### WORDS OF THE RABBI Rabbi Robert Wolkoff I Remember That Painting

In the home of my grandfather, of blessed memory, was a painting that had a great effect on my life. It was a depiction of five traditional Jews arguing over a page of Talmud. One is passionately making a point, another is just as passionately waving off his idea as nonsense. One is listening intently, another is listening with bemusement, and a third is just kibbitzing the whole discussion.

I remember asking my grandfather what it all meant. I'll never forget his answer: Whenever people discuss Torah, he said, G-d is present. I didn't know then that my grandfather was quoting Pirkey Avot 3:2, but it makes no difference—"the wisdom of our fathers" is the wisdom of our fathers, and it doesn't specify /which/ fathers, our rabbis of old or ourgrandfathers. Our tradition teaches us to respect wisdom, and my grandfather sure had it. That much I knew.

That painting teaches us a great deal about the nature of civil discourse. In fact, it teaches us a great deal about /sacred/ discourse. It teaches us that we can argue passionately and pointedly (one of the participants is in fact forcefully pointing, literally, at the text of the Talmud), and still help G-d to be present. Why? Because in a discussion like this we are seeking the Truth, and the Truth is hard to find. We all share an obligation to uncover it, and when we dig, the dirt flies.

I remember that painting often, with great love and appreciation, but also with a certain sadness these days, considering how different the intellectual climate is in our world. I'm thinking in particular of the health care "debate." "Debate," of course, is an ridiculously dignified description of what in truth is at best an ugly mudfight in the political gutter. Instead of reasoned discourse, we have people shouting obscenities at town meetings, militias gearing up to fight the "socialist takeover," descriptions of political opponents as "Nazis" and "brownshirts," terminally confused people yelling, "Tell the government to keep its hands off my Medicare." And then, of course, there's that intellectual beacon, Sarah Palin, talking about government enforced "death panels."

As Bernie Mooney described it, crazy and stupid have joined forces.

It's not that there aren't two reasonable sides to the real debate. Of course there are. Healthcare is an extraordinarily complex topic (like so many other issues we face today). It demands the best of our intellectual and moral capacities—a demand which,

tragically, is not being fulfilled. G-d's Presence isn't hovering over this discussion as it would if Truth were being sought. It's ducking for cover so It doesn't get caught in the crossfire while the mud—and worse—is being slung.

All of which brings to mind another piece of wisdom from our ancestors: "A certain sage was asked, 'What is your prime goal in life?' He answered, 'To avoid fools.'"

We, our country, and the world, deserve so much better. In the new year, may we dedicate ourselves to discussions for the sake of heaven, and maybe, just maybe, we can bring a little bit of heaven down to earth.

Help us convert our convictions into conduct and our commitments into deeds


Help us to narrow the gap between our principles and our practices, between our aspirations and our actions

The awards, named after the founder of United Synagogue honored our Sons of Tikvah Band, the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Rejoice Festival, the Answer Cancer With a Praver program, and in the Family Education area, our longstanding Family Shabbot, Torah Trope and Sundaes on Saturday (Mincha and Munchies).

For me, these programs are really about a willingness to step up and take some leadership. Susan Komives, a professor at The University of Maryland defines leadership as " a relational process of people together attempting to accomplish change or make a difference to benefit the common good." These programs and the individuals, staff and volunteers, who worked to make them successful are the epitome of leaders at our congregational home. They work in a collaborative way, they are empowering and purposeful, and they are ethical....key ingredients in relational leadership.

I hope that you will join them, using your creativity, passion, and skills to continue helping to make B'nai Tikvah thrive. In the coming year, may we all be blessed with good health, a life filled with peace, and the strong spirit of volunteerism.

### ANOTHER VIEWPOINT

### **Looking Back**

The cotton ball clouds rolled past under the wings of my jet and beneath the clouds I could see the crackled surface of our western desert, like a box of corn flakes spread on the ground. I would soon land at Philadelphia on my way home, but the six hour flight from California gave me time to look back and review some of the stills, stories and events of my life.

I was returning from the funeral of my youngest brother Joe, who died after just a few weeks of illness. Well, not exactly. He knew that he had pancreatic cancer, a condition that is difficult to treat, but he withheld this sad information until the symptoms were undeniable.

He stood over six feet tall, with a barrel chest, but as big as he was he was nimble on his feet and enjoyed life to the fullest. Joe was movie star handsome and could sing like Enzio Pinza, with a lush baritone voice that made him the star of many shows that were produced for the entertainment of the residents of his Florida community and environs. He called me a few weeks before he died and said he was not feeling well. When I asked him if he was still singing and he answered no, I knew that he was in deep trouble.

Joe was in the US Navy during WWII, and during the Korean War he was in the Army and saw action as a medic. A few years after the Korean War he opened a medical laboratory in Hobart, Indiana in an outpatient clinic. The laboratory was a financial success despite the fact that he never turned anyone away because they couldn't afford the fees.

By any standards he was a mensch. Joe enjoyed life and was loved by all who knew him, except those who felt his generosity was excessive. (Yes, there are a few among us who are that way.) Joe loved children and they loved him back. He was a story teller and he would make up comic stories that would make the kids double up with laughter. And they would climb all over him while he was entertaining them, much to his delight.

