A MESSAGE FROM GARY TINKEL

PRESIDENT OF CONGREGATION B'NAI TIKVAH

It is now almost 6 weeks ago that the Rabbi left on his Sabbatical, and as most of you should have noticed, the Synagogue is still functioning normally. This is due in part to the fine effort of Cantor Dov Goldberg, who has taken over the day to day responsibilities of running the office as well as his normal duties as Cantor and spiritual leader. In addition, members of the Board of Directors, as well as myself, have been trying to make sure that all other operations are run smoothly. We are ALWAYS looking for volunteers to help, so please contact the Synagogue secretary, Wendy, if you can.

Before the Rabbi left, the Cantor and I had made arrangements to speak with him on a monthly basis in Israel to discuss any possible problems that might arise and to keep the Rabbi abreast on what has been happening in his absence. Last week was the second such phone call and the Rabbi asked that I share some of our conversation with you.

The Rabbi and his family have settled in a house that they rented on the outskirts of Jerusalem. He arrived in the midst of the largest snow storm that Israel had in the past 20 years so his family had some problems for the first few days of their arrival. Because they will be staying for six months, the Rabbi bought a car, a 1982 auto with 110,000 miles on it for \$7,000, which I was told is the going rate for a car in Israel. The Rabbi's children have enrolled in the local school system and, I was told, are having no trouble with the language, but since their school day ends at 1:30pm, they spend more time at home than they did here. The Rabbi is enrolled in four courses at four different universities taking Mishnah, Hebrew and Torah studies.

The Rabbi has made several calls to various members since his leaving because of problems, as well as deaths in the family, and will continue to do so throughout his sabbatical. In addition, he promised to fax me a article a month, starting next month, to be included in the coming months Hakols.

Finally, the Rabbi made me promise to make sure to convey to all of you that he is constantly thinking of B'nai Tikvah and is already homesick.

If any members have anything that you wish to convey to Rabbi Warmflash, please let either the Cantor or myself know, and we will make sure that he gets the message.

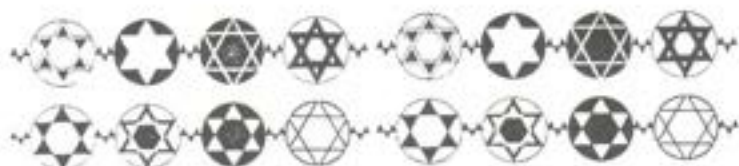

THE JERRY YAROS MEMORIAL JEWISH VIDEO TAPE LIBRARY

There have been several new additions to the video library. The first is called "Island of Hope/Island of Tears." This particular tape tells the story of Ellis Island and the immigrants who were processed there between 1890 and 1924. The story unfolds from the time the immigrants left Europe, to the moment the doors of Ellis opened.

For those wishing to make an in-depth study of topics such as what is the meaning of Mikvah. The Museum of the Mikvah produced an educational film about the role of the Mikvah in the Jewish Life Cycle called, "Waters of Life." It tells the Mikvah's story throughout the ages including archeological discoveries of different Mikvahs all over the world.

Last, but not least, another educational video, filmed in the Jewish Quarter of the Old City, Jerusalem. It tells of Shabbat observance in great detail and is called "The Shabbat Experience." It delves into the 39 Melachot (prohibited categories of "creative work"), the laws of Shabbat and more.

1 LB Cottage Cheese
1 stick margarine or butter
1/2 cup Bisquick
4 tbs. sugar
3 eggs

Melt butter and mix with cottage cheese thoroughly. Add bisquick slowly, then sugar, then egg (one at a time) while mixing. Place into well greased 8" square pan. Bake at 375° degrees for 30-35 minutes. Serve topped with sour cream and/or fruit (Top of loaf will be slightly brown when done.)
