## A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



Last Yom Kippur, I praised the work of Pamela Geller. She is the woman responsible for the ads in the NYC subway system stating, “In any war between the civilized man and the savage, support the civilized man. Support Israel. Defeat Jihad.”

Although the ad was criticized for being an attack on all Muslims, Geller disagreed, asking, “Does that imply that all Muslims support jihad?” Or, phrased differently, if most Muslims are peaceful adherents of a religion of peace, why shouldn’t they applaud an attack on violent jihadists?

In the weeks that followed my sermon, a number of our congregants, in particular Jonathan Katz, sent me important information about Ms. Geller. Among other things, her organization has been branded a hate group by the Anti-Defamation League and the Southern Poverty Law Center. I also was sent a number of extreme statements by Ms. Geller, which definitely blurred the line between a critique of “jihadists” and “islamofascism” on the one hand, and “Muslims” and “Islam” on the other.

I recently attended a lecture by Ms. Geller in Edison, at Rabbi Rosenberg’s shul, and asked her to clarify her views. But before I give you her response, I should let you know the circumstances that led to her speaking in Edison at all. She had been invited to speak at the Men’s Club of the Great Neck Synagogue. But a campaign was organized against her by a number of religious leaders. Typical were the (to my mind, outrageous and outlandish) comments of Tom Goodhue, Chair of the Long Island Council of Churches, who wrote that inviting Geller to speak was “the equivalent of a church inviting a Nazi who claimed Jews were trying to take over America or a mosque inviting an anti-Semite who claimed that Jews were trying to impose kosher laws on the nation.” Anyone who can make a comment such as that doesn’t know anything about Pamela Geller but, more important, doesn’t know anything about Jews, Nazis, or Islam either. The Great Neck Synagogue, citing security and insurance liability concerns, cancelled her lecture—which Rabbi Rosenberg, to his credit, immediately picked up. The very idea that the free exchange of ideas could be curtailed through intimidation should be abhorrent to all of us.

But back to Ms. Geller. I told her about the sermon, and about the response, and I asked her “where the dividing line runs” between an entirely legitimate critique of violent islamofascist terrorism and scurrilous islamophobic attacks on entirely innocent Muslims. Her answer was as follows. Classical Islam is rife with violent and anti-Semitic themes and there are numerous current Muslim leaders who state openly both that they are Jew haters and that their Jew hatred derives from their religious tradition.

Ms. Geller takes them at their word: it is not Muslims, per se, but rather Islam, that is the problem. Ms. Geller has nothing negative to say about “secular” Muslims and, in fact, feels that they actually suffer more from Islam than anyone else.

So, what is my take on all this? First, that Ms. Geller’s views of classical Islam are well founded. They are not the whole story, but they are definitely a major part of the story. Second, she is absolutely correct that there is a “bait-and-switch” being pulled about Islam. The violent underbelly of Islam is often covered up with a whitewashed version, one more palatable to the press and to people who don’t explore the topic more closely. One case in point: an ad campaign “rebranding” the word “jihad” as merely meaning “struggle” in general, as opposed to something akin to “holy war.” Consider the ad that ran a few months ago in San Francisco, with a picture of a Muslim exercising, that says “My jihad is to stay fit.”

You can’t make this stuff up!

I have no doubt at all that when Osama bin Laden talked about “jihad,” he wasn’t thinking about going to Weight Watchers.

Third, many of Ms. Geller’s comments are extreme and intentionally provocative, a la Ann Coulter. To my mind, this is both unnecessary and counter-productive. They garner attention, to be sure, but they also distract from the essential message. And the essential message needs to be heard. I believe Ms. Geller is wrong when she says that there is no moderate Islam. But that fact should not distract us from the painful reality that there most definitely is a radical Islam which constitutes a clear and present danger to our lives and our way of life.

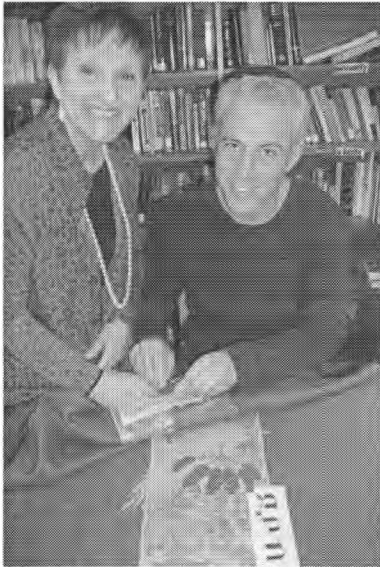
## SOFER VISIT

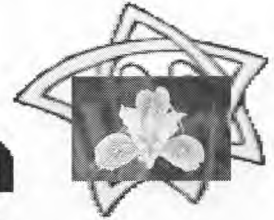