In our close but extended family, Joe was the joyful star. In an email, my cousin Norma wrote "A room would brighten up each time he entered, and how he created a spotlight that followed his every move and we all delighted in his good humor and zest for life". But Joe was not just some Good Time Charley. He was very successful in the business world, and yet compassionate and generous.

At another time, say a generation or two ago, the *continued on page 10*






As quickly as I knew I had found the right fit, my need abruptly changed with the passing of my father. Growing up in a Conservative Jewish home, spending most Shabbat mornings by his side at shul, I suddenly needed "a sense of community" to help me grieve and celebrate my father's life and all the tradition and love of Judaism he instilled in me from a young age. The women I met at the Mommy & Me class were there to support me through the birth of my second child and the shiva of my dad. Five years later, I count two of these ladies as my closest friends.

During our subsequent years at B'nai Tikvah, my involvement has increased at the pre-school and in the synagogue. Through volunteering, I have developed many lasting friendships that I equate to some Havurahs. Despite my growth within the congregation, the foundation of the pre-school remains an integral part of the process. I imagine it is easy to forget all this when your children/ grandchildren have moved on to Hebrew School and beyond. But remember if you can those vulnerable years when you were seeking that "sense of community" and the JCC was the missing link. It was there for you then- and despite the changes that may take place in our lives and throughout our community- the school needs to remain a staple for future generations.

My point is this...if we want our children to embrace Conservative Judaism and carry on our traditions as young adults and with their own families one day...the dedication and involvement needs to begin early. Those who do not encourage participation at a young age risk missing an opportunity to instill these traditions for a lifetime. We have been fortunate enough to have an amazing pre-school program which provides our young children with a strong foundation and a love of coming to B'nai Tikvah to make new friends and learn and grow. The experience I've had is priceless and I kvell when my children are excited to attend Family Shabbat Dinnera program we discovered through the pre-school. As we know, many families find their way to B'nai Tikvah through their enrollment in our pre-school first. I hope many families to come will have the same opportunity I have had to fall in love with this community and feel welcome.

I know that the foundation I have set for my children will stay with them throughout their lives. I am hopeful that my 2-year-old Seth will benefit from that same nurturing environment and introduction to our beautiful religion as Mason and Rebecca did.

### B'NAI TIKVAH COMMUNITY SUPERMARKET GIFT CARDS WELCOME BACK

Summer '09, such that it has been, is now being committed to our personal memory books. It has been a fairly wet and mild season tempered by all sorts of political, show biz and economic headlines. Summer may only be 90 days long, but it is crammed with camp, vacations, country fairs, barbeques, etc which has hopefully been captured in photos. Now we look forward to the balance of 2009 and the start of the Jewish New Year (5770) which starts on September 18.









By now every household has learned about some significant changes affecting the area of fundraising at Congregation B'nai Tikvah (CBT). In particular, there are three that I would like to share. First, Bobbi Binder has taken over

the reins as the new Vice President of fundraising. She has assumed this post that Larry Cohen previously led. Bobbi has fundraising experience from serving on Sisterhood and other CBT committees. We, the members of the Supermarket Gift Card (SGC) committee, have already welcomed her aboard as our new "Captain". We look forward to a successful year with her.

Second and this is IMPORTANT: did you read your financial bill from CBT? If so, then you will already be familiar with what I'm about to announce. Like much of the country, CBT's fiscal health is in a state of temporary illness. After lengthy deliberations our synagogue board tried to arrive at the best solution(s) to alleviate and cure CBT's fiscal health. One of these results has been to change the SGC program. It is no longer a voluntary fundraiser, but now a mandatory program for which each CBT household has been assessed a certain amount of monetary contribution. This contribution can be made in one of two ways. Either the household purchases SGCs or pays the cash equivalent of the amount assessed for each family; the choice depends on the individual family. It is neither my responsibility nor my choice to explain the mechanics of how each family was assessed, how they meet their new obligation, nor is it my intention to incite any emotions on this issue. Rather, I am just informing you that it is a reality to which all families (including my own) now have a financial obligation to help CBT regain its "health." To ask guestions or such, you would need to contact the synagogue office. Given the choice why wouldn't you just buy the SGCs?

For years I have written columns about the fact that we shop at A&P, Acme, Pathmark, Shop Rite, Stop & Shop, Whole Foods and Lox, Stock & Deli anyway, so why have almost three quarters (34s) of our members failed to participate in this painless (and

mindless) fundraiser? Your reasons have been your own. Now each family is required to "ante up" and buy SGCs. I believe that once you purchase SGCs you might hit your forehead and say (No, not that you could have had a V8): "Why haven't I done this before now?" The SGC committee has made is easy (maybe too easy) over the past few years for you to purchase the SGCs, so now is the time for every good CBT family to "belly up to the bar" and get some of that good ole stuff. As a courtesy to our fellow CBT congregants (and a way to make life easier for them), there is even FREE delivery of SGCs. Here are the best four ways to purchase SGCs:

You were a superb committee chairperson and we will certainly miss you at the helm of our ship."

THIS MONTH'S TIP: Short and to the point, SGCs for the High Holy Days. Use them for your holiday purchases and buy extra and donate them to your local food pantry/bank. These organizations have fiscal shortfalls that could benefit from our generosity, too. After all, if you think your life is rough, just look around there are those who are worse off.
