A Message From Rabbi Robert Wolkoff

"Fasten your seatbelts. It's going to be a bumpy night." Betty Davis, in All About Eve



The High Holy Days will begin soon and, this year, all of my sermons are linked to a common theme: truth. I feel that in many ways, we find ourselves in a truth-crisis, and this is a matter that simply has to be addressed.

As a Jew who is familiar with our sacred texts, I find talking about "the" truth a little bit odd. If there is anything that our tradition teaches, it is that we must respect a multiplicity of beliefs. Many of the Bible's most famous passages involve arguments and differing perspectives. Virtually every page of Talmud has Rabbi X saying one thing and Rabbi Y saying the opposite. One of the most common phrases in the midrashic interpretations of the Torah is "davar acher," meaning, "Here's another take on the same verse...," a take that may contradict the previous view, or go off in another direction altogether.

So the idea that there are alternative interpretations of the facts is about as built into Judaism as the idea that pig isn't kosher. But note: we're talking about alternative interpretations, not alternative facts. As one of my heroes, Daniel Patrick Moynihan, once said, "Everyone is entitled to his own opinion, but not his own facts."

And unfortunately, tragically, dangerously, there are altogether too many "own facts" in circulation right now. They impact every aspect of our lives, and not for the good. Unless we do something about it, we, as individuals, as Americans, and as Jews, will pay a high price. So I will be talking truth on these High Holy Days, and, as they say in the South, I'm gonna testify. Like Betty Davis advised, we'll all need to fasten our seat belts.

Trust me.

On the first day of Rosh Hashanah, I will be speaking on "The Assault on Truth." The second day of Rosh Hashanah, the topic will be "The Truth about America." On Kol Nidrei, the theme is "The Truth about Israel." And finally, for Yizkor, I will address "The Truth about Us."

21 Elul 5778 - 21 Tishrei 5779

Honestly speaking, I am deeply concerned about these sermons and the impact they will have. They will be forceful, provocative, and some might say incendiary. Although they will not be partisan, they will certainly be political, because they have to be.

The political issues in our country and in the world are the 800-pound gorilla in the room. I would be doing the congregation a disservice to ignore them. And not only the congregation. We read in Psalms that our G-d is "the G-d of truth." (Ps 31:5)

On Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, we seek to reconcile ourselves with the G-d from whom we have strayed in the past year (and in years past). We will not get very far on our journey if the road we travel is paved with falsehood

Getting off that road will make for one bumpy night, but I pray that taking another look at the roadmap and correcting our course will bring us to smoother paths as the sun rises on the new year.

May it be one of blessing for us all. With love,

My Greatest Reward



Week after week, walking home from Shabbat services with Gordon Heit, I would express my excitement about our "trip of a lifetime" to Israel. Gordon would smile and I'd go on and on expressing my excitement. About a week ago I said to Gordon, it really was a "trip of a Lifetime," one of the most memorable and special experiences of my life. Gordon smiled and responded, "Yes it was."

As you know, at every opportunity, I extol the virtues of Israel and traveling to our spiritual, emotional, and ancestral homeland. All Jewish people, regardless of our practice, hold Israel as our common bond. Experiencing Israel with my congregational family along with my family, was off the charts amazing. All of my visits to Israel have been special; the mission was often different. Last year Stacey and I traveled in the winter in order to recharge our spirits. We've been blessed to introduce Israel to our children, Bashe and Rafi, at an early age, thus informing their souls, creating memories of a lifetime. I started visiting Israel 36 years ago while my sister Pamela was a student at Bat Ilan University and, later, I had the opportunity to learn at the Conservative Yeshiya in Jerusalem

What was so special about this trip? We were 38 people on a big orange bus; from ages 8-77, together we learned about, explored and experienced Israel.

We rode donkeys and horses, rafted on the Jordan River, rode the rocky terrain in jeeps on the Golan Heights, picked 700 pounds of tomatoes (performing the mitzvah of gleaning the fields of leftovers) which later were donated to the needy. We floated in the Dead Sea, toured Masada, experienced an archeological dig, visited historic and biblical sights. We walked on dirt and sand, climbed rocks, waded through water in the Western Wall Tunnels and, therefore, we were able to eat a lot of delicious Israeli food.

The culmination of our tour was our emotional Bar Mitzvah service at Robinson's Arch, the egalitarian prayer area adjacent to the Kotel. All 38 of our B'nai Tikvah family, friends and our tour guide celebrated the affirmation of our B'nai Mitzvah boys; Michael, Rafi, Liam, and Jacob all received alliyot, chanted from the Torah, and then we all danced and wished each other a hearty mazel tov!

Watching each individual's excitement throughout the trip was my greatest reward. Stacey planned this remarkable trip; my role was to be me, to be present and available; this experience alone filled me with joy. Knowing that our community was growing closer and increasing our connection to Israel and our Jewish heritage was simply exciting.

We all came back to New Jersey with the promise to return home, to Israel as soon as possible. Stacey and I will be planning our next congregational Israeli excursion for the summer of 2021. We really hope that you will join us.

We hope you will join us at events, be part of our activities, and be part of our growing membership. If you are interested in joining a committee or helping with an event, please contact us.


