


SYNAGOGUE HOSPITALITY**A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff**

Ron Wolfson, our upcoming L'dor Vador scholar in residence, has a simple, fool-proof method for gauging the health of a synagogue. He walks into a shul and sits down in the lobby. And waits. He waits until someone passes by and asks him who he is, welcomes him, and sees if he requires any assistance. Sometimes he can wait for hours. And if he does, that synagogue is in big trouble.

Synagogues are meant to be many things. A synagogue is a house of prayer (*beit tfillah*), and a house of study (*beit midrash*). But at the top of the list, the synagogue is the place where a community gathers together (*beit kneset*). And if the culture of a particular synagogue is such that someone who walks in is ignored, and thereby excluded from the community, that synagogue is destroying itself.

Although Dr. Wolfson is at the cutting edge of current thinking about Jewish organizations, his instincts about welcoming reflect an ancient awareness. Our father Abraham was known for his hospitality. The rabbis went so far as to say that Abraham had a specially constructed tent, that could be rolled up on all sides, so that Abraham could look in every direction to see if there was someone he could invite into his home. And when he saw someone, he ran to greet them, because he realized what a great mitzvah it was to honor a guest.

There are many people who think that the hidden message, when one joins a synagogue, is "Shalom. Here's your bill. Don't make trouble, and don't sit in anyone's seat." At CBT, thank G-d, we work very hard to avoid that impression, and to encourage all of our members to be ambassadors to everyone who could become a member of our community. But we can always do more.

A wonderful story is told about Rabbi Isser Zalman Meltzer, a great teacher of Jewish ethics, who was told that a very important person was about to visit him. The rabbi ran to the door, only to discover that the guest was an ordinary person who just happened to look like the VIP. But Rabbi Meltzer still pulled out all the stops, seated his visitor at the head of the table, prepared a fine meal, and so forth. It turns out that the visitor only had a simple administrative request for the rabbi, and was a little embarrassed at all the attention. But Rabbi Meltzer took care of the visitor's needs, walked the man all the way to the street, and effusively wished him all success.

After the man left, Rabbi Meltzer's family asked him why he was so gracious to the (as it turned out) insignificant visitor. And Rabbi Meltzer, recalling Abraham our father, pointed out that this visitor was a gift from G-d, because he taught the rabbi an important lesson. . When the rabbi thought (mistakenly) that the visitor was somebody important, he envisioned in his own mind the right way to treat a guest. When he discovered the truth about the visitor's identity, the rabbi realized that, as a fellow human being and a fellow Jew, the "unimportant" man was important in his own right, and therefore deserved the regal treatment important people get.

So does everyone who enters our spiritual home. They are important. At CBT, we're good, but we can't stop at being good. Not for important people. As welcoming as we are, we can still do more. We can learn by listening carefully to Dr. Wolfson, who literally wrote the book on *The Spirituality of Welcoming*. And we can listen to our own hearts, and try passionately to treat each other with the love and concern and respect we wish for ourselves.

I look forward to seeing you during the L'dor Vador weekend, Nov. 19-21.

Since becoming associated with our synagogue, I have envisioned bringing this level of enthusiastic learning and spirit to B'nai Tikvah. AND for you to become inspired, excited and empowered in this same way. So far, the concerts have been great fun and truly inspirational and I know there continues to be great enthusiasm for L'dor Vador.

Each of us who participate in Jewish communal life, are here to create a legacy for our children to draw upon just as our parents and ancestors, enrich our memories. L'dor Vador helps to inspire and empower of our sacred and vital Jewish community.

As many of you know, this is my tenth year serving B'nai Tikvah as cantor. Being your cantor is an all consuming endeavor of passion. This position has been transformative for me and has been empowered by my love of my family and their constant support. I am inspired by God, Israel and our Jewish people. Upon reaching this landmark, I've become very introspective even a little melancholy. My self-awareness is pretty accurate and I work hard to overcome my shortcoming and am very fortunate to be able to highlight my strengths. I am thankful to the dedicated volunteers who work so hard with me and our wonderful supportive rabbi, staff and congregation, who help make B'nai Tikvah a place where I am able to express my aspirations, unhindered.

