## Our Recent Trip to Israel

Every trip I have taken to Israel has been different. I have had the privilege of being a part of our country a dozen times. I have been fortunate enough to be here for a semester in high school, for a year after college and to come with my family. I have Stacey Rockman come here to see friends get married, I got my first sunburn in Israel and I even had my first kiss here. Israel has been a huge part of my life for so very long!

For nearly a decade, I have wanted to help lead a group to Israel. This year that dream became a reality. Thirty eight people, spanning close to 70 years in age, came with my family to my favorite place. In helping to design the trip, I wanted to see a lot, get a feel for the county, and to spark an interest in people returning.

Designing the itinerary was easy. I wanted a top-to-bottom tour to see the beauty of the north, the history of Masada, the vibrancy of Tel Aviv, and the old and modern of Jerusalem. As it turned out, we did many things I had never done before.

I asked a list of people if we overdid things. We went to close to three sites or activities each day and sometimes more. We hiked shopped swam and sweated. We drank gallons of water to avoid dehydration. We did fun things like rafting in the Jordan and serious things like going to Yad Vashem. We learned history and current events. We laughed together cried together and ate too much food together. It is hard to quantify what we did.

It is hard to say what the exact highlights were. What was my favorite thing versus what spoke to someone else is the same and yet totally different When I think about what my favorite was- it actually was seeing my country through everyone else's eyes I have not been a newcomer to Israel in over 35 years. Watching someone touch the kotel for the first time and burst into tears. Holding hands as we walked through the shuk. Learning History together and understanding real politics and boarder struggles.

Understanding that Israel is not a religious country and yet being in the majority and not the minority was mind blowing
