From Rabbi Robert L. Wolkoff



A few weeks ago, we hosted the USY regional convention. It was an exhilarating and exhausting experience. The children led our Shabbat services, and did so beautifully.

And therein lies a tale. An objective observer of the services would have noticed that the kids talked. A lot.

And the observer would have also noticed that there was an ongoing, and only partially successful, attempt to quiet the kids down. Sometimes, shame was involved. “The congregation has allowed us into their sanctuary. We need to respect it...” Other times, the children were enticed. “Look carefully at this prayer. If you think about it deeply, it will speak to you in unexpected ways.” Sometimes it was more of a command: “USY, quiet down.” Sometimes the leaders appealed to chapter leaders for some good old peer pressure.

Everything worked, until it didn’t.

And at the end of the day, basing himself on the exact same facts, the objective observer could give two entirely different assessments. The first would go like this: The kids were very unruly. They lacked decorum. They made it hard to concentrate on the prayers. This was not the way a service is supposed to go. Very unsatisfying.

The second would go like this. Imagine a couple of hundred Jewish kids who haven’t seen each other for months, put together in the same room for a few hours. The conversations would be endless. But just consider that these same kids interrupted their conversations repeatedly to listen to Torah discussions, to pray, to sing and dance, to celebrate the Jewish tradition. All without a smartphone in their hands!

It was amazing!

Same events, same facts, two entirely different takes. The funny thing is that we can extrapolate from the USY convention to say something significant about our own lives.

Looked at from some abstract standard, say, the 613 commandments, our lives are a mess. There’s so much we don’t know, and even of what we know, there’s so much we don’t do. Objectively speaking, we are on the wrong end of the bell curve. Very unsatisfying.

On the other hand, consider how insanely busy our lives are, how demanding our responsibilities, how exhausting our jobs, and all the rest. The idea of devoting ourselves to things spiritual sounds crazy. But look at how much we do. We go to services. We enrich ourselves with reading and study. We help our friends in need. We support great causes [like our upcoming JNF brunch, hint, hint]. We join organizations that have, at their core, a dedication to the best values we share. It’s just amazing.

You know the old expression about the optimist seeing the glass as half full, the pessimist seeing it as half empty. My wife the engineer asks, “Why are you using that size glass?” We don’t have to sit in judgment about how good or bad our Jewish lives are by some abstract standard. Instead, we just have to live our lives—with joy and depth, with celebration and awareness, with Torah and more Torah. Just like the USY-ers. All the rest will follow. What is meant to happen will happen.

With wishes for a joyous Purim, the holiday when *anything*, even the most unexpected, can happen,

Life's Secret



In the American Classic movie, “City Slickers”, Curly (Jack Palance) was teaching Mitch (Billy Crystal) the secret of life.

Curly: Do you know what the secret of life is? *[holds up one finger]* This.

Mitch : Your finger?

Curly : One thing. Just one thing. You stick to that and the rest don't mean s#*t.

Mitch : But, what is the "one thing"?

Curly : *[smiles]* That's what YOU have to find out.

What Curly tried to teach all of us is that the secret of life is relationships. If we all have human connections, relationships, we lead happier, healthier lives. Curly wasn't wrong about the importance of relationships. There is a growing body of literature and scientific papers that demonstrate that people who are more deeply involved in religion tend to enjoy better physical and mental health than individuals who are less involved in religion. It is important to take a deeper look at these studies and determine the “one thing” we can learn from this.

Clearly, belonging to a synagogue provides everyone an opportunity to be “connected,” but does it guarantee a relationship? Is the synagogue a building/community that is only there when you need it, or do you realize that it also needs you? What is the opportunity we have to deepen our relationships with Congregation B'nai Tikvah and the many families that are part of our kehillah.

This year, we instituted Shabbat Greeters. First of all, I want to thank the many people who have volunteered to date. The most important thing I hear from this initiative is that the greeters are getting back as much as they are giving. A warm greeting at the door makes the congregant feel welcome but—equally important—is the reward to the greeter. Based on our experiences, we are looking to have a “greeter” available on Sunday mornings when there is an event in the building. Someone who can help let people know we are the warm and welcoming kehillah that we profess to be. If you have some time to spare, consider volunteering (for Shabbat or a Sunday). Who knows, you might make a new friend!

