From the Desk of Cantor Bruce Rockman



Sweet Music 2016

I'm always thinking about music. Singing and listening brings me great comfort, peace, motivation, and satisfaction. I am energized when I hear new music such as the soundtrack from "Hamilton" or the Jewish fusion jazz ensemble Zion80. The music of Buffalo Springfield, Crosby Stills Nash and Young is still awesome, as are Adele and Bruno Mars. All music has value and our interpretations are unique. I listen to everything and often, I feel transformed, transfixed and transported. Music fills my soul.

In preparation for Shabbat Shira on January 23 and The L'dor Vador concert in May, I've been reviewing some of my previous Hakol articles and listening to a great deal of music. Without a doubt, the most important influence in Jewish music during our time has been Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach. His music is both relevant on the bima and the concert halls. He has informed the modern Jewish music scene. Shlomo's daughter, Neshama Carlebach, has kept his legacy alive through her soulful singing. The youth of America sing his music, and USY services are framed by Carlebach melodies. Most if not every Jewish artists' repertoire is incomplete without a Carlebach song. Many groups like our L'dor Vador artists C Lanzbom and Noah Salomon of Soulfarm, have recorded entire albums of Carlebach music. I've posted a biographical article that I wrote for Hakol in 2002, along with this essay on www.bnaitikvah.org. I hope you'll find it informative and interesting

In the meantime, what has happened since the passing of Reb Shlomo of blessed memory in 1994 at the age of 69. Music expresses the rhythm of our souls. Shlomo Carlebach is a huge influence on my

servicing, praying. His melodies lift us throughout our services and the Sons of Tikvah repertoire is lavishly covered by Carlebach songs. Of course you know his nigunim, (1,2,3,4 Ka de sheinu) on Friday night, Tov L'hodot and Barcheinu Avinu are a part of all Sons shows as well. We sing them with spirit in shul when we parade the Torah or as a meditation after the amidah.

There is a Carlebach melody for every occasion, solemn or joyful, especially for weddings. Reb Shlomo made prayer and praying more accessible by delivering his message throughout the world and beyond the walls of the synagogue. He took the classical tradition of lush melodies from his Austrian birthplace, the heart of his music from his chasidic tradition and reached out to a generation of young people in the 60's who were remaking popular culture, with his folk guitar. Carlebach is the Bob Dylan and the Beatles of Jewish music. He was so prolific, many of his compositions were never recorded and are now being discovered and introduced by Eitan and Shlomo Katz. They have each released collections of this great music, I love their music!

Infusing Jewish music from Neshama Carlebach, Soulfarm, Greg Wall, Debbie Friedman, Sam Glaser, Pharaoh's Daughter, Six 13, Josh Nelson, Craig Taubman, or Yossi Malovany into our lives will make us a happier people. It might even make us better people.

I hope to inspire you with this music throughout our upcoming musical events and services.

Worship the Lord in gladness; come before God with joyous song.

A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



As I write these words, Tu b'shvat, the New Year of the Trees, is fast approaching. It behooves us to consider the role the planting of trees plays in our Jewish landscape.

Once, only once, Theodor Herzl visited the Land of Israel. While he was there, he did what every good Jew should do. He planted a tree. This was, of course, a political act. It was a way of saying "We are here," or, better, "We are *back*." It was also a way of making explicit the agenda of the Zionist movement: "We will rebuild this land." Above all, it was a spiritual act, a recognition that it is G-d's will that the Land of Israel be nurtured, and G-d's will that the People of Israel be the ones to nurture her. Ironically, the tree was cut down only a few years later, probably by a member of the ultra-Orthodox anti-Zionist community that suffered (and suffers still) from profound spiritual confusion on this point. The Zionist response was practical, spiritual and prophetic—where Herzl's tree had been, two hundred were planted in its place.

Almost a century later, the hundreds of millions of trees planted by our Israeli brethren still make a powerful political and spiritual statement. They are still the targets of abuse and vandalism by those (in our day, Palestinian terrorists) who would deny the link of Jews to the Land. And the Zionist response is still the same: for every tree burned down by arsonists, ten will be planted in its place.

When we plant trees in Israel, we recite a prayer. That we plant trees at all says a great deal about us. After all, in most places in the world the forests are shrinking, not growing. Israel is the only country in the world that entered the 21st century with a net gain of trees!.

That we say a prayer when we do so says even more. When we study the content of the prayer, we see it speaks volumes about the meaning of Jewish life, about the sanctity of Eretz Yisrael, about our relationship to nature, and our relationship to G-d.

Here is the prayer:

"You who build Zion and Jerusalem, and have reestablished the sovereignty of Israel, look down from Your holy habitation, from heaven, and bless the people Israel, and the land You have given us, as You promised our ancestors.

"Take pleasure, O Lord, in Your Land, and bestow upon it Your goodness and Your grace. Give dew as a blessing, and cause beneficent rains to fall in their season to satiate the mountains of Israel and her valleys, and to water every plant and tree.

"These saplings that we plant before You this day, make deep their roots and wide their crown, that they may blossom forth in grace among all the trees in Israel for blessing and beauty.

"Strengthen the hands of all our brethren who toil to revive the sacred soil and make fruitful its wastes. Bless, O Lord, their efforts, and may the work of their hands find favor before You."

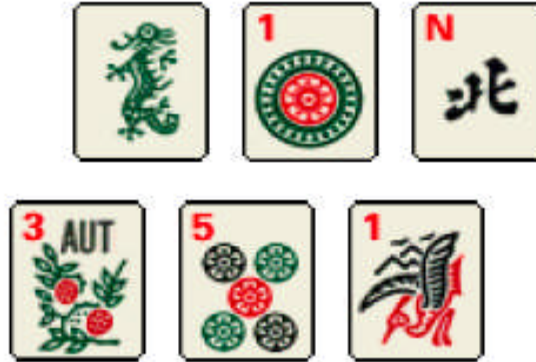

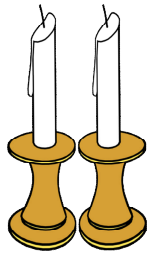
