A New Year

When you read this article, the world will have come together to hold its annual giant *brit milah* celebration. A new secular year will have begun. There is, as usual, a great temptation to look back at the year that has passed in order to make sense of it all.

What were the big stories? Synagogue shootings and other hate crimes against Jews; political hot messes in Israel, the UK, and here in America; measles; and #MeToo accusations against prominent Jews (among others).

In short: not good. When the best thing you've got going for you is a measles epidemic, you know you're in trouble.

But wait. During that same year, thousands of children were born, or came of age, or got married to the people they loved. Torah was learned. Holidays were celebrated. *Mitzvot*—literally millions of *mitzvot*—were performed.

Sounds like a pretty good year to me. So what was it, a good year or a bad one?

The rabbis liked to make the distinction between "*l'sha'ah*"—for the current moment, and "*l'dorot*"—for the generations. Things that are only *l'sha'ah* will fade from memory. Who can even recall the big events of 1919, a mere century ago (answer: pogroms and more pogroms)? But Torah and *mitzvot*, they are *l'dorot*.

So if you want to make 2020 a good year, forget about politics, persecutions, and pestilence. Stick with our enduring tradition instead.

Of course, our religious and spiritual needs are the sphere of Rabbi Wolkoff, Cantor Rockman, and the Ritual Committee. CBT has that and much more. There are programs, events, and activities that meet our educational, cultural, emotional, social, physical, and entertainment needs.

In September, a busload of members visited the Museum of Jewish Heritage - A Living Memorial to the Holocaust - at a very reduced price, thanks to the generosity of Rabbi Wolkoff and Barbra London, a relatively new member, championing the trip. They received a guided tour of the very special "Auschwitz – Not Long Ago. Not Far Away" exhibit. Afterwards, they returned here for lunch and a discussion led by Rabbi Wolkoff.

This fall, we experienced our first Camp B'nai Tikvah. Truly, there was something for everyone from backgammon to kickball. Our members divided into two teams: Blue and White.

CBT has become the "go-to" place for Israel-related programming in Central NJ. This year, we're increasing that commitment through our new Tikvah for Israel Wine Club. Every other month, you can choose to participate by ordering two wines from Israel. Our next offering will be in February; see our Past-President, Adrienne Ross, to place an order.

This past year, our long-running and award-winning Family Shabbat program, championed for more than two decades by Marc and Bobbi Binder, grew into Shabbat Together - for all ages. Our next Shabbat Together is Friday, January 17th. RSVP by Tuesday the 14th.

Back in November, CBT took a Walk in the Park and later that day had our L'Dor Vador annual music celebration.

We have active USY, Kadima, Sisterhood (whose year 5780 theme is wellness, too) and Men's Club at CBT. Look for the Men's Club Breakfast on various Sunday Mornings. New this year, Sisterhood will be sponsoring Shabbat lunch about once a month. And on December 15th, we hosted the Federation of Men's Clubs regional dinner, where we honored our own Charlie Valan and Corey Sookerman.

Among our most important programs is the Passport to Israel. We began this program more than 20 years ago to ease the financial burden on members who were sending their children to Israel for a learning program. Recently, under the leadership of Assistant Treasurer, Marc Rosen, and our Co-VPs of School and Youth, Melissa Kessler and Andrew Goldberger, we have revamped the program.

Just A Part of You



Among our goals in our religious school, one is to imbue our children with an understanding of mitzvoth. Tzedakah is one of the most important mitzvoth/commandments. During the coming months, our students will become better acquainted with the organizations that work to change and improve the world. We will conduct a Tzedakah fair this spring, where our students will teach us about charitable organizations, Jewish and secular, American and Israeli.

Chesed for Chanukah, the hygiene collections for needy people in New Brunswick, the South Brunswick Interfaith Clergy Thanksgiving Better Together community service project, the holiday Adopt A Family program, and the USY Yom Kippur food drive all are proof of our commitment and passion for doing acts of loving kindness.

Where do you learn to be generous? Where did you learn to value community activism and gain the understanding that we must help those less fortunate than ourselves?

Most likely, your parents taught you this responsibility. Perhaps experience, observation, or a public service announcement caught your attention. And it is even possible that the value of sharing was taught to you in school, Hebrew school, or by an inspirational sermon from the pulpit. Regardless, at this point, it is organic, just a part of you.

In an article in Tzedakah 101 from myjewishlearning.com it states: "Biblical prophets castigated the Israelites for neglecting and even exploiting the poor, insisting that God has particular concern for those in need. The rabbis of classical Judaism praised tzedakah, calling it, for example, "equal in value to all the other mitzvot combined." They also praised those who practice it, saying that they attain the level of holiness of someone who brought sacrifices in the ancient Temple." charity in three ways. Charity is done with one's money, while loving-kindness may be done with one's money or with one's person. Charity is done only to the poor, while loving-kindness may be given to both the poor and to the rich. Charity is given only to the living, while loving-kindness may be shown to the living and to the dead." (Sukka 49b)

Maimonides defines eight levels in giving charity (tzedakah), each one higher than the preceding one. On an ascending level, they are as follows:

- 8. When donations are given grudgingly.
- 7. When one gives less than he should, but does so cheerfully.
- 6. When one gives directly to the poor upon being asked.
- 5. When one gives directly to the poor without being asked.
- 4. Donations when the recipient is aware of the donor's identity, but the donor still doesn't know the specific identity of the recipient.
- 3. Donations when the donor is aware to whom the charity is being given, but the recipient is unaware of the source.
- 2. Giving assistance in such a way that the giver and recipient are unknown to each other. Communal funds administered by responsible people are also in this category.
- 1. The highest form of charity is to help sustain a person before they become impoverished by offering a substantial gift in a dignified manner, or by extending a suitable loan, or by helping them find employment or establish themselves in business so as to make it unnecessary for them to become dependent on others.

All in all, the quality of the lives we live and the kindness that we show in our daily lives helps us to teach our children well. Tikvah for Israel "Wine of the Month" Club

When I say wine, you say....Israel?

Today, there are around 300 wineries in Israel of different sizes and in all areas of the country. Wine is produced in five regions: Galilee (which includes the sub-regions of the Golan Heights, Upper Galilee, and Lower Galilee); the Judean Hills, surrounding the city of Jerusalem; the Samson region, located between the Judean Hills and the Coastal Plain; the Negev desert region; and the Shomron region, which includes the Sharon plain located near the Mediterranean coast and just south of Haifa.

Israel's wine industry produces primarily French grape varieties and thus the most common wines include Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay, Merlot, and Sauvignon Blanc. Emerging varieties that have recently been increasing in popularity include Cabernet Franc, Gewurztraminer, Muscat Canelli, Riesling, and Syrah.

There are 35 commercial wineries in Israel, and more than 250 boutique wineries. For those who have already participated in the Wine Club, familiar names will include: Teperberg, Tishbi, and Dalton. We also have had a range of wines including Merlot, Malbec, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Chardonnay.

Consider joining us on our next order. Each order is \$72 for two bottles of wine. Checks are made out to Congregation B'nai Tikvah, Tikvah for Israel. The next order will be in February.






