## WORDS OF THE RABBI *Rabbi Robert Wolkoff*

### The Rules

There is a well-known sign that can be found in many offices. It reads something like this:

Rule #1: The boss is always right.

Rule #2: When the boss is wrong, refer to Rule #1.

This is the stuff that the comic strip Dilbert thrives on: unrestrained ego, job tyranny, hierarchy, orders.

There is another sign, much less well known but infinitely more palatable. It was seen on the desk of the CEO of a shoe company. It read:

G-d first. Shoes second.

The ability to put G-d first is truly a gift, a gift that we give not only to others, but also to ourselves. Recognizing that an inflated ego is not a sign of power or status, but rather of weakness and pretension, is a blessing in every way. At the very least, such recognition would keep us from sounding silly.

This is illustrated by a story told of the famous socialite Dorothy Parker. She once found herself at a cocktail party at which someone praised another prominent woman by saying, "She's very kind to her inferiors."

Dorothy Parker responded, as only she could, "And where does she find them?"

How much healthier it would be if we could only put G-d first and everything else—including ourselves—second! If only we could learn to act consistently with *derech erez*, with basic decency! If only we could see in each person a little bit of the divine, rather than a mere object, and "inferior," on which we can impose our will!

In its most radical form, pretensions of superiority can lead to murder. 9/11 is a perfect illustration of this. On a smaller scale, though, we can see the impact of these pretensions in our day-to-day interpersonal relations.

All of us, at one time or another, take upon ourselves the role of guardian of some high moral principle. We may indeed be right. We may indeed be sincere. But that's not enough to keep our egos in check. Sometimes we espouse our principles at the sacrifice of the personal integrity of the persons to whom we are speaking—or, more accurately, pontificating.

The application of morals and standards is important, to be sure. Especially at this time of year, we should be thinking of such things. This application, however, must take into account the personal integrity of the people with whom we are dealing. Putting high-minded principles ahead of flesh-and-blood people is

usually getting things exactly wrong.

There are of course some exceptions. It's all right if you step on a person's foot, or feelings, when you are trying to save a life. We can always go back and apologize to the old lady that we pushed out of the way in order to save a baby from traffic. Usually though, what's really happening is much less noble, just a variant on good ole' Rule 1: The boss is always right...and when we say "the boss," we don't mean G-d.

Let us keep in mind that the purpose of our principles—and the principles of Judaism as a whole—is to help build a just and holy society. Societies aren't possible unless people are willing to stick together. Walking off in a huff of righteous indignation, or inducing others to do so, just doesn't add much *derech erez* to our lives. And, as we prepare to start the new year, *derech erez* is at a premium.

This message can be boiled down to three simple Yiddish words, perhaps the most important three words any of us will ever hear: *zei a mensch*.

## **ANOTHER VIEWPOINT** *Aaron Rosloff*

### **Let's Go Sailing!**

In August 2009 I flew to a town in Northern Indiana, near the shores of Lake Michigan, to spend a few days with my niece Robin and her husband David. David is a rabid sailor and if life permitted would sail every day of the year.

David and Robin own a 36 foot Catalina sailboat. (I don't know if Catalina is the model or the maker). The boat was outfitted very much like a mobile home, with a kitchen sink, running water, stove, refrigerator and toilet (for reasons no one has explained to me, they call the toilet by the naval term, the head), and with space to sleep and sit in comfort. It was not hard to see why many people live on their boats year round – with winters in Florida. I was invited to spend a few days sailing with them on Lake Michigan and jumped at the chance. The day after I arrived, we headed out to the marina, and I was introduced to some of the nearby boat owners.

I found it interesting that over the three days that I spent with them, many of the boat owners did not sail much. They just sat around on the deck talking, drinking and socializing. I got the feeling, that for many of these people owning a boat was just a way of belonging to a certain social element. Sailing was secondary.

The day that was to be the first of the three days of sailing included a race around a course marked by floating buoys and estimated to take about 3 hours. Normally when David and Robin sailed, Robin would take the helm and David would handle the lines and sails. On this race day, a friend of theirs, an experienced sailor, handled the helm instead of Robin, and Robin and I just scrambled to stay out of the way without falling overboard.

