
A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

The Baal Shem Tov, the 18th century spiritual master who founded the Chasidic movement, once recited the following parable: Two men went into the royal palace to see the king. At the entrance, though, they were informed that the king was not holding court that day. One left immediately, but the other asked permission to visit the palace, and view its beautiful paintings and works of art.

This, explained the Baal Shem Tov, is very similar to our relationship with G-d and the Torah. Within each of us is a seeker, someone who longs for contact with the Divine. We seek to enter the palace. But we experience that the Divine King is not holding court today. We have trouble finding our way in. We don't seem to have the facility to march right into the Divine King's chambers. The fact that the Baal Shem Tov felt it necessary to tell this story to his followers seems to indicate that even back then, our ancestors had the same problems that we do. It seems we're not as spiritual as we used to be, but then again, we never were.

Those who have immediate access to the Divine are few and far between. That's just the way things are. The crucial issue is, what do we do when we find our way to the Divine King blocked? Do we just walk away? All too often, the answer is yes. I know a camera buff who once showed me a camera that loads the film for you, adjusts the light for you, focuses the lens for you, adjusts the F-stop for you, and on and on. It wouldn't have surprised me if the thing could cook dinner for you. And my camera buff friend said, "If they can make cameras this easy, they could make Judaism this easy." And since they didn't (whoever "they" is), he had basically turned his back on our tradition.

But, of course, there's a difference. The camera with all the bells and whistles can do just about everything—except make you a great photographic artist. For that, you need inspiration. And inspiration comes from G-d. So, in other words,



But we'll never get to experience that inspiration if we just walk away from the palace. We need to take advantage of those Divine wonders and masterpieces that grace the palace, even if we don't get to see the King himself. And in Judaism, those Divine wonders and masterpieces are found in the study of Torah.

Now that the fall holidays are coming to a close, we will be embarking on our adult education program. This year, we will have the pleasure of learning together in people's homes, on topics of your choice. We could learn Bible, or Rabbinic Texts, Ethics or Spirituality, Holocaust or Theology, anything that piques our interest. At the very least, you will be able to enjoy the fellowship of other seekers like yourself. And our tradition teaches us that when two sit together to study Torah, the Presence of G-d is with them—so who knows, you might just get a glimpse of the King himself after all!

It is now Sukkot and my spiritual connections are intensifying. Last month, I wrote about my exhilarating experience in Israel. It is my hope that my enthusiasm and passion will make you smile and encourage you to deepen your connection to G-d and Israel. My preparation for and celebration of all of our holidays enriches my spiritual connection to Israel, the Jewish People, and to G-d.



This summer, more than a few B'nai Tikvah families and individuals traveled to Israel, including the Blackin and the Yadin families. Debbie and Jerry Rosen also there, they visited their son, Brad, and his family, who live in Israel. 

Judy Collins

Send in the Clowns. I saw Judy Collins last night (8/16/12) on PBS. Judy has been performing for 50 years. Those years have been kind to her. She is still beautiful and her voice is instantly recognizable. Even, with my eyes closed she is Judy Collins, one of the great folksingers of our time. Or should I say, my time, as some of my readers were not even born when

she became a star.

and justice.

If Judy were starting out today, I believe she would have a much harder time competing with hard rock and rap music. She sang, like many others of those times, protest songs about feeding the hungry and the sick, and songs of love and peace

I remember Joan Baez and Peter Paul and Mary and the Weavers, Pete Seeger, Bob Dylan and Woody Guthrie and other popular entertainers, although entertainers may not be the best way to describe their profession. Singing preachers would be more like it. Some of them survived by playing in subway stations or on street corners, with an open guitar case into which passersby could drop a coin. It was not an easy life, but they carried a message to help create a better life for others.

Technically, not all of them had really great voices, but their messages reached out to us and created a great following. To my knowledge, Woodstock in the 1960s brought out the greatest audience ever, just to listen to American folk music.

We tend to fall back on what were, to us, the "Good Old Days." Depending, of course, on your age. It could be the 1940s, '50s, '60s, or '70s. As I said before, Judy Collins has been singing for 50 years and her music is as relevant today as it was back then. To me, the good old days began in the 1940s with Burl Ives, but no matter what era you look back on, we can all ask to Send in the Clowns, Where are the Clowns?







Opening USY and KADIMA Events at Eagles Landing

Family Shabbat Goes National

On Friday, August 3, 2012, Marc and I had the honor of leading Family Shabbat dinner and services at Congregation Beth Shalom in Seattle, Washington. Back in 2006, we told Rabbi Jill Borodin that if the two of us were ever in Seattle together again, that we would love to bring our program to their synagogue. (This is my sister's and her family's shul.) I have gone to the West Coast since then, but Marc has not joined me.

This summer, we spent three glorious weeks in the Pacific Northwest, working and vacationing. We coordinated with the synagogue in the spring; I created a prayer book for them, sent them our flyer so that they could tailor it to their synagogue and waited anxiously to see how many people would respond. The numbers were great - 65 people were in attendance that evening. It was as crazy and as much fun as it is at B'nai Tikvah.

We recently received the following note from Rabbi Jill Borodin: "Thanks for the tremendous gift of your leadership, cooking and inspiration. We are now building on your leadership, adding a few family services to our calendar the year. We hope that you will visit us again very soon."

This month marks the 18th anniversary of Congregation B'nai Tikvah's family Shabbat program. But we continued on (with the help of Barry Safeer, Jackie Master, and Karen Cohen over the years) and now average 60 - 70 people each month, with our maximum of 95!

If you know of anyone, member or non-member, who has children between the ages of 2 and 7 (of course, younger children are more than welcome), please encourage them to come and try us out!!! We meet on the 3rd Friday night of each month, except for December this year, when we will hold our dinner/service on the 2nd Friday night so that we can celebrate Chanukah together!



From the President

A Secret to Staying Young

More than ten years ago, when my wife, Bobby, and I became empty nesters, we often came to services on Friday night. I don't remember exactly why but, one Friday evening I came to the synagogue earlier than usual and heard something strange going on in the Kiddush



room. The door was open and when I looked in, I saw Marc & Bobbi Binder sitting on the carpeted floor with four little kids playing and singing songs. I had no idea what they were doing or who the kids were but, whatever it was, they seemed to be having a wonderful time.

Not to be intrusive, I waited until after services and, in the Kiddish Room, asked Bobbi what that was about. She told me that, once a month or so, she and Marc would conduct what they called a "Family Shabbat Service." 
