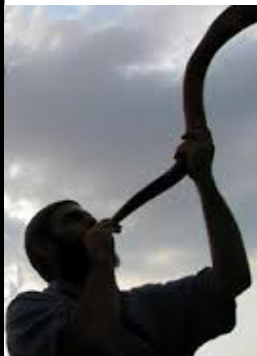

From the Desk of Cantor Rockman

***“You are the Heartbeat
of our Congregation”***



A wonderful trend has been developing at B'nai Tikvah. When you stop in for our evening's service in our beautifully remodeled Beit Midrash, a minyan has greeted you. What a great feeling it is to know that when you arrive to pray, it is your prayers that you can focus upon, not the number of warm bodies in the building.

Except for Sundays, evening minyan has generally been a hard sell. This summer, that has begun to change. Thanks to a suggestion of one of our regular minyan attendees, who is a current mourner, the messaging of our nightly minyan leaders and our app administrator, Stacey Rockman, "WhatsApp" pings have sounded the nightly call to our prayers.

WhatsApp has been around for about ten years and has gained popularity among groups and families trying to keep in touch over various platforms and countries. The app is free and as long as you have an internet connection and are approved by your group's administrator, you can group message, share photos, and make calls all over the world for free!

At some point each day, any person in the group, usually that night's minyan leader, posts a text on the group's chat stating simply:
"I'm #1" with that person's name or phone number.
WE ONLY RESPOND AFFIRMATIVELY,
such as: "Cantor is #2" etc.

We do not send out cajoling messages or reasons why we cannot be present this particular evening.

We only message that we will be there. And when we reach ten, we're done with messaging for the evening. The knowledge and peace of mind that you can count on the minyan is *our message of inspiration.*

Although you are welcome to join the group and new participants are always welcome, it is not our goal to send you a daily inspirational message. It is our goal to let you know that we can count on each other, that B'nai Tikvah is a Holy community dedicated to the spiritual welfare of every person who enters our doors. We'll be here for you.

Chesed

Chesed means "kindness" in Hebrew. The word can also be translated as "lovingkindness," to convey the deep love that animates Jewish acts of kindness, done without thought of reward.

The Bible has numerous examples of *chesed*, such as Abraham and Sarah welcoming three strangers to their tent in the heat of the day; Abraham's servant's prayer for a wife for Isaac, answered by Rebecca who offers water to him and to his camels; and Ruth, who shows loyalty and kindness to Naomi, adopting her religion and peoplehood, after Naomi has experienced great loss. The rabbinic tradition enacted many laws to formalize our commitment to kindness, making *chesed* one of the three central pillars of Jewish life, as Shimon HaTzaddik taught: "The world rests on three things, on Torah, on service of God, and on deeds of kindness" (Pirkei Avot 1:2).

The 5780 (2019-2020) Torah Fund pin depicts a heart surrounded by three circles, one larger than the next. This symbolizes the heart of kindness, which Jews enact in ever-widening realms of generosity: from family, to community, to the larger world; from North America, to Israel, to the world; or from sisterhood, to region, to the larger world of Women's League for Conservative Judaism. And as it is said in Psalm 89, may we build a world of kindness.

We have a Dream: A Mortgage Free Congregation

Over the past few months, in both Congregational Meetings and Hakol, we have discussed how, in just 4½ years, Congregation B'nai Tikvah has the potential to be mortgage free. A mortgage free congregation will enable us to enter a new era of sustainability and opportunity to provide different services to the Congregation. Some of these could include: annual scholarship-in-residence programs, featured speakers, tuition free Hebrew School, reduced dues, etc.

For those who have not been at the meetings, it is also important to note that over the next 4½ years, our mortgage payments will increase by ~\$100,000. (That number could go up if interest rates were to significantly increase.) The Board agreed that the best way to close this gap would be to raise the money through pledges from those who are fortunate enough to be able to provide additional funds to help sustain our community.

In the 2019-20 fiscal year, the mortgage line should have increased by ~\$7000. Due to the generosity of some who pledged during our feasibility assessment and paid some of the obligation, this burden did not go to the members but was covered by our Mortgage Fund.

This summer we began the campaign with phone calls to secure pledges. The committee (Marty Abschutz, Ruth Anne Koenick, Jeff Schwartz, and I) have begun to reach out to Congregants to discuss their opportunity and seek support. At this time, through the generosity of those already reached, we are 40-50% towards our goal.

When the call is made to you, please consider a pledge towards the campaign. All contributions are welcome! Of course, if you want to save yourself from answering the phone, please feel free to reach out to me (adrienne.d.ross@gmail.com) or any of the above and we'll be happy to make the arrangements. One-time contributions, quarterly billing or annual billing are all possible. Monies raised are ONLY used for the mortgage line-item in the budget and are kept in a separate bank account.

If you have questions, don't hesitate to call...and I hope we can speak soon.

PASSPORT TO ISRAEL

In the summer of 2018, my family and I travelled with other members of our congregation to Israel. It was the trip of a lifetime and I truly wish I had visited Israel in my youth. Although there are several reasons I did not, the primary reason was cost. Visiting Israel was expensive, and without any financial assistance, it was not a possibility for my family.

Fortunately, today there are many programs available to assist families to give their teenage children the opportunity to experience Israel. One such program is CBT's Passport to Israel program (PIP). Through this donor-funded program, Congregation B'nai Tikvah will match up to \$1,000 per qualifying student to attend an approved educational program in Israel. This will not cover the entire cost of the trip, but partnered with Financial-support opportunities from other organizations, this will help put a significant dent in the personal outlay. This is an amazing opportunity for your children which I hope you will not pass up.

Happily, many of our youth have taken advantage of this opportunity; however, this has caused the fund to dwindle over time.. This program is NOT funded through congregation dues but rather through donations from generous individuals who believe in investing in both our youth and Israel. Please consider sharing your love of Israel and support of our youth by becoming one of those generous individuals. Your help will ensure that we may continue to provide our youth this amazing opportunity and help our children develop lifelong connections to the land of our people.

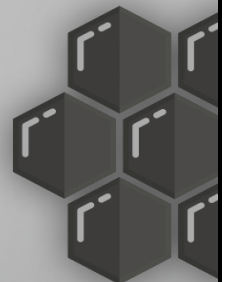
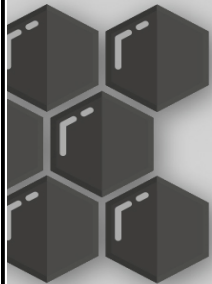

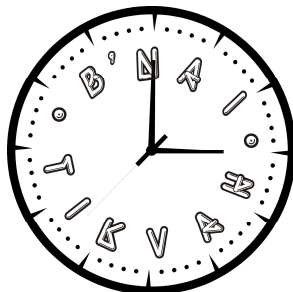
