A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



How does one speak about the unspeakable? Trying to find words at this moment, when dozens of families, an entire community, indeed an entire nation is grieving for the loss of so much innocent life in Newtown is a daunting task. What could possibly be said in the presence of murdered children that doesn't trivialize the horror of what has occurred?

But I am aware that you will be reading this several weeks after the events, when grief can, and should, give way to reflection. So I am trying to imagine what it would feel like to discuss the destruction rationally, without being overwhelmed by emotion.

My first thought is that we have been here before. The quiet, troubled child. The obscene firepower. The camouflage outfits. The sense of powerlessness, the idea that nothing can be done to avert this recurrent nightmare.

My second thought is that it doesn't have to be this way. There is a great deal that can and must be done to keep us from going through this again.

The first is to deal with the guns. It is not surprising that an organization as primitive as the NRA would pollute our minds with the vacuous assertion, "Guns don't kill people. People kill people."

The simple fact, though, is that "People with automatic weapons kill lots of people very quickly." And anyone above the level of troglodyte knows it. It appears that the guns used in this assault, as is so often the case, were purchased legally. And that speaks volumes.

The idea that anyone can own weapons of mass murder is, itself, bizarre. Of course, the NRA would defend people owning weapons of mass *destruction*, because if "they" take away your G-d given right to own nukes, we're on the slippery slope to the black U.N. helicopters flying over the powerless citizens of Montana.

But back in the real world, we should be revolted that our safety is being held hostage by people suffering from paranoid delusions, and by spineless politicians who don't have the guts to stand up to a powerful lobby. Two thousand years ago, our Mishnah recorded the law that it was forbidden for Jews to sell weapons to the Romans, because the Romans could not be relied upon to use them responsibly.

If anything, that prohibition is today even more urgent.

My third thought—one that echoes the feelings of many people who have spoken to me about this—is that there are all too many profoundly troubled people out there who are not getting the help they need. If I could wave my magic wand, I would put dozens of social workers and guidance counselors in every school in America to try to avert this kind of disaster. Instead of cutting school budgets, we should be increasing them in order to put our resources where they are most needed—and after something as horrible as this, it's hard to think of a place where intervention would be more crucial.

It is at the nexus of powerful weapons and profoundly troubled children that we have the greatest opportunity to do something constructive. As regards Newtown, for example, it was clearly disastrous to have five powerful guns in a household where there was a child with a severe personality disorder—and that should have been obvious to any rational observer. We have no room for willful ignorance. There's too much involuntary ignorance already.

Finally, I return to my first feelings: that is, the horror. We might hope that, as regards policy, some sanity comes out of this terrible tragedy. And if it does, we might even venture to say that the death of the innocents was not in vain. But for those who have suffered this loss, neither that nor anything I can think of can ever make them whole.

May G-d, Who heals the broken-hearted, comfort them.

ANOTHER VIEWPOINT



The Cross

From time to time I receive mail from organizations that are looking for support to put up a cross in public places as a memorial to fallen soldiers. I usually just discard them with no further thought because some people are trying to claim their religious rights to do something that is illegal, that is, until I received an email from my friend Cathy McKenna.

Although Cathy and I have been friends for years it is not likely that we will ever meet. I became acquainted with Cathy after I bought my first computer about fifteen or twenty years ago and needed tech support as soon as I took it out of the box. I called and was connected to a pleasant female voice who patiently walked me through some simple steps, and during the pauses, while the computer was trying to catch up with its commands we talked and became long distance friends. I in New Jersey and Cathy in British Columbia.

As her employer would not permit personal phone calls or emails, I gave her mine and we stayed in touch. She told me about her divorce, her re-marriage, her son, and I told her what was going on in my life. It was purely platonic and gave us both a way to sound off with no consequences. That is, until Cathy sent me, by email, a request from an organization that wanted to be allowed to erect a large memorial cross in a public place and needed financial and political support.

After I recovered from the shock, I responded to Cathy as diplomatically as I could that not all soldiers are Christian. She sent me back an abject apology and said that she knew very little about the Jewish religion and did it include anything about Jesus.

I remembered that there are huge areas in North America where there are very few Jews. In many towns the only Jews were the owners of the hardware or dry goods store. I recall my own experiences in the army where I met men who had never met a Jew and were surprised that I looked like a normal person.

Judging from everything that we had talked about I do not think of her as an ignorant person, but she knew nothing at all about Jews and Judaism. Zip – nada. I had to start from scratch. I explained how Christianity had grown out of Judaism and the consequences for us that followed these two thousand years. I went from Abraham to Auschwitz.

Her response was “How could people do that to each other?” This from a woman who has been around the block a few times!

Boy, have we got a P.R. job to do!

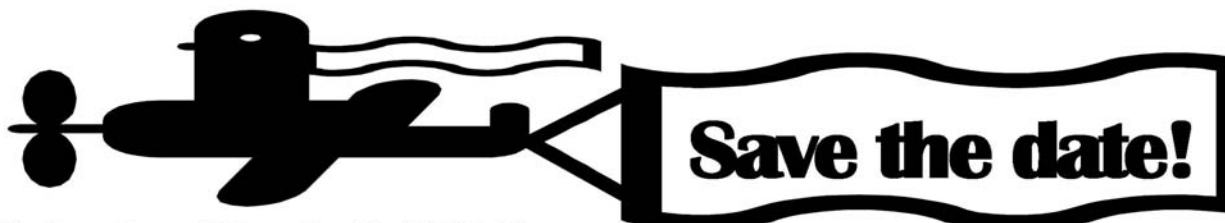

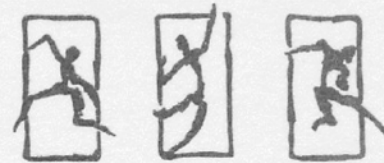

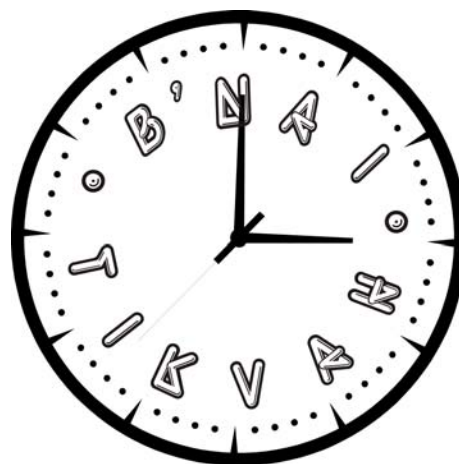
