A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



Hanukah is coming. The festival of lights. A time of joy and celebration, of family and fressing. And this year, perhaps more than most, a time for reflection. Because Hanukah is not only about light. It is about light and darkness. Without awareness of how dark things can be, we cannot appreciate the significance of the light, the miracles experienced by our ancestors "in those days at this season." The miracle of light took place in the restored Temple and, equally important, on the battlefield. In fact, two battlefields: the one fought with swords and spears, the other with ideas and ideals.

Two thousand years ago, we were facing an enemy that was interested not merely in political dominance but in cultural destruction. Judaism itself was threatened. Today, we—we as Jews and we as members of the world community—face an enemy with similar goals. I write these words while the city of Paris, the city of lights, is in agony. The blood of innocents is still in the streets. The enemy has engaged us on the physical battlefield (if one can call nightclubs and soccer stadiums "battlefields"). And the enemy has engaged us on the battlefield of ideas as well. The battle before us is a battle between modernity and medievalism

At our recent "Visions of Peace" discussion, there was one principle on which virtually everyone agreed. It was that as long as people are being indoctrinated in violence and hatred, we will not be able to make progress toward peace. Evidence of such indoctrination is readily available, indeed ubiquitous. Out of the darkness of those who would return us to the Dark ages, though, we can see glimmers of light. Consider the words of Adnan Hussein, executive editor of *Al-Mada*, an Iraqi newspaper: "We cannot shake off our responsibility for the new and terrible terror attack that recently struck Paris, the French capital. We, the Arabs and Muslims, cannot renounce our direct role and our close connection to the terror

attacks that have been flooding all the countries of the world, including our own countries, for two decades or more.... We cannot escape our responsibility for terror, and no excuses will avail us. First we must recognize [our responsibility], and apologize to ourselves and others and correct our ways from now on. We cannot do this without thoroughly rethinking our curricula and changing them from the root, from elementary school to university [level]. There will be no forgiveness unless we change the way religion is presented in the curricula, in universities, in mosques and in *husseiniyyas* [Shiite shrines], and on the radio and television stations. For the religion [as presented there] is not a religion of tolerance, peace, harmony, mutual responsibility and compassion. The religion [presented there] is a barbaric religion characterized by beheadings and bloodshed and which incites to steal, usurp, enslave and rape. The other, [compassionate,] religion, which some claim is the true religion, has no presence in our lives. At best, its voice is feeble and heard almost by nobody, especially among the oppressed new generation that is marginalized and whose humanity is being compromised by poverty, rejection and injustice, and by the crazy curricula and fatwas."

Such words bring light into the world. It takes courage to write such words, courage that deserves to be applauded and supported. Such words underscore the fact that the battle we face is not one between Islam and the world. It is a battle between humanity and inhumanity. And especially at this time of year, we can take comfort in the knowledge born of faith that in that battle, light is ultimately stronger than darkness.

A Message From Our Co-Presidents





More than eighteen months ago, B'nai Tikvah hosted a phenomenal speaker – Nitsana Darshan-Leitner, the founder and director of Shurat HaDin (Israel Law Center), speaking about her organization's goal of Bankrupting Terror. Shurat HaDin "works with Western intelligence agencies, law enforcement branches, and a network of volunteer lawyers across the globe to file legal actions on behalf of world Jewry." Among their numerous achievements, they have won money judgments in the hundreds of millions of dollars in frozen terror assets and for the victims of terror and their families, and more than \$2 billion against terror organizations and state sponsors of terror.

We have since sponsored one after another world-class speaker on issues affecting Israel and Jews around the world, including: Kasim Hafeez – a Muslim who came to realize that everything he had ever been taught about Israel was a fallacy and thus became an ardent Zionist; Rabbi Ken Spiro discussing the age-old saga of Anti-Semitism, which long predates the founding of the State of Israel; and Body and Soul, which even the New York Times calls a "concise, skillful recounting of the story of the Jewish people and their connection to the land of Israel" and is "straightforward in presenting the historical record."

Last spring, we presented the film, Two Sided Story, which depicts the emotional journey of 27 Israelis and Palestinians who are "not trying to convince each other that their narrative is right, nor...seeking a political solution...but [working] to listen, to clarify the differences between how they grasp reality and how they see the other side." In October, we brought in

Sunni Muslim human rights activist Zebu Jilani, founder of SWAT Relief Initiative in Pakistan. Jilani has dedicated her life to improving the health, education, and welfare of SWATis, who have been besieged by the Taliban, natural disasters, extreme poverty, and brutal male domination.

Have you missed these presentations? There are many more coming up, including two of note in December: legendary feminist activist Phyllis Chesler and world-renowned Cantor Malovany in concert. We note that Shurat HaDin has recently filed a class-action lawsuit against Facebook, "alleging it allowed jihadists to openly recruit and train terrorists and plan terror attacks on its pages." Shurat HaDin "wants to force Facebook not only to remove the terrorists' pages, but also to better monitor and block users who post videos glorifying and encouraging terrorist attacks, and publish messages with instructions on how to carry out an attack." The lawsuit explains, "Since Facebook uses algorithms that match users with personalized ads and connect them to potential 'friends,' the company should have the ability to monitor and block such postings." If successful, similar suits may also be filed against YouTube, Twitter, and other social media outlets.

