From the Desk of Cantor Bruce Rockman

We Pray for the Wellbeing of Jerusalem



In just a few weeks we will be in Israel. We, my immediate family and 33 members of our B'nai Tikvah family, will be visiting our homeland and experiencing our heritage throughout Israel, our promised land. A trip such as this takes my breath away; it is so exciting to anticipate the experiences and bonds we will create in Israel. I'll do my best to keep you informed via our Israel Travel blog.

On May 14th, 2018, with great fanfare and consternation, the United States dedicated our new embassy in Jerusalem. There are certain truths that we adhere to: Jerusalem, the city of peace, is the capitol of Israel; it has always been, and it will endure as the seat of the government of the modern State of Israel. Even though this was a controversial decision for some, Israel will continue to thrive. I believe that the world will learn to embrace this reality.

With my liberal orientation, I felt a great deal of concern about the reaction by the liberal community to Israel's and President Trump's reiterating and bravely implementing the official position of the United States, of many liberal Democratic presidents—including President Clinton and President Obama—not to mention Congress. I'm confident in the future of Israel.

As a bleeding heart liberal, I know there are victims of this decision. I grieve for the Palestinian people, I pray for a time when there is no war, especially among the children of Abraham. One question is who and what is prompting the violence in Gaza. If it is the presence of the Jewish people in Israel, then we are guilty, and will gladly remain guilty of trying to live in peace, thriving

while dealing with great hardship, as a light among nations. There are political solutions. I'm hopeful that some day soon the Palestinian leadership in Gaza will choose the path of peace over disruption and war.

The Palestinian campaign to delegitimize our rightful place in Israel is insidious; it turns liberals into self-doubters, equivocators. Jerusalem is neither a liberal nor conservative issue. The deepest instincts of the Jewish people are admired and emulated worldwide. Our support for human rights, repairing the world, and loving-kindness emanate from the relationship that our ever-loving and caring God established with Abraham and with the mitzvot described in our Torah.

As we walk in the footsteps of our ancestors, visiting holy places and learning about the hardship and ingenuity that has reenergized the land and our people, we will be steadfast in love and support of Israel, the dream, the land, and the promise.

A Message From Rabbi Wolkoff

Changing the World



Margaret Mead, the great anthropologist, once said, *“Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has.”*

As Jews, we should know this. If anybody ever changed the world, it's our exceedingly wonderful and exceedingly wacky tribe. But we often don't think about it. In fact, it's hard to imagine a greater contrast than that between the popular view of Judaism—lots of food, good jokes, Yiddish nostalgia, the New York Times, and counting Jewish Nobel Prize winners—and what Judaism really is: a G-d driven mission to create an extraordinary and life-transforming society on earth, one that can be an example to all people.

To accomplish a mission such as that (as opposed to just eating lox and bagels) requires an enormous amount of dedication and devotion. And I'm happy to say that there is an overabundance of such dedication and devotion here at CBT. In fact, to say that our congregation punches above its weight would be an understatement. At the risk of unintentionally omitting someone, just consider this:

- CBT's Teresa Samtur just became President of the Garden State Region of Women's League for Conservative Judaism.
- CBT's immediate past co-president, Ruth Anne Koenick, was the featured speaker at the regional installation. She spoke on the #MeToo movement and the Jewish community. I'm hoping Ruth Anne will repeat her lecture here at CBT. No doubt, we'll all learn a lot.

They join:

- CBT's Jeff Schwartz, our past president, who serves as president of the Jewish Federation in the Heart of New Jersey (which, with 120,000 Jews, makes it one of the largest Federations in the country). He follows in the footsteps of Federation's past presidents CBT's Arlene and Mitch Frumkin (respectively, first lady and past president of CBT.)
- CBT's Adrienne Ross, our current president and chair of the all-important Allocations Committee of the Federation.
- CBT's Naomi Vilko, who recently had the privilege of introducing the main speaker at the CAMERA gala in New York.
- CBT's Allison Nagelberg, our immediate past co-president, who would have attended the CAMERA gala, but was instead attending the national board meeting of AIPAC, on which she serves.

There is much written in the Jewish world today about 'engagement.' Everyone asks how we can strengthen our communities and increase connections amongst our constituents. As I complete my first year of Presidency of Congregation B'nai Tikvah, I ask myself: "What have we, as a leadership, done to improve engagement?"

This past year, we celebrated our 40th Anniversary. As everyone knows, we had more than 150 people at a brunch in January and continued the celebration with more than 200 people at our Gala. These were both great opportunities to spend time with B'nai Tikvah friends.

