A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



The Baal Shem Tov, the 18th century spiritual master who founded the Chasidic movement, once recited the following parable. Two men went into the royal palace to see the king. At the entrance, though, they were informed that the king was not holding court that day. One left immediately, but the other asked permission to visit the palace, and view its beautiful paintings and works of art.

This, explained the Baal Shem Tov, is very similar to our relationship with G-d and the Torah. Within each of us is a seeker, someone who longs for contact with the Divine. We seek to enter the palace. But we experience that the Divine King is not holding court today. We have trouble finding our way in. We don't seem to have the facility to march right into the Divine King's chambers. Indeed, the fact that the Baal Shem Tov felt it necessary to tell this story to his followers seems to indicate that even back then, our ancestors had the same problems that we do. Or as the saying goes, "we're not as spiritual as we used to be, but then again, we never were!"

In any case, those who have immediate access to the Divine are few and far between. That's just the way things are. The crucial issue is, what do we do when we find our way to the Divine King blocked? Do we just walk away? All too often, the answer is yes. I know a camera buff who once showed me one of the new cameras that loads the film for you, adjusts the light for you, focuses the lens for you, adjusts the F-stop for you, and on and on. It wouldn't have surprised me if the thing could cook dinner for you. And my camera buff friend said, "If they can make cameras this easy, they could make Judaism this easy." And since they didn't (whoever "they" is), he had basically turned his back on our tradition.

But, of course, there's a difference. The camera with all the bells and whistles can do just about everything—except make you a great photographic artist. For that, you need inspiration. And inspiration comes from G-d. So, in other words, what Judaism has to offer begins where the camera's contribution ends.

But we'll never get to experience that inspiration if we just walk away from the palace. We need to take advantage of those Divine wonders and masterpieces that grace the palace, even if we don't get to see the King himself. And in Judaism, those Divine wonders and masterpieces are found in the study of Torah.

Now that the fall holidays are coming to a close, we will turn away from big public events and focus on the daily joy of regular Torah study. There will be opportunities galore to study—we are planning discussions about Jewish parenting, kabbalah, Jewish history, midrash—a whole world of Jewish subjects. Sooner or later, you're sure to find a masterpiece on the palace wall. I hope to be there with you when you do.


Tuesday, October 29– Purim in October

ANOTHER VIEWPOINT



The Good Old Days?

I can't find my keys and I forget appointments but I recall things that happened when I was a boy back in the 1920s. Those were the days when our culture was still transitioning from gas lights to electricity. I remember our address in 1926 was 1474 Washington Avenue in the Bronx. In the hallway leading from the door to the kitchen, there was a fixture that could provide light either by gas or electricity. The fixture had a light socket facing down and contained a bulb surrounded by a rose shaped glass cover, and the upper part had a gas light facing toward the ceiling, with a gas jet and valve that could be turned on to provide light if the electric power failed.

The horse drawn wagons of the day were still competing with automobiles. Auto brakes were still mechanical, and while modern hydraulic brakes can be actuated easily, the mechanical brakes of those days required a strong foot for the brake pedal to stop your car. But stopping a car was still a lot easier than stopping a horse drawn wagon filled with fruits and vegetables.

Unlike today's supermarkets, the wagons were a common sight and collisions with autos were not uncommon. As I came down the front steps from our house I saw a wagon pulled by a horse trotting past us going toward the street corner and just as it reached the corner a car pulled out of the cross street in front of the horse. The car came to a stop but the heavily loaded wagon was too much for the horse and it reared up with its front legs in the air and came down onto the top of the car.

In those days cars were still built with fabric roofs and so the poor horse plunged his forefeet into the interior of the car. I don't know what happened to the passengers as my mother pulled me away as people ran to help at the scene. The fate of the horse became known to me when I saw him lying in the street for a couple of days until they could send a special vehicle to remove the body.

It has been many years since I have had the pleasure of riding a horse, but whenever I had the opportunity to ride I would remember the scene of that poor animal lying in the street, covered with flies until it was carried away.

