A Message From Rabbi Robert L. Wolkoff

Think Beyond Today



Writing for the summer edition of Hakol is different from writing for other editions. Normally, I think about the issues of the day and look to see what Jewish wisdom could be brought to bear on them. And certainly, today, we could use a lot of wisdom. Trade war with China; potential shooting war with Iran; a debate about whether we are in a constitutional crisis or merely a constitutional confrontation (I prefer the phrase constitutional catastrophe, but maybe that's just me); anti-abortion/anti-women laws being passed in state after state by a bunch of old white guys; and even the silly Eurovision contest being threatened by Hamas rockets.

And then there's always Rashida Tlaib and Ilhan Omar, may G-d enlighten them, who really, really, really aren't anti-Semitic but just sound that way.

Uh-huh.

We are experiencing the Chinese curse of living in interesting times.

If I were writing at any other moment, I would probably respond to one or another of these issues. But knowing that there will be a several-month-long hiatus before my next article, I think a different approach is in order. After all, three months from now there will be an entirely different news cycle, and something completely different to kyetch about.

So I would like to offer a thought this month that is more enduring. Think about it: we will be reading this message before summer actually begins, at the height of spring; and the next Hakol will be announcing the High Holy Days. They're late this year. (Jewish holidays are never on time; they're always early or late.) So I think it's fitting to talk about the flow of time, and the change of the seasons, and how our lives fit into the bigger picture,

rather than the 24-hour news cycle.

It's a lesson my father and teacher (may his memory be a blessing) taught me. Outside my hometown, there's a beautiful reservoir, surrounded by rich forests. A fivemile path goes around the lake, and my father used to walk it virtually every day. He was fascinated by the flow of the seasons and, in particular, the wisdom of the Canada geese that would fly north or south, in their well-choreographed chevrons, for their annual migration. (This was obviously before the time they all decided to move to New Jersey.) And wherever my sister or I were in the world (and we were all over the place), Dad would dutifully observe that he saw the geese flying north or south, as the case may be, and was fascinated by it. His message to us—indeed, his gift to us—was the knowledge that the world was, in a fundamental sense, as it should be. The cycles of nature overwhelmed the daily vagaries of the human condition. His was a reminder to us that the essence of who we are lives on, as a part of this world that G-d created, and saw that it was not just good, but indeed very good—in spite of all the meshugas that we can read about in the daily newspaper.

What matters, endures. And, to this day, when my children hear the geese honking overhead, they respond with, "Hello, Grampa Myron!"

So let us not be distracted by the news pollution, at least for a few moments. Let us instead think about the sun playing on the leaves, the mysteries of the forest, the songs of the birds, the bushy tails of squirrels, and the comfort of warm breezes. Let us think of those who are with us, and those who, while gone, are with us still.

And the preciousness of it all. Thank G-d.

I suppose this is why, no matter the challenge, I believe that I can make it work.

When I was asked to lead our Religious School, I felt that I would be able to handle it, but it did take some time for me to embrace my new task. My dad helped to convince me that I would be able to handle it; he knew that the challenge was good for me and for my family. He also knew that our relationship would be impacted; he tried to assure me that I was making the proper decision.

My parents, Cantor Royal (Yisrael Zundle) & Bernice (Bashe) Rockman z"l always encouraged me to be kind and magnanimous, gentle and caring, loving and forever growing. Thank you mom and dad; may your memory continue to be a blessing and inspiration. I always will remember you and honor your good names.

Reflecting on the Year



It is hard to believe that this is my last Hakol column as your President. As I reflect on the past two years, it has been my privilege to serve as your leader of this Congregation. You truly enabled me to live the words I spoke last year on Yom Kippur, "It is not your responsibility to *finish* the *work* of perfecting the world, but you are not free to *desist from it* either."

While sometimes progress seems slow, we have made significant progress together. I must thank the amazing group of volunteers known as "the Board," who give tirelessly of their time to make our community a better place and, with that, contribute to a better world. I also need to recognize some of our Committees and the Chairs who ensure that B'nai Tikvah is a leader within the community. I know that none of you do this for public recognition and thus I will not "name names"...but you know I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

During the past two years we have signed multiple contracts that will strengthen our Congregation and prepare us for the future: re-negotiation of the Rabbi, Cantor (and Cantor/Education Director), Caterer and Chabad School contracts. While we unfortunately had to close the Early Childhood Center, this was done to strengthen our future as we were no longer serving a Jewish Community. Establishment of an Endowment Fund and ongoing partnership with the Federation and its Life and Legacy program have the potential to provide ongoing funds. All of these, together, are helping to secure our future as a vibrant community. The final step in securing our financial future is the "burn the mortgage campaign" that I discussed in last month's Hakol.

When I started my tenure, I hoped to strengthen our community and acknowledge the changing needs of our Congregation. While we still have the need and responsibility to educate the next generation, it is equally important to identify ways to engage the hearts and minds of our "empty nesters." Working closely with the Rabbi, we initiated our Monroe Township educational series. It became so popular that we moved from "home space" to partnering with Jewish Family Services. As we look to next year, we may need an even larger space to enable more to join in the active conversations.

