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## A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

Dickens, in his *Tale of Two Cities*, wrote these memorable lines:



“It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, it was the age of wisdom, it was the age of foolishness, it was the epoch of belief, it was the epoch of incredulity, it was the season of Light, it was the season of Darkness, it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair, we had everything before us, we had nothing before us, we were all going direct to heaven, we were all going direct the other way ....”

Could any time be as confusing and contradictory as the time Dickens describes? For an answer, we need look no further than today’s Israel, where Prime Minister Netanyahu, in a remarkable and brilliant political move, recently established the largest and strongest coalition government in Israel’s history.

But why? On the one hand, it is argued, Israel is in an unbelievably strong position. Its per capita gross domestic product outranks Italy, Spain, and Saudi Arabia. It has more companies listed on Nasdaq than any place except the US and China. It has more home computers, university degrees, published scientific papers, museums, scientists, and technicians per capita than any other country. And in numerous areas of scientific and cultural advancement, it ranks number 2, right behind the US.

Oh, and did I mention that Israel recently discovered enough natural gas to meet its energy needs for the next hundred years?

Therefore, some could easily argue that Israel has never been stronger. It is “the best of times.” And, therefore, Netanyahu brought together this huge coalition to use Israel’s strength in order to finally make peace with the Palestinians.

Or....

It also could be “the worst of times.” We see Hamas and Hezbollah stockpiling fifty thousand missiles of increasing sophistication. Egypt, Israel’s “partner in peace,” undergoing the most unrest in more than 30 years and threatening to turn back the clock in regard to the Camp David peace agreement. And, the 800-pound “ayatorilla” in the room: Iran’s peek-a-boo nuclear development. So, a good case could be made for Israel being subjected to an existential threat. And so Netanyahu is bringing together a unity government in order to maximize his military and political options for meeting these threats.

So, nu, what is it? A season of Light or a season of Darkness? And the real answer is...nobody knows. The commentators, the generals, the professors, the intelligence experts all sound equally convincing. And they all disagree with each other.

What are we mere mortals supposed to do? To my mind, the single most important thing we can do is realize that we should not be centering our Jewish identity around the illusory certainties of punditry, where everybody knows everything, and everyone is right until it turns out he or she was wrong.

Instead, we need to focus on who we are - - members of a very special people - - and what we are -- bearers of the world’s most important cultural legacy. If we understand this, if we immerse ourselves in our Jewish civilization and in the Torah, which is its most precious possession, then it won’t matter whether it is the best of times or the worst of times. We will be ready. And if we don’t immerse ourselves in our spiritual inheritance, well...I don’t expect it will matter vey much what happens next. One way or another, we will “all [be] going direct the other way....”

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## ANOTHER VIEWPOINT

### Folks Like Us



The flight from Newark to Tel Aviv was uneventful, but what went on inside the plane was another matter. My seat, 36A, had a high spot right under my right thigh. No matter where I turned, after the first hour I could not find a comfortable position. Getting in and out of my seat was itself a problem. The plane was a 15 year old Boeing 777, with no air vents over the seats, so besides being uncomfortable, it was hot. And getting into my seat at the window required raising all the arm rests and putting my tush on the aisle seat and sliding over the two seats to get to mine.

Standing up was physically impossible for a normal human being, except in the aisle. Someone should be tried at The Hague for inhuman treatment of paying passengers. If prisoners were treated like this there would be public protests in the street. But the plane was full and there was no way to change seats. So, although it was a night flight, I got no sleep that night at all.

One of the offsets was my seat mate. He was a middle aged Israeli who said that he was a journalist, returning from a meeting in the States. In conversation, I said that I had taken some creative writing courses and that I write a monthly column for my synagogue publication. He showed interest in what I had done and encouraged me to publish a book.

Travel can be a great equalizer. At least I thought so until I got to Tel Aviv and was met by my grand daughter, Shira, who excitedly said that she had just seen Arad Nir. The name meant nothing to me. She said that he was one of the top T.V. journalists in Israel, to which I asked if he was a very tall man with dark rimmed glasses. When she said yes I was nearly floored. This was my seat mate. And sure enough, Shira showed him to me that same afternoon on TV.

This was not the first time that I had met well known personalities while traveling. I don't remember the exact date, but Mili and I were on a cruise on the last ship that went through the Panama Canal when the US and Panama went to war in 1989. Among our table mates were a married couple. The man's voice sounded very familiar. We all addressed each other by our first names but after a day or so, I told the man that his voice was very familiar. He smiled and told me his full name and left me wordless. This was back in the day when journalists were also radio and TV broadcasters, and I had heard his voice a jillion times on the radio.

