

From the Desk of Cantor Bruce Rockman

We're going to Israel with Rafi!



I watched and wondered what was happening. I have never seen my son do this. He is in shul every Shabbat, most of his time is spent "exploring" B'nai Tikvah with his buddies. Rafi and Bashe pray daily in school, but this was different. I was blown away. Rafi seemed to be transported.

Teaching our children to become b'nai mitzvah is an awesome responsibility, one which you know that I savor. It is the best time of my working day, every day. Over the past couple of years, the point in time at which I prepared my own children along side yours has been surreal; it also continues to be special and emotional. Teaching the children that my kids are growing up with has heightened my sense of the reality of my mission. Love God, love the Jewish people, and love Israel.

God, the Jewish people, and Israel, as you have followed my journey, are my repeating themes. My efforts at B'nai Tikvah afford me the opportunity to endeavor to fulfill these meaningful objectives; at least that is my intention. And if you follow my thread you know that I often refer to the verse from Pirkei Avot *You are not obliged to finish the task, but neither are you free to desist from it.* Regardless of our accomplishments, our intentions, and their results, we are implored to persist, move forward, to learn more, and to keep our mission relevant.

This month, Rafi will become a bar mitzvah, a special event in our family's life. Rafi is the youngest of his cousins, last to become a b'nai mitzvah. Rafi is great kid; this is something that I often say with conviction about my students, so I think it is okay to say it about my own son too.

When Stacey and I brought Bashe and Rafi to Israel in 2012, we opened a door that Rafi truly yearned to explore. I wrote in Hakol, "*Rafi's moment at the Kotel was what the legendary Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heshel refers to as "Radical Amazement." Pay attention, cherish these exquisite moments, slow down, and you too may become inspired."* And he did and he has remained inspired. My perspective remains that we have built a foundation at B'nai Tikvah that can lead our Jewish community in profound and meaningful ways. We are a social bunch and love to celebrate together and comfort each other during difficult times. We also offer speakers and concerts because we understand that we must participate and understand Judaism outside of our personal comfort zone.

As you know, this summer we are returning to Israel with you. Our multi-generational group of 40 will include four families with children in Bashe's & Rafi's religious school classes and three grandmothers who are going to experience Israel as a family for the first time.

Rafi has paid attention. He still takes his time to hang out with his buddies in shul, especially Corey, but mostly, he embraces his passion for his connection with God, his B'nai Tikvah, Hatikvah, Kadima, & Ramah friends, his Jewish people. Israel will always be Rafi's yearning and it is our desire and responsibility to nurture our children.

Dear God, Draw us Closer

Help us convert our convictions into conduct and our commitments into deeds.

Help us to narrow the gap between our principles and our practices, between our aspirations and our actions.

A Message From Rabbi Wolkoff

Shavuot duties of the heart



We find ourselves now at that time of year when we count the omer, marking the days from Passover -- the time of our political liberation from Egypt -- to Shavuot, the time of our spiritual liberation at Mt. Sinai. The Torah, in its wisdom, institutionalized the link. It underscored that political liberation, however important, is incomplete without the accompanying spiritual liberation. In addition, counting the days brings with it a sense of anticipation, a rising excitement about the gift of Torah we receive(d) on Shavuot.

What, exactly, does spiritual liberation mean? Considering how important the Torah tells us it is, you would think that the answer would be obvious to us all. But obvious it is not. There is a reason for our lack of clarity on this point,. It goes back to a pernicious misreading of Judaism that a generation ago was widely preached from the pulpits, taught in the classrooms, and shared around the dinner table. The slogan of the time was "Judaism doesn't care about what you believe. It cares about what you do."

This was an incredibly useful (and, truth be told, smug) fantasy. It dodged all the tricky questions about G-d that might arise after, say, the Holocaust. It gave us a leg up on our Christian neighbors who believed all sorts of "crazy" things such as virgin birth (as if we didn't believe anything "crazy," such as G-d parting the Red Sea). And it was pretty easy to align Jewish ethical practice (say, the 10 Commandments), with American values—and in the 1950's, what could possibly be more important than that?

