## From the Desk of Cantor Bruce Rockman



### *We Embrace Your Gifts*

This year I had the opportunity to prepare my daughter Bashe for her upcoming Bat Mitzvah. Many have asked me if it was difficult for me or for Bashe. It has been fun and a pleasure. The communication was a little simpler and Bashe was the perfect student, she was always prepared, never had an excuse for not studying and I was always cool and collected. OK, so this is mostly true. I was always calm and it was a pleasure. You know how proud I am of every student that I teach, I'm told you can see it on my face, I'm sure I'll be a little emotional when our family stands together and receives our blessing from Rabbi Wolkoff.

Do you remember your bar or bat mitzvah? For me and most everyone I speak to with, it was a most memorable time. We remember that we celebrated with our parents, grandparents, relatives and the friends who helped to shape our lives. We remember the difficulties of learning our haftarat, the endless hours of studying, the badgering of our parents and the liberation when that part was done. We remember the celebration that followed that was so much fun and finishing the thank you notes gave me true peace.

I've been so honored to teach quite a few b'nai mitzvah students at B'nai Tikvah, my role as their teacher and mentor fills me with pride. I remember what it felt like to prepare for my big day, the pressure and the challenges that we all confronted. It is always my goal to nurture a positive, memorable Jewish experience of a lifetime. It has always been my purpose for my students to remember their learning experience fondly and for them to relish their accomplishment with joy and sweetness. This is the reason that we end every lesson with candy.

Through this lengthy process, with its ups and downs, I try to provide our b'nai mitzvah students with a sense of accomplishment and encourage them

to pay their experience forward. With all of these good intentions and the encouragement to be socially conscious, which our students express through their mitzvah projects, exactly how successful are we in creating engaged Jewish people?

As parents of these children, we make an enormous commitment to Judaism by being members of a synagogue and participating in synagogue programs. Many but not most of our students continue their Jewish engagement post b'nai mitzvah. Those who continue their Jewish education and Jewish involvement through youth groups such as USY and Jewish summer camps and programs, are given the most sustenance toward building a strong Jewish home of their own and a meaningful Jewish perspective.

But not everyone will follow my recommendations for living a Jewish life. My parents provided a framework that allowed me to find my path. I believe that Judaism is a major part of my persona; Judaism is a part of my inheritance, one that I value and cherish. Judaism is my responsibility to love and to enjoy. I guarantee that my family will continue to have the same wonderful opportunity, that is their birthright and this is my sacred responsibility as a parent of Jewish children.

Now you may go about this differently than Stacey and I do. I assure you that you, too, are on the right path. I encourage you to do everything you can to solidify and strengthen this road for your children. Look for ways to bring more Jewish context into your lives. This summer, when you're at the beach, hiking in the mountains, riding your bikes or just enjoying a cool summer breeze, remember, all of these are God's gifts to us; embrace them with gratitude and with all your heart.

## A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



In a recent scathing article, *The Prophet and Trump*, liberal thinker Paul Berman bemoans the cultural crisis of our time. He cites the disappearance of newspapers, the shrinking of magazines, the lack of depth and professionalism in the media, the collapse of book-review supplements, the weakness of television news, the decline of trade unions (which used to have a strong intellectual component), the decline of music education and the subsequent decline of symphony orchestras that are no longer understood or appreciated.

What is the source of this intellectual disaster? In part, “disembowelment by Internet;” and perhaps even more serious, betrayal by humanities professors who seem more concerned with criticizing “Zionist colonialism” than with teaching virtue and moral discernment.

In political terms, writes Berman, the “enemies of intellect” have left “huge portions of the population rudderless as to making political decisions.” We are no longer capable of judging “who is worthy of respect and who is not,” and as a result we are left with “proud barbarians” who are “confident in their illiteracy.”

Although the article is directed in the first instance against Donald Trump, a proud barbarian if ever there was one, it could just as easily apply to democratic candidates. How much of a leap would it

be, after all, to imagine today’s young Sanders supporters cheering a Justin Bieber/Kim Kardashian ticket in 2020?

G-d help us.

So what are we supposed to do about this? I can answer in a single word: LEARN! If our Judaism is to mean anything—anything—it must be based on the fundamental understanding that knowledge is one of the two essential qualities that make us human. The other, of course, is compassion/love. Our tradition teaches us that G-d’s choice to give us the Torah was an enormous act of compassion. And our study of it is a reciprocal expression of love for our Creator.

With this in mind, I invite you to our annual *tikkun lel Shavuot*, our late night study session on the evening of June 11, the anniversary of our receiving the Torah at Mt. Sinai. Together we will explore those qualities that are, in fact, worthy of respect, and the myriad ways G-d teaches us to show compassion.

So many times in the past, in the face of the Babylonians and the Romans, the Byzantines and the Mongols, from the shtetls in the Pale of Settlement to the ghettos of Europe to the American urban slums a century ago, our love of learning has empowered us to survive any onslaught. Today, learning Torah together can once again help us rise above the morass that is today’s “intellectual” discourse. Be a part of it.

