WORDS OF THE RABBI Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

Freedom. What is it all about?

There was once a Jewish soldier in World War II who served as an infantryman, slogging his way through France to Germany. He was informed that other soldiers had found a Jewish man hiding in the woods, and he wanted to know if there were any Jews among the American soldiers.

The Jewish soldier ran to meet the man. He was gaunt and unshaven. As he got closer to him, the Jewish soldier was overwhelmed with emotion, feeling as if he was somehow part of this man's liberation. The soldier reached out to the man when he asked in Yiddish, "Are you a Jew?", and responded enthusiastically, "Yes, I am a Jew!"

And the man came closer, spit in the soldier's face, and said, "You came too late."

You came too late.

He walked away, and the soldier never saw the man again.

The soldier came to realize that the American Jewish community did not do enough to prevent the Holocaust, and that when our people are in need or in danger, we must never be too late.

The soldier, named Larry Weinberg, went on to become one of the great lay leaders of American Jewry, and served as President of AIPAC, America's pro-Israel lobby and one of the biggest players in Washington, DC.

So, what is freedom all about? Freedom is about not being late in desperate times.

We have just commemorated Pesach, our ancient time of liberation; Yom Hashoah, when we indeed were too late, will soon be upon us; and then Yom Haatzmaut, when the State of Israel was born, in part to ensure that we were never late again. And just before Yom Haatzmaut, Yom Hazikaron, Israel's Memorial Day for its fallen soldiers - reminder that freedom is never free.

At this time of our liberation, let us remember what we were liberated for. Let us thank G-d that He was not too late to save us; and pledge that we will not be too late to save others.

Anything else is, one way or another, just slavery by a different name.



OUR HAZZAN'S VOICE Cantor Bruce Rockman

I know of no place that doesn't have music

Music has always been a fundamental part of my life. Soothing, inspiring, joyful, introspective and grounding. Music has always defined events and memories for me and for the most part, music as been my haven and guide. I am especially fortunate that synagogue music has become the center of my musical universe, inspiring for me, a closer relationship with God.

Yo Yo Ma said during an interview on the WNYC program "Soundcheck" "I think I know of no place that doesn't have music and so I think that's a natural...one of the currencies of being human, people will always find methods of delivery". Music is involved in every facet of our lives and our being. Just think about it, we sing to your children when they are born, when they are sad and when we are happy. We have religious music, elevator music, rock and roll, classical, jazz, fusion reggae and hip hop. Music is for everyone. We listen to music in the supermarket and at our dentist's office, and at the ballgame. We listen in the car, to motivate us when we exercise and we use music to help us sleep and awake in the morning. We have record players, radios, cds, tapes and ipods in every room of our homes and offices we just crave and need music. Music fulfills us.

How many times have you heard a song that reminds you of a special time and place or person? Every time I hear The Association's, "Windy" or The Doors "Light My Fire", it's 1967 for a moment and I'm back at Camp Massad. We are all blessed with a "mixed tape" that orchestrates the events, the adventures and experiences of our lives. What was you wedding song?

Music is evocative and it is my goal to help you and your children have the fondest memories of your time at B'nai Tikvah. Remembering George Segal

Many members of Congregation B'nai Tikvah have either heard of or seen works by the sculptor George Segal. But not many know that he was a founding member of B'nai Tikvah and remained so until he died on June 10, 2000.


I met George from time to time in the home of Dave and Millie Kutliroff, who were also founding members of B'nai Tikvah and friends of mine. George's wife Helen and Millie Kutliroff are sisters and although Dave has passed on, Millie is still a member of our congregation. For all his world wide fame, George Segal was as plain and friendly as Jewish rye bread. No pretenses or flash. Just a nice pleasant person to be around.

Many times he would say "You gotta come over to my studio sometime". Well, life being what it is, it never worked out, but whenever we met, sometimes at the Kutliroff home, or at a dinner party or public affair we would always have a pleasant chat. Having attained a world wide reputation, he would freely allow his name and presence to help other lesser known artists by attending their show openings and greeting the invitees. He was a real mensch.

He remembered life during the Great Depression, and knew how to extend a hand to others, and of course one can see his heart reflected in the humanity of his works.