A Judaism that looked like the Boy Scouts with holidays was the ticket of admission to American society.

But an enormous amount was lost in the process. Not least, any sense of spiritual quest, of searching, of dynamism. This was a Judaism without soul, and that's no Judaism at all.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once wrote that "Jewish observance may be divided into two classes: into duties that call for both external performance and an act of the soul, and into duties that call only for an act of the soul. Thus the mind and the heart are never exempted from being engaged in the service of G-d." And he goes on to point out that in Judaism there are far more mitzvot that are exclusively duties of the heart than there are mitzvot that also have an external component.

For some of us, we had the privilege of sharing a 3rd Seder with our CBT friends. This evening of fun enabled us to share some of the lighter aspects of the Seder with each other...and not having to do the dishes! When you see the announcement for next year's 3rd Seder, think about joining in!

For those of you who were at the synagogue on Sunday, April 8th, you all had a rare treat as we had our own version of "92nd St. Y" when Mayor Brad Cohen interviewed his father-in-law, Mike Jucowics. Mike was born in 1925 and, at the age of 93, shared with us his wit and humor as he told his personal story of life before, during, and after the Holocaust. Those of us in attendance heard, in his own words, what life was like in Hungary before the war, what the transport to Auschwitz was like, and how, after liberation, he returned to his home to find his family. It was a rare opportunity and created a shared memory for all in attendance.

Throughout the month of April, there were other key events as the synagogue participated in many programs to celebrate the 70th Anniversary of the State of Israel. It is important, as we look to this month and the months ahead, to continue to "keep the building abuzz" and to build community memories. To do this, we need to ensure there are activities that interest you. As we begin our planning for 2018-19, what are the programs that you would like us to do (or do more of)? These can be "in" or "out"....but what they need to do is to build the connections of community. Alef Consecration

On Friday, April 20th this year's Alef (3rd grade) class celebrated its Consecration. The focus of CBT's Consecration is that building the "Crown of a Good Name" for oneself is an important Jewish value.

The Consecration process began before Pesach with a special family class session. During that session, the Alef students learned about their Hebrew names and who they were named after. Each student created a Hebrew name keychain and a book cover for their new Siddur.

At their Friday night Consecration, each student led part of the service, read a short essay about their Hebrew name, was presented with a Siddur Sim Shalom, and was blessed by their parent(s). It was a moving Jewish experience and a meaningful night for all.

Bet Class Service

The Bet (4th grade) Class and their families gathered on Friday night, April 27th, for Shabbat dinner and for services. The Bet students led the service flawlessly, showing off their increased knowledge of both the Hebrew language and Tefillot -- Prayer (you should hear their Lecha Dodi!). They know how to pray with *keva* – the outward mechanics of prayer and *kavannah* – the inner intentionality and spirituality that each of us brings to *t'filah*. The friendships and mutual respect these children share are evident. It all makes for a joyous and meaningful worship experience.

Shorashim (2nd Grade) Learn About Israel

For their final unit of the school year, our second graders have been learning all about Israel. They began with the children sharing what they know; even before they began the unit the students were able to identify two cities in Israel (Jerusalem and Tel Aviv), talk about the "very salty" sea, describe the fact that there "are a lot of Jews" living there, and remember that we face Jerusalem when we pray.

After sharing what they already knew the students jumped into the unit which, as usual at this age, is made up of short lessons and projects. Their big project was a giant Israeli flag, decorated with tissue paper, which you can find hanging in the Religious School hallway.

Moving-Up Ceremony

On Sunday, May 20th, we will hold a special Religious School Moving-Up Ceremony, as part of CBT's celebration of the Shavuot holiday. We hope that all of our parents and students will join us for this very special occasion. The final session of Religious School for this school year will then take place on Wednesday, May 23rd.

School Opens September 5th


We are already hard at work getting ready for the 2018-2019 school year. Spaces are still available in all three of our class levels:

The JCC ECC offers discounts for children and grandchildren of CBT members.