B'nai Tikvah is proud to be the center for education about these issues, which affect all of us, and our brothers and sisters in Israel. We look forward to seeing you!

Why we run this program? The following is an excerpt of one of the thank you notes we received on behalf of a family we sponsored: "This family has never experienced such great generosity. 

A few weeks ago, our teachers had the privilege of attending an exciting day of professional learning designed specifically for Jewish early childhood educators. Organized by Federation in the Heart of New Jersey, this full-day conference included new Jewish music for our teachers to use in their classrooms and many helpful workshops addressing issues that we encounter every day in our school.



CBT Religious School and CBT Chai

Jennifer James, Director of Education

B'tzelem Elohim means "in the image of G-d." We learn in B'reisheit that, alone among all creation, human beings were created b'tzelem Elohim, in the image of G-d. This is something that we keep very close to our hearts in the Religious School.

For myself and the teachers, it means that we constantly recognize each child's inherent worth and gifts. Each one is special and unique in his or her own way. It is our responsibility always to look for their unique gifts, to honor their individual insights, and to seek out and guide the spark of G-d that is in all of them. Sometimes this is very easy to do. At other times it can be more challenging - - and yet I believe that it is precisely at the most challenging moments that thinking about b'tzelem *Elohim* is most important.

For our students, b'tzelem Elohim is the premise (whether they know it or not!) underlying Panim el Panim – the Face-to-Face morning meeting that begins every Sunday morning class. This is a sacred time, because through the exercises, games, and teaching that goes on during Panim el Panim, we foster a culture of kavod (respect) and kehillah (community) based on Jewish values. And at their heart, both respect and community are founded on b'tzelem Elohim: you might say that it is that spark of G-d that helps us treat each other with respect and

ourselves with our friends.

But thinking about b'tzelem Elohim begs the question: What exactly does it mean to be made in the image of G-d? The even bigger question is: what is G-d? Our children explore this question in many ways, and some of the most profound answers come from some of our youngest children. The First and Second Graders had a fascinating group discussion recently and the thoughts and questions they came up with included these:

- * G-d is a boy
- * G-d is a girl
- * G-d is both!
- * G-d is neither!
- * G-d is big enough to cover the whole world
- * G-d will help everyone but he can't control you
- * Why did G-d make people different?
- * Is G-d all finished with making things?

Over the years, it has been my experience that Jewish parents are not always comfortable talking about G-d with their children. Often ,this is because the parents themselves do not know how they feel about G-d, or they are concerned that they do not "know enough" or will give "the right answers." In reality, however, the questions are more important than the answers. The conversations are more important that the conclusions. And exploring these ideas together can be a richly rewarding experience.

Our CBT Chai students are nearing the end of their first semester electives, with a new sense of how Jewish thought and history intersect with their own lives.

In Active Israel, the teens have learned many new things about early Zionism and the founding of the State of Israel. They have been particularly interested to learn how the young nation defended itself from those who sought to destroy it, so I have given them information on everything from the Haganah and the Palmach (the pre-State army and its elite striking force) to the origins of the Israeli Air Force. Each week, their learning has included short videos, discussions, and learning Krav Maga - the Israeli-invented martial art that was originally created to fight against anti-Semitic thugs in 1930s Europe and ultimately developed into one of the most effective and successful selfdefense techniques in the world. The culture of the IDF, which grew out of the Palmach and the early approach to defense that Krav Maga is based on, is also something that our teens have been interested in learning about. A local Krav Maga instructor, Brandon Alterman from Brunswick Martial Arts and Fitness in North Brunswick, has been a fabulous addition to our staff for these Krav Maga lessons in the gym.

In our Soul Food class, every week we explore a different way in which Judaism elevates mundane tasks like preparing and eating food into a holy experience. The teens in this class have learned various brachot (blessings) for different foods, studied the origins of kashrut that are found in the Torah, and explored what Judaism has to say about being a vegetarian and about GMOs. Sometimes the answers are not as straightforward as the teens would like – this can be frustrating, and yet also a window into the vastness and complexity of Jewish thought and history. They have encountered many texts and cooked many delicious foods that tie in with the weekly topics – if only you could have tasted their Israeli salad and cheese blintzes and vegetarian matzah ball soup! Most recently, as they consider the emphasis that Judaism places on helping those who suffer from food insecurity and hunger, this group of teens has made substantial meals to be donated to Elijah's Promise, and visited the Better World Market to see first-hand the work that is done – and still needs to be done, every day – to support those in our community who do not have enough to eat.

Our annual Chanukah Party is Wednesday, December 9, and we are looking forward to a huge celebration! The Religious School Committee has been hard at work making plans. We will gather together as a kehillah kedosha – a holy community – to light Chanukah candles and sing the blessings together. We will enjoy a dinner of pizza and salad and desserts and dreidel playing, and the Sons of Tikvah will get us in the holiday mood with uplifting music! Some of our Religious School students will sing along with the band as well. Your whole extended family is invited! Please just let us know how many people will be attending from your family so that we can order enough pizza!




