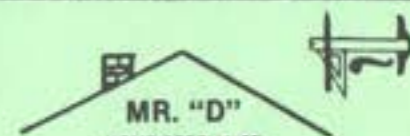

PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

A few weeks ago, on a Saturday evening, I received a telephone call from a temple member demanding to know why I was not at services that morning. He told me that it was my job as president to be there in order to set an example.

I politely explained that I usually attend Friday evening services and that an example can be set not only by attendance, but by the giving of time and effort in helping our synagogue. I then asked if we could call upon him in the future for assistance in helping one of our many understaffed committees or just to help with an occasional phone call. But no, he said that he was not physically able and continued to insist upon knowing why I was not there Saturday. I then told him that occasionally, I work on Saturday, and with that he said "Then You Are NOT Jewish". At that point, I angrily hung up.

Later, after I calmed down, I thought about the conversation. Here was a member of our congregation

who thought that all it meant to be Jewish was to attending services. The giving of yourself, Tsedakah, getting involved, was not sufficient. Without members who got involved and volunteered, we could not function as a synagogue. And now more than ever, as our membership and needs grow, and our overall income does not, we need that spirit of Tsedekah, of help, more than ever. Become more than just a paying member of B'nai Tikvah, become an active member and volunteer; get involved.

Simply call the synagogue office, leave your name, number and what area you are interested in helping with. A committee chairperson will then call you and you will be surprised on how quickly you can get involved.

Upon reflecting about my conversation, I also realized that the person had a point, I should attend services more often, that too is a part of being Jewish.

In preparation for the arrival of a Soviet Jewish family to this area, each grade is preparing a Holiday Box for one of the holidays. Each box will include student made material as well as printed material which will explain the holiday and help the family to celebrate our Jewish holidays.

Our next project will involve the upcoming holiday of Tu B'shvat. Throughout the history of the Holy Land the importance of trees has been significant. From the early pioneers who used trees to help rid the land of malaria infested swamps to the present day agriculturalists who made the desert bloom, trees continue to enrich Eretz Yisrael.

ABOUT US

JERUSALEM: Christians from 65 nations collected almost \$1,000,000 thus far to bring 12 plane loads of immigrants from the Soviet Union to Israel. At the annual feast of Tabernacles (Sukkoth) Christians Celebration here, 3000 Christian visitors to Israel watched as their representatives from 12 countries presented the checks to Prime Minister Shamir in a gesture of faithfulness and solidarity with Israel.

CHICAGO: The Spertus Museum, (the Jewish Museum of Chicago) is housed in the Spertus College of Judaica. Like all the Jewish Museums in our country it differs in its offerings. Among the highlights of a recent visit was a tour of its "tell" (if you cannot remember what a "tell" is, re-read The Source which features objects and artifacts (it is called The Artifact Center) spanning thousands of years. It also includes a friendly sculptured camel to ride plus costumes, curiosity shelves, etc. When in Chicago, keep this in mind. The Museum's Holocaust Memorial bears the statement, "The Holocaust centers around a basic paradox. It imposes silence, but demands speech. It defies solutions, but requires responses"...

ITALY: A recent colloquium held in Italy as part of a Mystery Film Festival was attended by the former head of Mossad (Israel's Intelligence Service) Aharon Yariv, and former Cia director William Colby, among

others. The conclusion was that although the Cold War was dead, espionage has an excellent future because of the complexities of Perestroika. Obviously, spycraft does not suffer from recessions.

WASHINGTON, D.C.: The owner of Moshe Dragon, a kosher Chinese restaurant, has sold his business since there is controversy over the presence of allegedly non-kosher ducks. While the ducks were not found on the premises, receipts from a non-kosher supplier were claimed to have been found in his kitchen. (World Jewry bulletin)

CHILDREN IN ISRAEL: Do you have a child or children presently residing in Israel? If so, please contact the undersigned, and among other things, learn about PNAI (Parents of North American Israelis, Inc.). We know of three families so far. Are there more?

IRELAND: Under the headline, Shamrock Jews, the World Jewish Congress reports that the number of Jews in Ireland has declined by more than half from a population of 5,400 at the end of World War II. According to curator Raphael Siev of the Jewish Museum in Dublin, approximately two dozen Jews leave the Emerald Isle each year, some emigrating to Israel, some to Britain or the United States. How many of us recall colorful Lord Mayor of Dublin Briscoe, who won the hearts of both the Irish and Americans when he visited this country and led the St. Patrick's Day Parade on Fifth Avenue?

ISRAEL: Famed author and psychologist Jonathan Kellerman (The Butcher's Theater, "When the Bough Breaks") and his author wife and three children and just completed one of their many long stays in Israel--this one for two months in Jerusalem. Kellerman has been outspoken about the fact that Jews must physically demonstrate their presence in Jerusalem. He suggests more visitors, particularly American Jews, and more realistic public relations by the Israelis. He also suggests giving wide publicity, with pictures, of Arab atrocities.

TRAVELERS: Have YOU been to Israel recently, or are you leaving it to the Christian visitors from the United States or Europe? You can still join in our own Federation's trip in February or join any group or individual trip. The U.S. State Department recently calculated what it costs daily abroad when their employees are given per diem payments. London will set you back \$177 daily, Paris \$183, Jerusalem only \$116. El Al will also give you vouchers worth up to \$224 if you go this winter. Add the bonus of the Mediterranean sun and the thrill of a lifetime as you visit "our land" and you have one good deal!