We also identified an opportunity, bringing "CBT" to a community with our "study and schmooze" sessions in Monroe. Both of these were highly touted by the attendees as successful...with the question "When is the next one?" We are committed to continuing this experiment...including the "Empty Nester" dinner on June 1st.

This year, almost 20% of our membership participated in the "Adopt a Family" program under the leadership of Janice Baer. The appreciation of the families for some of the most basic needs during the holidays (i.e. coats, socks, mittens) was heartfelt. We also had a successful Chesed for Chanukah program where we took baked goods on Christmas to those who serve our community every day. As we look to the coming year, I have to ask, can we do more?

This past year, we also have further increased our partnership with The Jewish Federation in the Heart of New Jersey. Our partnership goes beyond the Life and Legacy Program (thank you, Keith and Tammy Zimmerman); we also supported our Machena Yehuda and held a 70th Anniversary Celebration for Israel at CBT. Next year, we will further this partnership through a collaboration with "Shinshinim." The Shinshinim program will bring a "gap year" Israeli to our community in order to share Israeli culture, news, and experiences with all of us. If you would like to help with the program or have ideas for this young woman's participation, please let me know.

So, as I close out my first year as your President, I feel like much has been accomplished...but there is still much to be done. I encourage you to share your ideas on how we can strengthen the community and the bonds among us. I'm only a phone call (or email!) away.

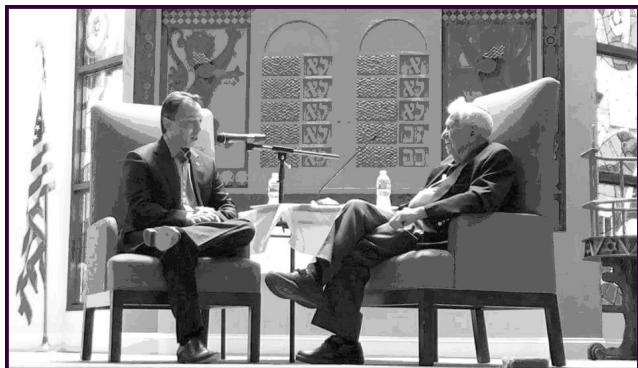

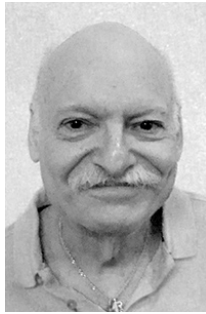

Shalom... Thoughts from a B'nai Tikvah congregant

As I sit down to pen this article, Shavuot is yet to occur, but due to the magic of “time marching on”, as you read this article, it will have passed. If you would please indulge me, I would like to share some of my thoughts about this holiday. Torah calls Shavuot “Yom HaBikkurim” – The Day of the First Fruits, because farmers would bring the first of their harvest to Jerusalem as a token of thanksgiving to G-d. As you know, Shavuot also commemorates the anniversary of the giving of the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai, having another name, Zman Mattan Torah.

When Israel was to receive the Torah at Mount Sinai, G-d commanded the people to observe a three day period of intense preparation known as Shalosh Y'may Hagbalah... three days of deliberation and preparation for the revealing of the Torah. These three days have gained significance because they interrupt the mourning period of Seifrat HaOmer. They introduce a joyous spirit and a festive atmosphere when marriages may be performed and celebrations held.

The bikkurim ritual represents a pertinent moral lesson: the acknowledgment that one's accomplishments and success depend on factors beyond one's control. The farmer gave thanks to G-d for a bountiful harvest. We, too, should recognize the good fortune in our lives and demonstrate our gratefulness, not only on Shavuot, but throughout the year, as well. Many traditional Shavuot customs stem from legends describing the experience at Sinai. For instance, according to tradition, on the morning of the first Shavuot, when G-d would declare the Ten Commandments to the people, the Children of Israel overslept! To compensate for their negligence, Jews all over the world have adopted a vigil on Shavuot eve. From dusk to dawn they remain awake, occupying themselves with the study of Torah and Talmud. A digest has evolved, called Tikkun L'eil Shavuot, or the “Restoration of Shavuot Eve”.

Let's hope our acknowledgment of our good fortunes, whether health, wealth or peace of mind, will have the power to evoke memories and associations and grant us the ability to inspire and lift us to great heights – as high as Mount Sinai itself!

From our home to yours, have a healthy and enjoyable summer. Rejuvenate and come back in the fall, ready for the High Holy Days (the week after Labor Day), and the plethora of activities slated for the coming year.
