From Rabbi Robert L. Wolkoff

What it means to be "chosen"



In recent weeks, there has been a spate of articles about Haredim, otherwise known as "black-hat orthdox" or "ultra-orthodox" Jews. The basic theme of these articles has been a kind of deer-in-theheadlights befuddlement about why people seem to have very unpleasant things to say about them.

- "Why does no one care about violence against Orthodox Jews?" reads one title from the Forward. an assertion which, of course, is false (I care very much when any Jew is attacked) but remarkable in its naïveté. It's hard to go to bat for people who in other contexts would spit in your face.
- "Israel is no Violent Theocracy," writes Avi Shafran, a leading apologist for Haredim, as he tries to explain why a nearly endless list of ugly comments and actions by Orthodox Jews in Israel doesn't really constitute "animus" against non-Orthodox Jews. What exactly it does constitute remains a mystery.
- A huge kerfuffle has arisen about an ugly video, put out by Rockland County Republicans, claiming that Hasidic Jews were plotting an invasion that would threaten "our" (that is to say, the non-Hasidic) way of life. The video was, with good reason, roundly condemned as anti-Semitic, and ultimately taken down. But as one official stated, "While the content of the video is factual, the tone and undercurrent is unacceptable." So let's stick with the factual for a second. Anyone who thinks that a large influx of Hasidic Jews will not mean a) the destruction of the local public school system; and b) massive overbuilding, is out of their mind (or at least, hasn't visited Lakewood). We aren't talking speculation here. We're talking on-theground facts, if anyone would care to be honest enough to look at them.
- And finally, I point out that in the recent Israeli elections, the corrupt and coercive influence of the Haredi parties has been the hot button issue.

And Haredi Jews wonder why the rest of us are not precisely enamored of the contempt, denigration, and disrespect directed our way by self-proclaimed "Torah true" Jews? Go figure. How do we explain all of this?

2 Tishrei 5780 - 2 Cheshvan

On my recent trip to Israel with Ruth-Ann and Dahlia, we got an answer. A taxi driver—as usual, purveyors of the best folk wisdom—noticed a Haredi Jew wearing his traditional uniform—fur hat, long black coat, long payos, perfectly appropriate under the blazing 100 degree Jerusalem sun. The driver, a Syrian Jew, announced with great fanfare, "Look, one of the choysen." From that moment on, we could not help but think of "the choysen" every time we saw ultra-Orthodox Jews. Dahlia said she wanted a t-shirt with the words: "Chosen, not choysen". And Ruth-Ann was able to clarify: "Chosen' is a responsibility. 'Choysen' is an attitude."

A bad attitude, one which smacks of arrogance and conceit, not to mention willful blindness. The same Avi Shafran who could write such conciliatory sounding words as "we Orthodox Jews need to understand why fellow Jews are so hurt by" the coercive Orthodox monopoly in Israel, is just as comfortable making the outrageous and insulting claim that "a combination of optimism and ignorance led well-intentioned Jews to believe [incorrectly] that the Conservative movement truly respected our mesorah [our tradition]."

Such denigration is certainly inappropriate for this High Holy Day season of introspection and self examination, but in fact it is inappropriate all the time. "Ahavat Israel," "love for the people of Israel" demands humility, empathy, and mutual understanding, not self-righteous preening. It's what you do when you are "chosen", not "choysen."

With this statement... Sara Hurwitz expresses the comfort and passion she discovered in her own tradition, our ever nurturing Jewish faith. Sarah's journey is filled with the self reflection that led her to an understanding her responsibility beyond her original perceptions of Judaism that continues to impede our spiritual growth.

My search and my struggle are to articulate and inspire others toward a loving expression of what it means to be Jewish. How will I/we inspire our children to feel passionately about Judaism if we ourselves have difficulty communicating our passion?

2 Tishrei 5780 - 2 Cheshvan

As Rabbi Jonathan Sacks states in a hypothetical scenario, "... you are free to choose to embrace any tradition and lifestyle. You are standing in a library filled with books for every tradition and then you come across one a book with your family's name printed on the spine. You open the book, it is the story that each generation of your ancestors has told for the sake of the next, so that everyone born into this family can learn where they came from, what happened to them, what they lived for and why. As you turn the pages, you reach the last, which carries no entry. It bears you name".

Judaism is not just a religion; it is a story of a large, blended, diverse family. Judaism is reserved for all individuals who are born or choose to be Jewish. We can each add our personal journey to our family's tome.

As important as our intellectual journey is, it is ironic that I become sad when the emotional connection to our deeds is missing. More than Anything, Judaism is a joyful tradition.





Why we run this program? The following is an excerpt of one of the thank you notes we received on behalf of a family we sponsored: "This family has never experienced such generosity. They felt overjoyed and emotional upon receiving the gifts. The mother told me she was happy to see that her children finally have toys to play with so they are no longer bored at home. The teachers were commenting that they noticed the children's self esteem improve when they came to school proudly dressed in their new clothes. The children are now appropriately dressed for the weather and are even wearing socks which were noticeably missing prior to receiving the gifts. They sleep much more comfortably at night with their new blankets and their heater....." This is why we run this program...to make a difference in peoples' lives.




