## A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

### SHAVUOT

The holiday of Shavuot is fast approaching. We will begin with services on the evening of June 7<sup>th</sup>, and services will be followed by the tikkun leil Shavuot, the evening study session on the anniversary of the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai. On the first morning of Shavuot, Wednesday June 8, we will read the book of Ruth, and we will invite all the women of our congregation named Ruth (whether in Hebrew or English) to participate in the reading of this wonderful book.

The theme for the tikkun this year is “Who Makes the Rules?” The topic reflects the ongoing online discussion that has been burning up our list serve about e-mailing on Shabbat, the rules of Shabbat, Conservative Judaism, who gets to decide? Even if that exciting discussion never occurred, though, the question “Who Makes the Rules?” applies directly to the Book of Ruth.

In one of the great dramatic scenes not only of the Bible, but of world literature, we read in the book of Ruth of the night time meeting between Ruth and Boaz. Ruth was a Moabite woman, and the widow of a penniless man. She was at the absolute bottom of the social pecking order, the weakest and most vulnerable member of society. Boaz (whose name in Hebrew means “There is power in him”) is a patriarch, a leading and respected nobleman who controls the very land from which Ruth harvests a meager living for herself and her mother-in-law Naomi.

Ruth comes to Boaz in the middle of the night, uncovers his body, and lies down at his feet.

What happens next? From today’s jaded and tawdry perspective, the utterly unexpected.

Instead of taking sexual advantage of Ruth, Boaz restrains himself, and vows to do the right thing. At the risk of spoiling the ending, Boaz and Ruth are married, become the great-grandparents of King David, and thus the ancestors of the Messiah.

All because of one man’s courage to follow the rules.

So the question becomes—what is the source of that courage? Where does the inner voice of conscience come from that allows Boaz to hold himself to a higher standard? And how do we explain the tremendous power it wields? We live in a time where restraint is virtually unheard of. We are empowered to do virtually anything we want to, and it seems that our goal is to see how much we can get away with and still get into heaven. In contrast, Boaz has power precisely because he *doesn’t* use it, even when he could do so with complete impunity.

We usually think of freedom as synonymous with liberation from all rules. Our tradition teaches us, wisely, that sometimes rules are the most liberating thing imaginable.

We have lots to learn about this. Please join us over Shavuot for some great discussions and memorable experiences.

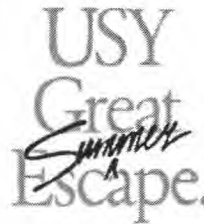

## ANOTHER VIEWPOINT

### A Whole Other Time

My father, Alexander Rosloff, Alex for short, was still a teenager when the First World War broke out in 1914, and was eventually drafted into the Russian Army. I don't know what stage the war was at when he was inducted, but I remember him telling stories to my mother when I was still a child. Sometimes, on a Friday night - - after the lights were put out and Papa was putting us to bed- - he would also tell us kids stories about the war.

I remember one story in particular. Food was short and supplies were not getting through. The soldiers, desperate and hungry, would throw a hand grenade into a stream. The dead fish would float up; the soldiers would wade in, scoop up the fish, and roast them on a stick over an open fire.

Sometime in 1916 or 1917, my father was taken prisoner by the Germans and was sent to work in a coal mine. When they found out that he was literate, they made him a clerk. Russian and Jewish prisoners of war in German hands I World War I did not suffer the same kind of fate as in WWII.

Hanging on the wall in the hallway of my house is a full length picture of my father in a Russian uniform seated in front of a fake backdrop showing a garden setting.

In those days, if prisoners had the money, professional photographers were permitted to enter the POW camps and take photos that were sent across the lines to the homes of prisoners' families.

Sitting in an airport sometime in the 1980's waiting for my flight to be announced, I got into a conversation with a young Jewish man, also waiting for his plane. The conversation eventually moved on to talk about our families, and the fellow pulled out a picture of a man in military uniform and said he was sure I would never guess where this picture of his father had been taken.

I recognized it at once. My father's picture was full length and this one was only a bust shot, but the uniform was familiar. I pretended to study the picture. I looked up at the ceiling, closed my eyes and muttered some nonsense, and then I opened my eyes wide and said : this picture was taken in about 1917 in a German prisoner -of -war camp. The fellow nearly went into shock. "How do you know that?" I finally couldn't contain myself and, laughing, I told him I had a similar picture of my father. I still smile when I think of the look on his face.

Does the term coincidence still apply when it happens so often? Or is that just a coincidence?