Believe me, when I hear people talking about the "good old days", I know their memories are even shorter than mine. The good old days never were.

What about the founders and past presidents of B'nai Tikvah? It is our goal to lead this congregation in a direction that makes them proud, and to ensure that their legacy is sustained.

Then there is the famous quote: "Before you criticize someone, you should walk a mile in their shoes." (Some woman later quipped: "I would walk a mile in your shoes, but I know they're as uncomfortable as mine!") Congregants in our synagogue and people in our neighborhoods surely have challenges that we cannot even imagine. We must make it our mission to think about the big issues of our time from someone else's perspective; to put away the pettiness and adopt a new mindset of openness and cooperation.

And finally, here is one more: "I cried because I had no shoes...until I met a man who had no feet." What could be more humbling? As much as we love our shoes, in the end they are just things and, in fairness, pretty trivial things. With the holidays behind us, we resolve that this year, we will renew our focus on our friends and family – and that is especially true for our congregational family here at B'nai Tikvah.

Yoga class (or Zumba) with Miss Joann will take place every other Monday. On alternating Wednesdays, we have music with Mrs. Cohen or Library in the Youth Lounge. On one Friday per month, we have Soccer with Coaches Spencer, Ryan, or Eddie.

We sell challahs all year round as a fundraiser. Challahs can be picked up on Fridays. If you are interested in ordering, please contact the school office.

All our fundraising money goes to our children; whether it is for special equipment or exciting programs. We have a new Smart Board in our pre-k room, purchased with fundraising money from our JCC families. All staff members were trained in its use. We hope to fundraise for a lap top computer to go with it. Our current classroom computers are outdated and very slow.

We have started our Kidstuff coupon book sale. They are similar to the Entertainment books. Families save money on clothing, shoes, sporting goods, toys, activities, electronics, food (including Shoprite) and more. They make a great gift. The cost is \$25.00 per book and they are available in the school office.

In September, all classes will learn about the holidays of Sukkot and Simchat Torah.

Historically, Sukkot commemorates the forty-year period during which the children of Israel were wandering in the desert, living in temporary shelters. Agriculturally, Sukkot is a harvest festival and is sometimes referred to as Chag Ha-Asif, the Festival of Ingathering. The word "Sukkot" means "booths," and refers to the temporary dwellings that we are commanded to live in during this holiday in memory of the period of wandering.

Decorations for the shul sukkah and their own family sukkahs will be created and the brachot (blessings) on the lulav and etrog will be learned. We will snack in the sukkah whenever the weather permits. Flags and Torahs will be designed for Simchat Torah. The children will march with them up and down the halls!

Our 3's and Pre-k classes will be going to Giamarese Farm in East Brunswick on September 25th. They will go on a hayride and pick apples, just in time for the fall.

On Shabbat October 5 we will be learning about Noah and the ark. Each class will be making projects and doing activities relating to this topic.

On Friday, October 18 children (ages 18 months to 3 years old), along with a parent, grandparent or caretaker will begin our Shabbat Together program. It is an hour program from 10:45 AM to 11:45 AM on one Friday a month. The first half hour is with Morah Phyllis (Denenberg) where the children learn about Shabbat or a holiday and then create an art project. The second half will be spent with all the children at the school wide Shabbat Party. Cantor Rockman will lead us in this portion of the program. The schedule is on our website along with a registration form.

Our next fundraiser will be our Barnes & Noble Book Fair on Sunday October 27 12:30 PM-2:00 PM. It is being shared with the B'nai Tikvah Religious School. We are jointly fundraising for Nooks (Barnes and Noble version of the Tablet) to be used in the classrooms. There will be free raffles to win two \$10.00 Barnes and Noble gift cards. Our children will sing songs. There will also be a Day Camp reunion at the book fair and our wonderful camp staff will be there singing some of the summer's camp songs with our campers! There will be arts and craft projects too!

We look forward to working together in partnership with our families to have a most successful school year!