Like many, I find it difficult finding the appropriate words to express my thoughts in depth and clarity. Communicating with you is what I do, but singing is my usual medium. Yet I've poured out my soul to you in Hakol, with as much energy and kavanah (intent) as the most profound prayer that I have ever chanted. I write to you from my heart, with every good intent, to help you think and wonder. I ask you to act, mostly on your own behalf, in a practical, spiritual framework and I try to direct you gently and without judgment.

Clearly there are times to be forceful. L'dor Vador and the other extraordinary programs, religious services and educational opportunities are vital aspects of our lives. This year with the guidance of our scholar in residence Dr. Ron Wolfson, we will explore sacred spirituality, passionate Jewish communal life and "What on earth are we here for?"

I skipped right to the back of the book "What are the 7 questions You're Asked in Heaven?", but I won't give away the ending here, but on page 145, the author, Dr. Wolfson, makes a statement which I think is very significant. "How can I be me, fulfilling my unique potential, in my job, with my family and friends, by serving others?"

We all have a legacy and hope to have an impact on the future of our children and generations to come. We are descendants and ancestors; we are not burdened by our legacy but have a responsibility to fulfill our lives purposefully.

If you have not already saved the date, please do it now and plan to spend as much time as possible at B'nai Tikvah, especially November 19, 20 & 21.

L'dor Vador, we celebrate our gratitude to our parents who inspire us to encourage our children to embrace our legacy, L'dor Vador, form generation to generation. *A Source of Pride and Enlightenment.*

3. Donate money that will be specifically used to purchase items on a family's wish list. Checks should be made payable to Congregation B'nai Tikvah Holiday Program.



ConTEXT Program

Another Viewpoint A Real Hero

In my kitchen cabinet, where I keep my collection of coffee mugs, there is one with the picture of Anne Frank. I got that mug for acting as a docent at the Anne Frank exhibit when it came to South Brunswick some years ago. Part of the exhibit consisted of an old fashioned milk can, the kind that dairy farmers use to leave with fresh milk for the dairy company trucks to collect for processing and distribution. That can was one of two found by Polish construction workers after World War II, when they were clearing away debris in the former Warsaw Ghetto.

Inside these milk cans were diaries and letters written by victims of the Nazi purge of the ghetto. The leader of this group was Emanuel Ringelblum.

Ringelblum was an historian who gathered a group of (mostly) men to write each and every occurrence that they would encounter every day. Good or bad, it was all part of the history of the ghetto. Everything was described in detail and collected as witness to the extermination of the Jewish population of Poland and went by the secret code name of Oneg Shabbat Archive.

Emanuel Ringelblum found these milk cans and stored all of the collected writings in these cans, and buried them in hopes that they would be found in the future, as indeed they were. Ringelblum and his wife and young son were smuggled out of the ghetto and could have escaped, but chose to stay in the area to make certain this work was completed and his milk cans safely buried.

An organization known as the National Yiddish Book Center, in Amherst Massachusetts (see October 2010 page 15) as part of their campus built an area called the Writers Garden as a fund raiser, in which they honored a long list of Yiddish writers. I invited my brothers to join me in creating a plaque in memory of our parents and to honor one of the Yiddish writers.

When I received a copy of the list of Yiddish writers, all of the better known names, such as Shalom Aleichem, Shalom Asch or Isaac B. Singer, were already taken.

When I researched other names, the one that struck me was Emanuel Ringelblum. This man was a true hero in every sense. He could have made good his escape, but he stayed to make sure that we, you and I, would some day know the detailed truth of everything that occurred daily in that living hell, the Warsaw Ghetto. As a consequence, they were arrested and murdered.

Some of us have heroic pens. Ringelblum had a heroic heart. I believe that my parents would be pleased to know that their names are on the same plaque with Emanuel Ringelblum.