There are a group of members who have been working diligently to share their version of the “Greatest Show on Earth” and recreate the Purim story. While I am sure they are thoroughly enjoying their time together in rehearsal, think about sharing with them the output of their efforts by joining in the Megillah reading. Purim is not just for kids! Rekindle friendships and memories by participating in Purim celebrations.

At the end of this month, on March 30th, we have the opportunity to strengthen our relationships with each other and celebrate Rabbi Wolkoff's 40th year of spiritual guidance. As he would say, without Ruth-Ann at his side, his success would not be as great. Celebrating together and honoring Rabbi and Ruth-Ann strengthens our relationships to each other and the bonds of memory. Who knows, you might even see some interesting worm dancing!

The secret of life is human connection. Human connection requires investment but the returns are significant. Invest some time in building your relationship with your fellow congregants...you never know how great the dividends could be.

The Lone Soldier Center

Please join my husband, Steve, and me on Thursday evening, May 30th at 8PM, to hear about something that is very close to my heart, the Lone Soldier Center, whose services both our sons, Adam and Jesse, benefited from when they were serving as lone soldiers in the IDF. Many people are not aware that we at B'nai Tikvah have former, current, and soon-to-be lone soldiers as members of our congregation.

The transition from being a civilian to becoming a soldier is not easy. The challenges of the military are intense, and those challenges multiply when the transition is within another culture and country, and the soldier's support system of family and friends is thousands of miles away. Adding to that, lone soldiers often have to improve their Hebrew skills or learn Hebrew from the basic aleph bet, and do so well enough to navigate critical military communication, and daily societal needs such as laundry, housing, transportation, and food. I can remember a few great stories about Adam and Jesse's misinterpretations of what they thought their officers were saying during their early days in basic training!

When I was in Israel for college, I had two friends from high school who were "lone soldiers" in the IDF, except back then there was no real term for these "crazy" volunteers. They had no resources or guidance to help them deal with the many difficult issues they encountered. How fortunate for my boys and others that the Lone Soldier Center now exists to help make their transition more comfortable and to comfort their parents by knowing that their children have somewhere to turn to for support.

The Lone Soldier Center was founded in memory of Michael Levin z"l, a formerly active USYer and an American-born lone soldier, who fell fighting in the Second Lebanon War in 2006. Michael's passion for the State of Israel led him on a path to

defend the country and, unfortunately, he gave his life protecting Israel. Harriet Levin, Michael's mother, will be coming to Congregation B'nai Tikvah to speak about how her son's death in the Lebanon War was not in vain, and also about the formation of the Lone Soldier Center. Come hear her inspiring story and learn how we can support other Lone Soldiers' passion to defend the State of Israel as the Jewish Homeland.

The Lone Soldier Center was created in 2009 by a group of Michael's friends, former lone soldiers, following through on a dream of Michael's - to create a body to assist, feed, connect and care for lone soldiers in the IDF. Today they are making his dream a reality; the Lone Soldier Center provides lone soldiers with meals, support, advice, housing and the family and community they are missing.

There are currently over 7,000 lone soldiers from around the world serving in the IDF. Three groups of young people are classified as lone soldiers by the State of Israel: new immigrants from abroad, Mahal volunteers (Jewish youth who volunteer for IDF duty for 18 months), and Israeli-born lone soldiers mostly from broken homes or Ultra-Orthodox backgrounds who have no family or have been disowned. While their fellow soldiers can rely on loving parents to house them, provide meals, do laundry, help with finances, and just as crucially, provide for the emotional needs of the young men and women tasked with defending the state, no such resources existed for lone soldiers. The Lone Soldier Center's staff and hundreds of volunteers work very hard to build this family and provide for many of the basic off-base needs of lone soldiers. They do this to ensure that these soldiers will be included, supported and successful in adjusting to life in Israel.

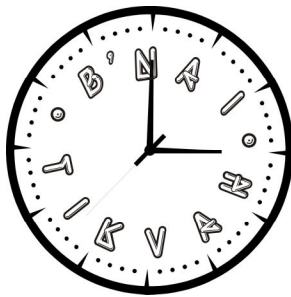

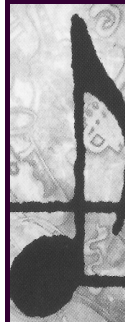