You know the old saw about “the best laid plans of mice and men”. Well shortly after we set sail, it turned from racing to surviving. The winds were blowing at over twenty knots (about 23 miles per hour) and the waves were 4 to 5 feet high. As explained to me, fresh water lakes behave differently than salt water seas. It seems that fresh water is lighter than salt, and is choppy under high winds. I won't argue that point. All I know is that after an hour or so I gave back my lunch and then so did Robin. I had to admire David's seamanship as he scrambled around the boat while we tacked and beat back and forth against the shifting winds, bouncing like a cork in the bathtub.

After about an hour and a half into this “pleasure” cruise, the wind and waves were so strong that I lost track of where we were. But at either the second or third mark as we were approaching it, about 3 or 4 hundred yards behind us were two smaller boats. We held our breath as the two boats collided. Our first intent was to try to go to their aid but fortunately the damage was only superficial and we had our hands full anyway in trying to keep control of our boat. The tension was increased when we saw the same boats collide again as they struggled to get around that mark and again there was no major damage but at this point we decided that caution was the wisest choice and turned toward home. We were then at the furthest point of the race and had to fight up wind all the way home. I had seen some of the finest boat handling that I had ever seen, but my afternoon cruise became an adventure that will give me something to talk about when next I go sailing with my friend Bill Greenberg in the bay off New Jersey.

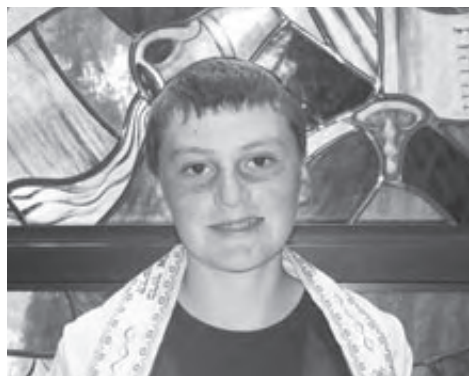

### SIMCHAT TORAH

The Hebrew word Simcha means "joy." We use it throughout the Jewish life cycle— at a Brit, Baby Naming, Bar or Bat Mitzvah, Confirmation, Wedding. The holiday reminds us that study is a privilege and a joy.

Simchat Torah is a relatively modern Jewish holiday. The yearly cycle of Torah reading was adopted in about the 9th century. Simchat Torah marks both an end and a beginning. During services, we finish reading from the last chapter of Deuteronomy and then immediately begin Genesis. After the Torah is read, we march in Hakafot around the Sanctuary.

Simchat Torah renews our connection to an ancient story that unrolls before us again and again, challenging us to live our lives with honor, acts of nobility, and shared concern for every human being.

Join us as we celebrate together as a congregation the joys of this holiday on Sunday, October 11.

## IT'S ALREADY THAT TIME . . . HELP A NEEDY FAMILY FOR THE HOLIDAYS

### Why we run this program?

The following is an excerpt of one of the thank you notes we received on behalf of a family we sponsored last year:

“This is a letter of heart felt appreciation on behalf of ----Family for all of your generous gifts this holiday season. The mother burst into tears when we delivered your gifts. She was overwhelmed with positive emotions about the kindness of people who do not know her family. She referred to all of you as angels sent by God to help others on this earth. Her family is very grateful for all of the gifts especially for the winter clothes. Her husband has been wearing his winter boots and coat daily. She is enjoying cooking in her pots. She only had one pot and it would take her a long time to cook because she would have to cook part of a meal, wash the pot, then cook the rest of the meal. The children love their toys. Thank you for bringing joy and comfort to this family.

**Another Thank you note:** “This family has never experienced such great generosity. The mother told me she was happy to see that her children finally have toys to play with so they are no longer bored at home. The teachers were commenting that they noticed the children’s self esteem improve when they came to school proudly dressed in their new clothes. The children are now appropriately dressed for the weather and are even wearing socks which were noticeably missing prior to receiving the gifts. They sleep much more comfortably at night with their new blankets and their heater.....” This is why we run this program...to make a difference in peoples’ lives.

**Who are these families?** These families are all in need. They are referred by various sources including Jewish Family Services, local welfare directors, school social workers and senior centers.

**How does this program work?** Each family will fill out a wish list of their needs. The wish lists typically include items like towels, sheets, blankets, clothing, shoes, coats and children’s toys.

### How can you help?

1. Become a family coordinator for one family’s wish list. This might involve getting your family, friends, co-workers, and merchants to donate the needed items to fulfill the family’s wish list.

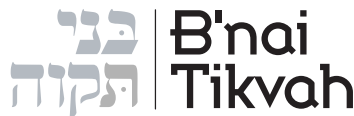
