A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff



I participated recently in a rally in New Brunswick, in order to urge the mayor to declare New Brunswick a "sanctuary city." I did not, and would not, speak on behalf of B'nai Tikvah, because there are surely many diverse views within our congregation. I had in mind, instead, to offer a biblical perspective on the current situation. Due to circumstances beyond my control, I did not have the opportunity to deliver the speech publicly, but I wanted to share my thoughts with you:

I come today not to speak of politics, but of humanity. The humanity we all share. The humanity that is at the root of Western civilization. The humanity that underlies the most repeated commandment in the Bible: respect for the stranger.

No one questions the right, indeed, the obligation, of our government to keep us safe. And I hope all would agree that there has to be fairness and transparency in immigration and related policies.

But there also must be—indeed, there must first and foremost be—a deep sense of common humanity. The crucial concept is "humanity." Shared humanity. Human beings. Our brothers and sisters.

The biblical Abraham is the father of all Jews, Christians, and Muslims. And it is no coincidence that our father Abraham and our mother Sarah were not portrayed in the Bible as conquering heroes or wealthy aristocrats.

Instead, they were immigrants—at times, desperate immigrants—subject to physical intimidation, economic dislocation, and sexual exploitation.

They came from the Middle East. Would they be allowed on the sacred shores of this country if they arrived today? How dare we speak of "sacred shores" when we fail to see the link between "sanctity" and "sanctuary"?

We cannot defend our sacred shores at the same time we desecrate them. And any policy that willfully ignores the humanity of those seeking to come to America, those "yearning to breathe free," is most certainly a desecration.

I do not pretend to know what I don't know. But it would suit us to remember that even in their fragile tent of a home, Abraham and Sarah welcomed the dusty strangers as honored guests.

I can suggest no magic bullet that will instantaneously solve all the complicated questions surrounding immigration, refugees, asylum, amnesty and so forth.

Those are political questions which must be worked out in the political sphere. And again I say that our government has a legitimate interest in establishing rules and following them, as a matter of both defense and decency.

But this I do know: if we define and degrade human beings as "illegals," and as "threats," we will not create a policy that works. If, on the other hand, we consider "others" as "brothers" and recognize their full humanity, regardless of their origins and circumstances, we will.

Sometimes the choices really are that simple.

I welcome your response to these thoughts.

On March 5, 2017, we welcome world-renowned Rabbi Joseph Telushkin to Congregation B'nai Tikvah to discuss "Israel: Power and Politics". Rather than advocating any particular point of view, Rabbi Telushkin, with his trademark wit and sensibility, addresses this topic through the lens of *Words That Hurt and Words That Heal*. At a time when many people have abandoned any effort to address controversial topics in a reasoned, respectful way, Rabbi Telushkin stands head and shoulders above the crowd

We are honored to partner with the Jewish National Fund in sponsoring Rabbi Telushkin's talk. This is our second annual Garden State Brunch with JNF, and last year's event was attended by over 400 people. JNF is not just about planting trees in Israel, although that is still a major focus. JNF is literally building Israel, including new communities in the Negev and the Galil, water infrastructure, playgrounds, hospitals, special needs facilities, colleges and much more. Revolutionary solutions to the world's water shortage

Compassionate first-response to global disasters

Unparalleled integration of people with disabilities into the armed forces Art, music, culture, diversity and tolerance

We will celebrate together with people of every state and many countries, as well as varied faiths and ethnicities, including some 4,000 students who inspire everyone with their knowledge, passion and dedication.

The Men's Club will be distributing, at the Purim Carnival, the Yom Hashoah Yellow Yahrzeit Candle and accompanying meditation. Please make sure to pick up your candle and those of friends and neighbors then.

It is customary to light this candle on the evening before, this year being Sunday evening, April 23rd. The candle is lit in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. The act of kindling this flame and the reading of the mediation create a moving ritual to remind us of what happened not so long ago.

Placing the candle in the window (safely) is also a way to remind our community. This moment would also be an excellent opportunity to begin a discussion of the Holocaust with your children and family.

This is our 25th year of participation in the program. The Men's Club has provided your candle. Because of your generous donations in the past, it has allowed the program to be self-sustaining. Over the past few years, excess funds have been used to establish a permanent memorial to the Holocaust in the form of the Rescued Torah displayed in our lobby, to support

the Anne Frank exhibit, and the outdoor Holocaust Remembrance garden located next to the library.

CBT will hold our annual reading of the names of victims of the Shoah on Monday morning, April 24th beginning at 10am. The Yom Hashoah service will begin at 7:30pm that evening.

Additionally, we encourage you to attend the joint CBT Sisterhood/Men's Club timely event, "Miriam Dobin Author" (see page 2).

We do hope that you and your family will participate in the programs mentioned above. We believe that you will find them powerful and meaningful experiences.



CBT Religious School and CBT Chai

Because we are learning for Jewish living, family education is a critical element of our Religious School experience. Every year we hold programs that allow our students and their parents and grandparents to learn together – and even give the children a chance to teach the adults a thing or two! We held several of these programs recently, which made me think this is a perfect time to share them all with you so everyone knows what we are doing.

Our grade-level programs delve into topics that are relevant to the curriculum for each year:

Kindergarten, First and Second Grades: As part of the unit on Shabbat, the children and their families gather to do Havdalah together, to learn about the parts of the Havdalah service and their meaning, and to make ritual objects that they can use to do the service at home together

Alef.

We learn together about the importance of names in Jewish tradition, then the children interview their parents to learn about their namesakes and the meanings of their Hebrew names. This information is used when the Alef students write their speeches for Consecration at the Alef Shabbat service in May. They also make beautiful objects with their Hebrew names and create a cover for the siddur that they will be given at Consecration.

Bet

Blessings are the theme of this family education program, in which the children first learn every blessing over various types of food and then help the teacher to remind or teach their parents about them. They also learn about the importance of blessings in Judaism. As these students become more fluent in Hebrew reading and prayer, this important element -- that is not present in Shabbat services -- can become part of their daily lives.

Gimmel and Dalet:

The units on Jewish history – ancient, American, and Israeli – culminate in a Jewish Heritage Fair where the students research with their families and then present to the entire school their own immigration story and Jewish family roots. The families get to re-discover – and in some cases learn for the first time – about the countries from which their ancestors emigrated, their journey to becoming American Jews, and the objects they carried with them.

Hei:

The students come full circle with names – last visited in the Alef class – when they design a personalized silver yad that features their Hebrew name and they can use when they become b'nai mitzvah. The families engage in Torah study together as part of this program.

In addition, recently our T'filah Coordinator and Bet Class teacher, Spencer Brooks, led a learning-t'filah for parents of the Alef and Bet students. These children prepare to lead Friday night services, and it is important for parents to feel comfortable and informed about the prayers and traditions of Kabbalat Shabbat and the Shabbat service.

Finally, the services that our children lead are truly family education programs. Sharing a Shabbat dinner together as a community and worshipping together while being led by children in the congregation is always a special event. I hope that many of you attend these services in the coming months!