Another interesting contact was made only a few years ago, when I was returning from a visit with my son in St. Louis. The flight was in two sections. We flew from St. Louis to Washington where we changed to a small commuter plane for the leg to Newark, NJ. The second leg was very tight. The season was winter and I wore a padded coat against the weather. The coat was awkward to don and remove in the very narrow aisle. Mine was the window seat. The aisle seat was occupied by a big handsome black man who stood up to help me off with my coat, and stored it in the overhead bin. He was a quiet gentleman, but looked familiar to me. I racked my brain trying to recall where I might know him from. Nothing. After the plane landed in Newark, he took the coat down from the bin and helped me into it. I thanked him profusely, but he just smiled and nodded.

Not until I was on the shuttle bus on the way to the parking lot did I remember him. The man was Ossie Davis, the well known TV actor whom I had seen many times. The nice thing about really great folks is that they behave just like us.

At least the ones that I have met seem to do so.

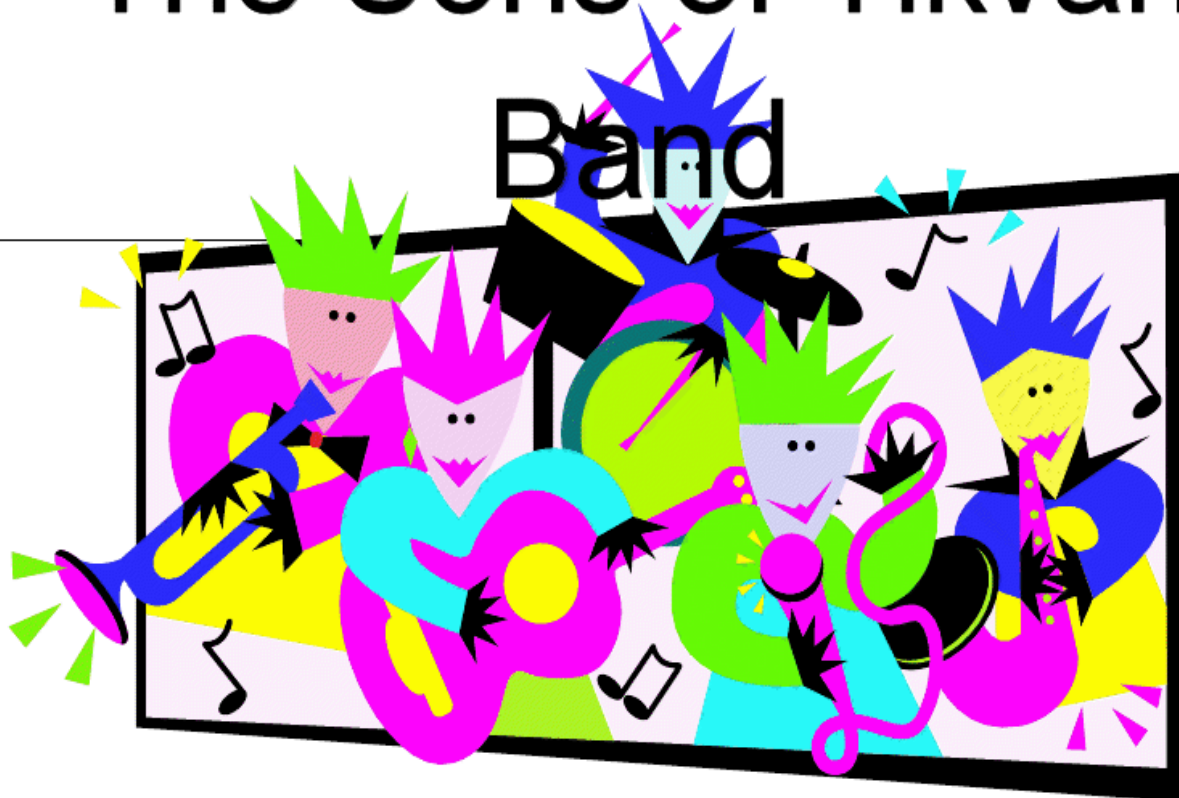

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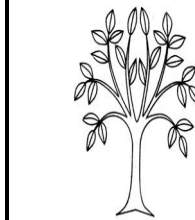
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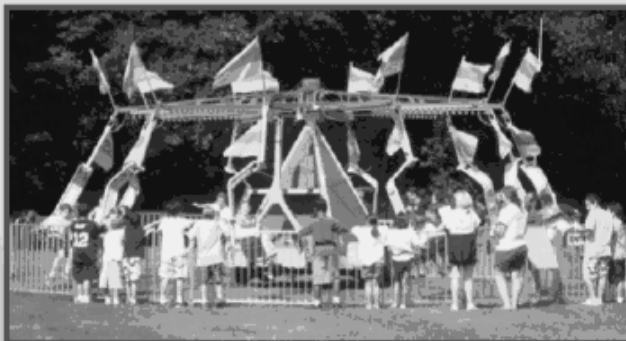

Embrace the uncomfortable ...

