We will CELEBRATE PURIM Wednesday, February 28th, starting in the evening at 6:15pm. You should wear a costume (I think it's a law); although some of us are always funny, your costume really makes a big, silly difference; it'll make us all smile!

We have to wait the entire month of February for the middle of the Jewish month of Adar to arrive so that we can celebrate the joyous holiday of Purim. With this much notice, we have plenty of time to brush up on the meaning of the holiday and to practice and share new recipes for Hamantashen. Somewhere in this issue of Hakol, you will find an excellent recipe for "Pareve Cinnamon Dulce De Leche Hamantashen." I'm sure that the pastry chefs among you are capable of converting this recipe to dairy, too.

A Message From Rabbi Wolkoff

PURIM IS COMING



Purim is coming, and we are preparing now to read the megillah, the Book of Esther. We all know the story. But we don't know it enough. Beside being a wonderful fable for children, it's also one of the most remarkable analyses of the nature of politics ever written

The villain of the story, Haman, may his name be blotted out, is evil. A genocidal murderer, and we don't have to belabor the point. But Haman is enabled by a buffoon, Ahashverosh. About him, and from him, we can learn a great deal.

First, he is enormously enamored with the raw exercise of power, but he fails miserably at it. The megillah begins with a description of all the "noble" people, with their grandiose titles, rubbing elbows with the king. He is literally "drunk" with power. But pomposity and power are not the same thing. The *megillah* emphasizes that "a decree of the king cannot be overturned." Unfortunately for Ahashverosh (but luckily for us), every single decree he issues is, in fact, overturned.

Second, he is utterly corrupt, a pampered child who loves adulation. He will do whatever you want, as long as you feed his ego. And his wallet (remember how Haman "sweetens the deal" to kill the Jews with 10.000 talents of silver?). Ahashverosh is utterly unprincipled. He stands for nothing except the petty political maneuvering that characterizes the sprawling Persian empire, "from Hodu to Kush—one hundred and twenty provinces"—over which he rules. And it should be recalled that almost without exception, it is Ahashverosh's court officials who make the big decisions, not Ahashverosh himself.

Third, he views people as mere pawns to be manipulated and used. To describe Ahashverosh as self-indulgent would be an understatement.

The great irony of the Book of Esther is that the tables are turned, and just as Haman is hung on the very gallows on which he had hoped to hang Mordechai, so Ahashverosh is made subject to the very woman he sought to subjugate.

Fourth, his leadership style—if you could call it that—is disruptive and demeaning. Asking his wife Vashti to dance (probably naked) before his drunken guests; issuing a ruling that all wives shall respect their husbands (yeah, sure); getting saved by Mordechai but promoting Haman, etc. The empire is continually rocked by crazy decrees coming from the palace.

What are we to make of this bizarre, almost comic, character? On the one hand, we learn that there is no place for fools when real evil is afoot. On the other, that character, and failures of character, really do matter. They shape the practical political climate in which one lives (or, in the case of Haman, dies).

According to the Rabbis, Ahashverosh was not to the manor born. He was a commoner who usurped the throne. He had no business being there. And it showed. His repeated episodes of uncontrollable anger, his inability to reason, his inclination toward drunkenness—all of these underscore how unsuited he was for leadership. At the root of it all was a clear feeling of inferiority, and an equally clear need to compensate for that feeling with grandiose proclamations and lavish displays.

All the above stands in glaring contrast to the virtues of Mordechai and Esther—compassion, self-sacrifice, trustworthiness, caution with words, modesty, devotion.

Not bad for a children's story, eh? When we celebrate Purim together, it is not just an event for the kids. "Pediatric Judaism," as they call it. It is a time for us to think clearly about who and what we are, and what we should aspire to become.

You buy gift cards for the supermarkets you already use - - and B'nai Tikvah gets five cents on the dollar.


Here's how it works:

Pareve Cinnamon Dulce de Leche Hamantashen By Jamie Geller

Ingredients For the dough:

- 1 cup margarine
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 Eggs
- 2 1/2 cup flour
- 2 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 tablespoon cinnamon; dash of salt

For the Dulce De Leche:

- 2 cup nondairy milk of your choice (almond, coconut, soy)
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda

Preparation for the Dough

- 1.Cream margarine and sugar together in a large bowl by hand or with a mixer. Add eggs and mix thoroughly.
- 2. Add flour, baking powder, cinnamon and salt and stir until dough is formed.
- 3. Preheat oven to 375 and prepare baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 4.On a lightly floured surface roll out dough 1/4 inch thick. With a 3 inch cutter (I use a glass) cut out as many holes as possible. Fold up corners to form a triangle, leaving a nice empty hole in the center to fill afterwards.
- 5. Transfer hamantashen to baking sheet, place in the oven and bake for about 20 minutes, until golden brown. Cool and then using a spoon pour in some dulce de leche.

For the Dulce de Leche



Heat milk and sugar in a saucepan over medium heat. Add vanilla and stir until sugar is dissolved. Add baking soda, stir and bring heat down to lowest setting, allowing to cook on a low simmer for about 2 hours, stirring every so often.

Once it turns brown and thickens a bit, strain through a strainer and store in the fridge until ready to use.

2017 NEEDY FAMILY PROGRAM

A FEEL GOOD STORY



We recently completed our 16th successful year helping those in need for the holidays. The Needy Family Program provides the basic things to indigent families we all take for granted: winter coats, boots, clothing, blankets, pillows, dishes, silverware and the list goes on and on.

We sponsored 6 families -29 people - and there were at least 47 B'nai Tikvah families who participated in this mitzvah!

Over the years, an increasing number of congregants committed to this program. A lot of thought and attention went into their purchases. Our congregants were purchasing items as if they were buying for their own parents and children. I often was contacted to request a recipient's personal preferences:

- What were the person's favorite colors?
- What was the race of a child so that they could purchase the appropriate doll
- What size clothing do they need?

People who were asked to donate one item would often throw in items they felt the family may need such as hats and gloves. We took these families on as if they were our own families.

Some of the families we sponsored this year:

A mother and 3 children who left a domestic violence situation. Because of their situation, they left their home quickly, consequently with little clothing and no toys. They lived in a homeless shelter for several months and then were transferred to a hotel where the mother and 3 sons lived in one room for 6 months.

When the social worker brought the clothing, household items and toys to their hotel room, the boys were literally jumping for joy as they now had a few toys to play with. The mother was ecstatic with the household items. One week after our delivery, this family got an apartment and within another week, she got a job. Our gifts got them started on a new life!

One mother burst into tears as she saw a completely filled car and trunk with gifts. She became so overwhelmed that the social worker had to stop bringing up the bags of gifts for a while until the mother calmed down. Last year, she and her children did not celebrate, as they had to use their money for food rather than clothing and a few toys.

Another family, who were victims of the hurricane in Puerto Rico, could not believe the generosity and thoughtfulness of strangers. They were particularly thrilled with the warm clothing as they are not accustomed to cold winters.

The stories go on and on. All these families know these gifts were from Congregation B'nai Tikvah. At a time when kindness and caring for others is at a premium, our community continues to pull together to help those less fortunate. We made a difference in the quality of their lives...from having sheets and blankets at night, to the proper clothing to wear in the cold winters....we made a difference.

I will close with a quote from Doris Cruz, the school social worker who I have been working with since the inception of this program:

"Thanks for building bridges among cultures, religions and socioeconomic status. Your kindness is a gift that will remain with these families forever."