Leon and Neysa Bibel lived on the same street as the Segals. Leon was the artist/craftsman who designed and built the Torah Ark in the Sanctuary of B'nai Tikvah, and both sometimes served as models for George's work. George never missed an opening day of a Leon Bibel show. (What are friends for?)

In addition we were the beneficiary of two recent news articles, concerning Leon's life, in the NJ Jewish News and North/South Brunswick Sentinel. Leon Bibel (1913-1995) was a Polish-American painter and printmaker during the Great Depression. His themes were the social condition of workers and the politics of protest and war, although cityscapes and landscapes were included among his works. He later developed works in wood of especially Jewish themes. These included fanciful miniature buildings influenced by European spice boxes, figures and objects within shadow boxes, as well as our Synagogue Ark, Tallis Rack and Grogger.



"Moses - Abstract" Oil Painting





"Hebrew Letters – Abstract" Oil Painting

At the start of the Second World War, he and a number of other New York artists moved to South Brunswick, New Jersey, to make a living as chicken farmers. By the 1960s, Bibel returned to art, focusing on wood-based sculptures.

He was a friend and neighbor of the American sculptor George Segal, and was both an anonymous and named character of Segal's arrays and portraits. (He is the first man in Depression Bread Line, Segal's group of bronzed figures at the FDR Memorial, included in PBS's "George Segal: American Still Life").

ELAINE PEIZER'S SPEECH, IN HONOR OF SUSE ROSENSTOCK'S "WOMAN OF VALOR" AWARD, PRESENTED ON FEBRUARY 23, 2008 AT CONGREGATION B'NAI TIKVAH

I want to begin by thanking the Sisterhood for bestowing this honor in my mother's memory. If mom were here, she would be embarrassed by all the attention since she never wanted to call attention to herself.

Personally, I am very grateful to be here and credit my mom with bringing the whole family together – my dear sister Deborah, and sister-in-law, Donna, my nephews Max and Sam, my own children, Ross and Larissa and my husband, Alan. My dad would have been here weather permitting. I don't know why mom couldn't have done something about that.

My mom WAS a woman of valor; an accomplished, smart and wise woman. When I think of my mom, I am drawn to her middle initial "M," which embodies many of her qualities.

First of all – Modesty. As I said, she probably would have said that this honor should go to some other deserving woman before herself.

Next – Mitzvah. Quoting from the prayer Eshet Chayil, "She extends her hands to the poor and reached out her hands to the needy." Mom gave her time freely and unconditionally without expecting anything in return. She taught me the value of tzedakah first hand and as we all know, we reap the rewards many times over from doing good deeds.

My best friend from junior high school recently shared a story about my mom. When my friend's brother was ill and her mom was consumed with caring for him, my mother went over to her house and literally packed up my friend and brought her home to stay with us. Many other friends of mine could recount similar stories of my mother as well.

Marriage. As the prayer states, "She does her husband good and not evil all the days of her life." In a time when marriages are a disposable commodity, my parents taught me by example that love and commitment can be hard work but worth it. Alan and I are almost halfway to the 52 years my parents and G-d willing, look forward to reaching this milestone as well.

The prayer also states, "She is like the merchant ships, she brings bread from afar." When my husband thinks back on his memories of my mom, he recalls how welcoming she was from the moment she met him.

Eshet Chayil also states, "She arise while it is still night and gives food to her household." My husband specifically recalls his first visit to New Jersey after our engagement when he awoke to my mother already having baked six or cakes for an impromptu engagement party. He was amazed by this, not yet knowing this was the norm for mom. He soon caught on after visits for Pesach, Fourth of July, and so on.

I am embarrassed to admit that sometimes when I was younger, the chaos and mom's lack of attention to details, like organization, frustrated me. I didn't get it. But now I do. Relationships with family and friends ALWAYS come first. My mom got that! She wrote the book, "Don't Sweat the Small Stuff."

Quoting once more from the prayer, "Strength and honor are her clothing, she smiles at the future." Her strength and ability to make lemonade out of lemons have always stuck with me. For someone who endured hardships due to the evils of humanity, she more often than not chose to see the good in people.

"Today we all rise and praise her. Many women have done worthy, but mom, you surpassed them all."

It may sound trite, but every day I strive to be more like my mom and I hold her values in my heart. She left a moral compass to guide us.

Thank you, mom.