I have been told that change is uncomfortable. That statement has often been followed by another similar but more powerful statement: in order to grow you need to become uncomfortable. In part I think that means change can be difficult, therefore, uncomfortable, and growing is an ever changing process. Let's face it, you are going to grow and change whether you want to or not . . . aren't you? I'm not so sure. How many times do you recall telling another adult to "grow up". I don't think that emotional growth is a given for everyone. So ask yourself this question, "when was the last time that I did something uncomfortable".

I recently heard a story that warmed my heart. I would like to share it but, it's not my own and therefore I will recount it as best as I can . . .

A man and his wife were in Panera enjoying a quick Sunday morning breakfast and grabbing a coffee to go (to preserve his privacy I will refer to the husband as Adam). The couple was in a rush to get to class at their temple. There was another man, a stranger, at the coffee bar who was getting his own coffee at the same time.

Adam noticed the man, most specifically he noticed that the man looked unwell.

Having recently experienced illness in his own family, Adam recognized that the man's pallor was a bit off and he was moving very slowly. There was much about the look of the man that spoke volumes and there was no doubt that the stranger was very sick.

It is at these times, when we are in a rush, too busy to notice those around us - or even worse, notice those around us and ignore them, that a decision is made. Sometimes the decision is completely conscious and other times it is without thought or hesitation. I am referring to the decision to engage the person standing next to you.

Do you bother to take a moment and smile, which often sends the message that you are open and able to talk or perhaps listen to a stranger? Do you take that risk and become uncomfortable . . . not being sure that the stranger will take up too much of your precious time or even talk to you about things that you have no interest in at all.

Your response, the decision you make when faced with these types of encounters, can change the world. I state that with conviction and with love in my heart. If each of us took the time to pay attention to those around us I think the world would be a much better place.

The result of the encounter was that after a short but meaningful exchange Adam learned that this stranger, was indeed very sick and without hope. Adam is a special and unique person. I am lucky enough to personally know him. He is a spiritual leader and a man of great integrity. He took the time and spoke to this man and he encouraged him to have faith, to have hope and to pray.

So the class at the temple would have to wait because more important than what was ahead of him was what Adam and the stranger had NOW. They had each other and so they prayed. They moved off to the side, they sat down and spoke and prayed.

It seems so obvious, right? You take the time, talk to someone, maybe make a difference in their life . . . we all have the power to change the world, we just have to get a little uncomfortable.

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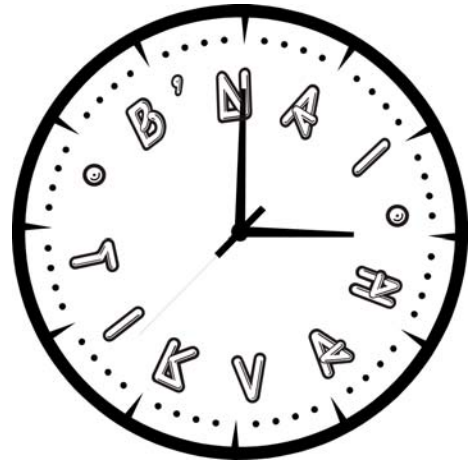

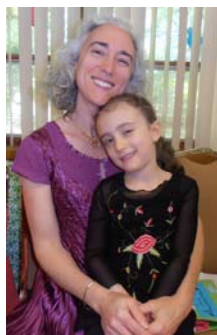

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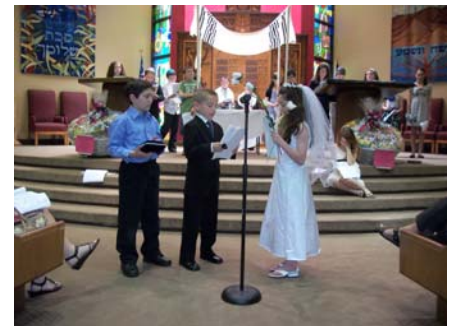
