Within the Shearith Israel building is the "Little Synagogue" which was built to resemble their first colonial synagogue. This chapel measures 31' x 24 ' and contains colonial heritage artifacts. They offer a video and guided tour for \$2 per person (not included).

Then it's on to the *Jewish Museum* for the exhibit of *Alias Man Ray: The Art of Reinvention*.

#### Please God, Help Us Grow

With the crackle of bowling pins and laughter, we fêted our freedom. The sounds of trumpets and joyful songs proclaimed our spiritual unity in our synagogue. And, in the comfort and warmth of our homes we celebrated Hanukkah with our families. With much anticipation, celebration and rededication to our ideals as Jews in a plural society, I hope you experienced a great Hanukkah.

As December ends and the blanket of winter covers us, it is now time to focus on more Jewish experiences. It is hard for me to leave December 2009, because so many powerful events happened. Besides Hanukkah, every kid's (of all ages) favorite holiday, we hosted Debbie Friedman in Concert, we had three wonderful B'not Mitzvah celebrations (Chelsea, Jessica and Nicole, you were all awesome), and the passing of one of our founding members, a special person, Millicent Kutleroff, of blessed memory. May God continue to comfort all those who are among the mourners of Zion and Jerusalem and sustain those who love them.

From day to day, we move forward integrating joy and sorrow.

This month we are going to celebrate Tu b' Shevat. We will host our annual Seder on Shabbat, January 31. Zionists, at the turn of the twentieth century infused this date with new meaning with trees as a symbol of Jewish return and renewal in the land of Israel. Most recently Tu b' Shevat has been embraced by Jewish environmentalists in Israel and North America as a kind of Jewish Earth Day because of its association with trees and by extension, with nature. The New Year for Trees, another happy Jewish holiday with meaning!

What's my point? What is my point! I discover enormous fulfillment living within our Jewish tradition. While attending the recent convention of Conservative Jewish Congregations (USCJ), Rabbi Andrea Merrow described the ladder of mitzvoth as parallel to the ground as opposed to perpendicular. Level with the earth, creating two equal ends not a top and not a bottom. As I understood Rabbi Merrow, we, you and I, can all do mitzvoth. Neither you nor I can be the judge of which of our mitzvoth is most significant to God. We also cannot judge each other. Who is more important, the person who

regularly attends minyan or the person who cares for the environment?

According to Rabbi Julie Schonfeld, the Rabbinical Assembly's executive director, "We'd fail if we had pat answers. We have to live according to the ideals of Torah, ritual and ethical mitzvot, and to study and care about one another. ... Conservative Judaism's adherence to the basic principles of our tradition remains true and unambiguous."

My goal, with my prayers, my songs, my words, L'dor Vador, is to encourage you and help you to find your way within Judaism.

Please God, help us grow...with joy.

### From The Webmaster

#### WE REMEMBER THEM

In addition to the memorial plaques that are displayed in the sanctuary, the synagogue office maintains well over a thousand records of yahrzeit information for our members.



Our webmaster has transcribed the information (consisting of only the name of the deceased and Hebrew yahrzeit date) and posted them as a virtual memorial.

You can click any of the Hebrew dates to display a list of corresponding

Gregorian calendar dates. Clicking on a name will bring up the donations page filled-in with the person's name and Hebrew yahrzeit date.

Some plaques contain a small Star of David to indicate the existence of an actual bronze plaque that is located in the main sanctuary. When you hover the symbol with your mouse, the location of the plaque is revealed. Similarly, if the deceased is interned in Washington Cemetery, the plot location is also shown.

You will find these memorials in the "Prayer" section of our website.

#### ANOTHER VIEWPOINT

#### **MEMORIES** by Aaron Rosloff

All of us young folks (I'm only 88 at this writing) may be concerned that some day we might be forced to deal with the onset of Alzheimer's or Parkinson's disease. But sometimes even the darkest hour may permit a ray of light to shine through. Among the stops that my darling Mili made on the trail from high IQ to total confusion, were the months that she spent at Buckingham Place on their day care program and later in their Alzheimer's unit.

Buckingham Place is a fine Assisted Living residence with a dedicated and caring staff in all departments, including the Alzheimer's floor. Fortunately for me, Buckingham is only four miles form my home and I could visit Mili as frequently as I wanted to. In fact I was there every day. Sometimes early, sometimes late, and mostly both early and late.

I was intrigued by a female patient the staff called Sally. A little woman, who must have been very pretty in her youth, she spoke English fluently but with an accent that I recognized from my childhood. The language that I heard and learned in my home was Yiddish spoken with the Ashkenazi accents of Poland and Russia. These accents salted and tailored the English that my parents' generation spoke at home, and was the English that I recognized from Sally.

Typically, Alzheimer's victims state of mind will vary from moment to moment. One may speak of long ago events with perfect clarity and recollection, and moments later not know where they are. Some days Sally would recognize me when I entered the unit, and other times, see me as a stranger. Still, I saw something in her that I felt I could reach, and so I spoke to her whenever she was near.

After lunch one day, I engaged her in conversation by asking her name. She said 'Sally", but I heard "Solly". She pronounced the "a" as an "o", just as my mother would have done. I said "Sally, what was your name as a child?" I got a blank look. I decided to try a shot in the dark. I said "Did they call you Suraleh?" At first I got a blank stare and then a little smile. She asked me how I knew, and I said that she sounded like my mother, so I guessed.



#### Making a Difference in Israel

Our Congregation has the opportunity to make a difference in the lives of soldiers serving in the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF). The commando squads (Tzevet) of the elite units are often "adopted" by civilians who help to take care of needs that are outside the budgetary constraints of the IDF. His Tzevet is in need of special combat boots, headlamps and thermal underclothing to get these dedicated soldiers through the winter. The cost of these items for the entire Tzevet is \$5,000. "Do you remember songs from your childhood?" I asked. Again a blank look. I sang a song that every Yiddish speaking family would sing to their children. A lullaby called "Oifen Pripitchik". A little song about a Rabbi teaching little children the alphabet while sitting in front of his fireplace. At first she just starred, but towards the end she began to move her head in time to the beat. When I finished I started over again. This time she inserted a word here and there, and on the third try she sang the song almost all the way with me. I left her feeling a warm glow and I'm sure she felt the same way.

That evening, as I did a few of times a week, I brought a couple of cartons of ice cream for after dinner. Mili always liked ice cream and it was a treat that she could share with the other patients, if they were still awake. The staff would supply the tableware and I would sit with Mili and the others and try to engage them in conversation.

Sally sat at the next table with a few other residents and when she finished her ice cream, she left her table and came up behind my chair. Sally was about the same height standing as I was sitting. To my utter surprise she stood behind my chair and threw her arms over my shoulders. She clasped her hands over my chest and gave me the surprise of my life.

Sally not only sang all of the words of "Oifen Pripitchik", but sang two more songs. She had spent the entire afternoon concentrating on recalling the songs of her childhood. I was overwhelmed and Sally was so proud. At least for the moment, she was aware again of her own self worth.