Through Bobbi Binder's leadership, we transitioned "Family Shabbat" to "Shabbat Together," bringing all generations of our Congregation together for Shabbat dinner on a monthly/bi-monthly basis. It is my hope that we continue this program in the years to come.

Through the leadership of Jeff Schwartz and the incredible generosity of our Shomrei Tikvah donors, we have a new Beit Midrash and new sidewalks. This work would not have been possible without the necessary funds and the incredible hours of Charley Valan who served as our "internal foreman" to make sure we were creating the warm and welcoming Beit Midrash and can enter the building safely without navigating crumbling walkways.

Our fundraising efforts this year achieved new heights. Joe Plotnick and his incredible committee sought to create a community event that would honor our Rabbi and Ruth-Ann, ensure an evening of enjoyment, and also achieve our fundraising goals. For all those who were in attendance, they would join me in saying, "job well done, goals achieved."

Over the past couple of years, our concern about security is an evolving world of hate and anti-Semitism also has been raised. While we were fortunate to receive a Homeland Security Grant to improve the security of the building (and have already started to utilize the funds), we also have been faced with how to improve Security on a weekly/daily basis on a large campus that must remain "open" to all in the Community who want to pray. The silver lining to this need has been the institution of Shabbat Greeters. I thank all those who have volunteered this past year to ensure that our doors and our hearts are open to those who want to pray. As we continue our dialogue with the North Brunswick police, we are examining additional initiatives for those occasions when we have multiple guests in the building (special events, B'nai Mitzvah, etc.).

In closing, I reflect on the teachings of Pirkei Avot, "it was not my responsibility to complete work, but neither could I walk away." I have been honored and privileged to be your President and work together with so many of you on making the world a better place. I hope to continue to join with all of you in the future and continue to grow the vibrancy of our community, Congregation B'nai Tikvah.

HOUSE & GROUNDS

We have been making great progress in improvements on the building here at B'nai Tikvah. I want to update everyone on two levels: security of the building and capital improvements.

As we have made our congregants aware, last year B'nai Tikvah successfully secured a substantial grant from Homeland Security. This allows us to improve many features of the building and grounds and better prepare us in the event of an unforeseen challenge. Since this is a United States Homeland Security (DHS) Grant, we have had to go through many time-consuming processes in order to be approved to actually start the improvements.

DHS must see three bid proposals for each project; all three must be from "approved providers." There are multiple approval steps that need to be executed—one at a time—before proceeding to the next step. While we would have loved to just start, in order for B'nai Tikvah to be reimbursed by the Government, we cannot violate or ignore any of the steps. Approval by DHS is a very complicated process, but on a positive note, we are 100% ensured that our actions are endorsed by DHS. We're not going it alone; we're doing what's best for B'nai Tikvah.

While I won't get into the specific actions we are undertaking, for security reasons, we are happy to report that we have just received final approval to proceed with our first project. The work will begin shortly and, once completed, we will move ahead with further steps in our overall improvements. We are taking this process EXTREMELY SERIOUSLY and have been moving ahead as quickly as the Homeland Security process will allow us. On another positive note, DHS informed us that we were the first approved religious facility among those approved.

In the area of Capital Improvements, thanks to the generosity of our Shomri Tikvah donors, we already have completed one of our major projects; the second one is moving along at a rapid pace and will be ready for enjoyment and comfort shortly.

The first project was laying new sidewalks around the entire front of the synagogue. Thanks to our partners at Advance Pavement Group and the leadership there of

Ruben Salgado, we have a beautiful new front around B'nai Tikvah that, with proper care, should last many years. The entire project took less than a week to complete. We took great pride in selecting a vendor with experience and the know-how to address such a large request. We know everyone not only notices the difference, but finds it easier to navigate the front of the building.

Project number two is underway: the Beit Midrash (Prayer & Comfort Room for Minyon & Junior Congregation), where we are undergoing major Renovations. This includes new built-in and covered book shelves, a more appropriate door placement (and new attractive door), new ceiling, paint, furniture, molding, and carpet. While we ask people to avoid entering the room, we know these improvements will make for a more comforting and attractive experience as we move ahead upgrading our ever-aging building. This project comes through the wonderful work, thus far, of Anthony Rose and Mike Florie of Nic-Lex Construction and we couldn't be happier with their thoughtfulness and caring. Also thanks to our own David Cukor who is working on the carpet portion of this effort. Soon all of us will have a very attractive room to be proud of.

So, as you can see, lots of wonderful things are going on here at B'nai Tikvah and it comes, not only through the thoughtfulness of all our contributors but, through the hours of the committees, board members, and administration leaders here overseeing all of the process. We couldn't do this without all of us, our huge B'nai Tikvah Family.

All we ask is patience as we complete everything and move ahead. We look forward to updating all of you soon as we make B'nai Tikvah even better because, "At B'nai Tikvah, You Can."



How it works:


- Every month, you will receive two bottles of Kosher Wine from one of the many wineries in Israel


