best price? How many acts should we engage and which ones should go first? How many volunteers do we need to help the police direct cars for parking? What if the food vendors' truck breaks down on the way to the event?

All of the hundreds of ifs that had to be planned for, and worst of all, what if it rains? Well, if it rains in the afternoon, it won't be so bad, but what if it rains in the morning? Some "ifs" can be dealt with, but rain does not lend itself to mitigation. All we can do is pray that it does not rain. In all of religious history people have prayed for rain, but now if our prayers were to be answered, it would be a day of no rain.

With this possible calamity in the back of our minds we had to plan ahead and ignore the consequences of adverse weather. Five days before the 14th it looked like a total washout. Thank goodness that we had purchased rain insurance. Rain insurance? Most folks have never heard of rain insurance. Rain insurance is intended to reimburse expenses lost because an event had to be cancelled due to inclement weather. The policy spells out exactly under what circumstances it would pay in case of loses. What if it rains only a little? What if it just looks like rain or rains just enough to scare off people, but not enough to stop the entertainment?

SUPERMARKET GIFT CARDS

The Leaves Keep Tumblin' Down

Don't know if my title is a direct quote from any song or poem. If it is, I hope the person who wrote this line will forgive me for not putting the line in quotes. But back to the obvious; it is October. It's that time of year when the leaves do turn color. Gone are most of the green leaves, replaced by those turning the beautiful shades of red, yellow and orange. It's the sign that nature is ready to start its winter hibernation. Similarly, we humans also begin our "hibernation" of sorts. As the weather cools down we spend more time indoors. It doesn't mean that we get less active, it means that we are just taking it inside where it is warmer. Instead of the outdoor pool, we seek the indoor pool at health clubs and the like. Too cold to ride bicycles? We spend more time at the same places; using the equipment (including stationary bikes). The backyard barbecues are replaced by the indoor dinner party. I don't need to elaborate any further. I think you've got the general idea where I'm heading.



No matter where our activities occur, there is one constant. We still need to eat. We still need to go grocery shopping. We still need the supermarket gift cards and its committee, the Supermarket Gift Card (SGC) Committee. Our participating supermarkets - A&P, Acme, Pathmark, Shop Rite, Stop & Shop and Whole Foods as well as Lox, Stock & Deli (LSD) - continue to offer Congregation B'nai Tikvah (CBT) the great opportunity to raise some greatly needed funds. It is an easy fundraiser, too. To illustrate the power of this fundraiser, let me offer a conservative example:

approximately # of CBT families	400	
monthly SGC purchase	x \$100	
monthly total	\$ 40,000	
multiplied by 12 months	= \$480,000	sold for year
CBT retains	x 5%	
CBT's approximate net	= \$24,000	

Yes, you read that correctly. The amount would be approximately the above listed figure; less the amount deducted for using credit cards, etc. I know it is a pipe dream to expect each and every family to be so committed to a single fundraiser, but it is a nice goal to have in front of us. In reality, some families would be buying more than the monthly figure, other

families would not be buying anything at all. I just have to ask: WHY AREN'T YOU? Do you not eat? Do you not shop at any of these places? Do you not go to LSD at least once a year? You don't even have to eat at LSD to use these cards, they accept the cards for purchasing the products and going home with them. I know why you don't buy. You don't think you need to support CBT! That's it, isn't it? Well, next time you criticize CBT for NOT doing what you expect, remember CBT does what it can for you. Just do all that you can do for CBT. (The tone of this sounds vaguely familiar to me.)

Ok, if I've gotten you to consider/re-consider buying SGCs, here are the different ways to purchase them (nothing changes from month to month):

Visit the SGC committee table during religious school on Sundays

Stop by CBT during office hours

Go on-line at bnaitikvah.org (order form on line, too)

Remember: if you can't or won't get to CBT to get the cards, ask one of the above listed people how to arrange for FREE delivery. Yes, FREE as in no charge to and right to your door, too!

This month's tips: 1) Got a college aged student residing near any of our participating supermarkets, including Whole Foods? Stock them up with SGCs. Let them go and choose what they want to buy. It saves you having from pack and send the bulky bags or boxes. 2) Got an occasion coming up? Stick a SGC in the card. Some of the cards come in as low as \$25 amounts. You can even buy that greeting card at one of these stores using your own SGC! How handy, if I must say so myself. 3) Saving the biggie for last: are you going to a college/professional football game this season? Are you going to do a tail gate party? Stock up on those SGCs so that you can buy your provisions at these places. These were three helpful, harmless ways to participate as SGC purchasers/users. You'll be supporting CBT. We thank you.

Stop watching those leaves fall and come by and buy your SGCs. Until November...