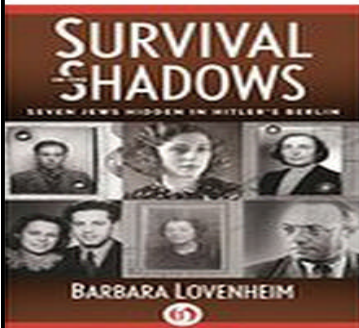

## BOOK REVIEW:

### **Survival In The Shadows**



The remarkable true story of two German Jewish families that survived against all odds while hiding in the heart of the Nazi capital.

In January 1943, unable to flee Germany, the four members of the Arndt family went underground to avoid deportation to Auschwitz. Ellen Lewinsky and her mother, Charlotte, joined them; a year later, Bruno Gumpel arrived. Hiding in a small factory near Hitler's bunker, Without identification cards or food-ration stamps, they were dependent on German strangers for survival.

When Russian soldiers finally rescued the group in April 1945, the families were near death from starvation. But their will to live triumphed and two months later, four of the survivors—Erich Arndt and Ellen Lewinsky, and Ruth Arndt and Bruno Gumpel—reunited in a double wedding ceremony.

Survival in the Shadows chronicles the previously untold story of the largest group of German Jews to have survived hiding in Berlin through the final and most deadly years of the Holocaust.

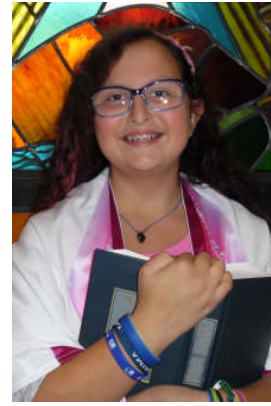

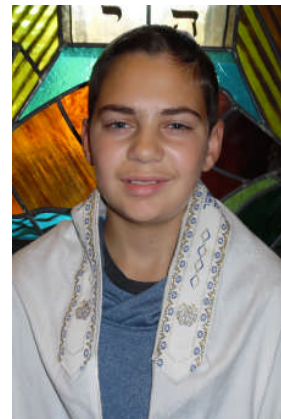

## Watch Our Services Online

Last September, two days before Yom Kippur, my wife's mother unexpectedly passed away. As you can imagine, it was a very tumultuous and emotional time for the family. Rabbi Wolkoff explained to Linda that because the funeral wasn't until after Yom Kippur, she was under no obligation to come to services. This was a relief since, as much as we love being with all of our friends at B'nai Tikvah, it would have been too difficult to be among so many people.

It was very comforting to spend Yom Kippur day with Linda's family at her father's house but in addition to the huge void left by Linda's mother's absence, we missed the powerful and moving Yom Kippur services. Fortunately, we didn't have to miss services completely. During the preceding few months, I had been investigating for the Ritual Committee the possibility of streaming B'nai Tikvah's services over the Internet. I was aware of several synagogues that already offered streaming and so we spent the day hopping among services broadcast from New York City, Baltimore, Cleveland, Houston, Los Angeles and North Jersey. (As one service went to a break, we moved to another.) It was a relief to be able to partake of services on a day that we could not attend.

The topic of streaming our services from B'nai Tikvah has been under discussion for months by the Ritual Committee. We have considered the issue of the use of electricity on the Sabbath (and: yes) it is permitted for this purpose. We have considered the question of whether someone watching at home can count as part of a minyan (answer: no) and whether they could say Kaddish if a minyan is physically present at B'nai Tikvah (answer: yes). We have also considered the possible negative consequences of streaming the services—both that people at services might feel inhibited if they knew they are being “watched,” and also the possibility that people will choose to stay home rather than come to services.

These concerns are understandable, but we don't believe the negative consequences will be far-reaching, while the benefits will be substantial and widely shared. Watching

services over the Internet cannot match the warmth, intimacy and spirituality of being in the sanctuary in person with your fellow congregants and the rabbi and cantor. However, there simply are times when we just can't make it to synagogue, perhaps because we're not feeling well, the weather is too forbidding, or we're traveling. And of course there are times when we want friends or family members to celebrate a simcha with us but they live too far away or are physically not up to coming.

With that in mind, I'm very pleased to announce that for these times, you can now stream B'nai Tikvah's Shabbat and holiday services and other events to any Internet-connected computer, smartphone, or tablet. You even can even watch on your TV. (More on this below.) We have partnered with a company called StreamSpot which specializes in broadcasting services from houses of worship. In addition, my employer, DGA Security, generously donated a high quality camera so we can broadcast with crystal-clear clarity.

To watch online, just go to [bnaitikvah.org](http://bnaitikvah.org) and click on Watch Our Services. Please note that broadcasts are automatic and scheduled in advance. Because of the restrictions against doing work on Shabbat and many holidays, should technical difficulties arise, we will not be able to address them immediately.

There are several ways to watch on your TV instead of squinting at your phone's screen. If you have an iPhone or iPad and an Apple TV, you can use AirPlay to send the video to your television. If you use an Android device, you can do the same with a Google Chromecast or Roku streaming device.

Do you have a friend who is considering joining B'nai Tikvah? Streaming video will also be a valuable marketing tool for CBT. Encourage your friend to click the Watch Our Services link and view archived recordings of select past services and events. And then, of course, invite him or her to come to shul to hear the cantor's wonderful chanting and the rabbi's insightful commentaries in person.

Finally, a huge thank you to Gary Bergman for all his help configuring the network and running up and down the ladder to get everything set up. We hope you enjoy this new service as we move forward into 21st century Conservative Judaism.
