## From the Desk of Cantor Bruce Rockman

A few weeks ago, on the Friday before Rosh Hashanah, as I dressed for Shabbat, I was watching Friday night services from Central Synagogue in New York on the Jewish Broadcasting System (JBS). I love the grandeur and beautiful singing of their rabbis and cantors. Some of their melodies are the same as ours; their “sound” is truly inspiring, there are times that I’m still hearing the Central clergy and their musicians as I lead our service.

Now as Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Sh’mini Atzeret, and Simchat Torah have joyously concluded, it becomes the time in which we move beyond our resolutions and intentions and embrace the challenges that we proclaimed to be better prepared to fulfill.

### Our Recent Trip to Israel



Every trip I have taken to Israel has been different. I have had the privilege of being a part of our country a dozen times. I have been fortunate enough to be here for a semester in high school, for a year after college and to come with my family. I have Stacey Rockman come here to see friends get married, I got my first sunburn in Israel and I even had my first kiss here. Israel has been a huge part of my life for so very long!

For nearly a decade, I have wanted to help lead a group to Israel. This year that dream became a reality. Thirty eight people, spanning close to 70 years in age, came with my family to my favorite place. In helping to design the trip, I wanted to see a lot, get a feel for the county, and to spark an interest in people returning.

Designing the itinerary was easy. I wanted a top-to-bottom tour to see the beauty of the north, the history of Masada, the vibrancy of Tel Aviv, and the old and modern of Jerusalem. As it turned out, we did many things I had never done before.

I asked a list of people if we overdid things. We went to close to three sites or activities each day and sometimes more. We hiked shopped swam and sweated. We drank gallons of water to avoid dehydration. We did fun things like rafting in the Jordan and serious things like going to Yad Vashem. We learned history and current events. We laughed together cried together and ate too much food together. It is hard to quantify what we did.

It is hard to say what the exact highlights were. What was my favorite thing versus what spoke to someone else is the same and yet totally different. When I think about what my favorite was- it actually was seeing my country through everyone else’s eyes. I have not been a newcomer to Israel in over 35 years. Watching someone touch the kotel for the first time and burst into tears. Holding hands as we walked through the shuk. Learning History together and understanding real politics and boarder struggles.

Understanding that Israel is not a religious country and yet being in the majority and not the minority was mind blowing

### Why we run this program?

The following is an excerpt of one of the thank you notes we received on behalf of a family we sponsored: "This family has never experienced such generosity. They felt overjoyed and emotional upon receiving the gifts. The mother told me she was happy to see that her children finally have toys to play with so they are no longer bored at home. The teachers were commenting that they noticed the children's self esteem improve when they came to school proudly dressed in their new clothes. The children are now appropriately dressed for the weather and are even wearing socks which were noticeably missing prior to receiving the gifts. They sleep much more comfortably at night with their new blankets and their heater....."

### Who are these families?

These families are all in need. They are referred by various sources including Jewish Family Services and school social workers.

### How does this program work?

Each family will fill out a wish list of their needs. The wish lists typically include items like towels, sheets, blankets, clothing, shoes, coats and children's toys.
