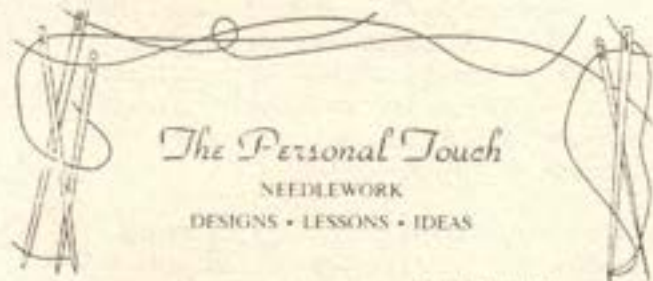
A family picnic for nursery school and Mommy and Me parents and children is scheduled for the beginning of June.

KING DAVID AND SHAVUOT

(From The Jewish Holidays, A Guide and Commentary by Michael Strassfeld)

Because tradition holds that King David was born and died on Shavuot, some people have the custom of reading the Book of Psalms, which is attributed to him. But the connection between the psalms and Shavuot is deeper than biography and legend. David's Psalms reflect the mystical side of the Sinai experience, a side too often lost sight of in the preoccupation with Torah. Torah is only the more concrete dimension of the experience; the revelation of God, the divine being, is the spiritual/mystical one. The latter is in fact the basis of the former, since without the presence of God, the Torah no longer derives from an encounter with the Divine.

As later Judaism came to lay great stress on the mitzvot in all their detail, it became easy to think of Torah as a point system for collecting merit badges from the Great Scoutmaster in the sky. In such a system, it is easy to forget that the real purpose of the mitzvot is to help us "to become a kingdom of priests and a holy nation" and to maintain a covenant with the living God. Psalm after psalm speaks from the depth of David's human experience of his relationship with the divine. The psalms are a response to the revelation of God's presence and seek to continue the interaction that occurred at Sinai between the Eternal and the human. To counterbalance a night of studying Torah, then, it is important to read the Book of Psalms and thereby remember why we were given the Torah and by whom.

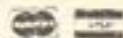
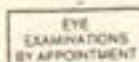

ABOUT US

GERMANY -- Incredibly, the New York Times reports that Germany is considering a Jew as head of their government, though the candidate refuses to run, probably fearing to become a scapegoat if the country has difficulties.

TURKEY -- Suddenly, there are a number of books appearing on the subject of Turkish Jewry, a country that has been historically hospitable to Jews for hundreds of years. It should be noted, for those considering a trip to this ancient land, that it is also friendly to American tourists. No "Yankee go home" noises, and the food is good.

POLAND -- The Association of Polish Jews in Israel states that more than 200,000 soldiers of Jewish origin served in Polish Army units during World War II. Of 492 Poles decorated after the battle of Monte Cassino, Italy -- 126 were Jewish. Of 489 decorated after the battle of Lenino, then the Soviet Union, 108 were Jewish.

LAKE KINNERET -- (also known as the Sea of Galilee) may soon boast a five kilometer boardwalk on its shores, according to the Israeli Tourism and Religious Affairs ministries. Capernaum will be one of the sites included, and financing is to come from Christian groups in Italy.

BULGARIA -- Stoyan Ganev, president of the U.N. General Assembly, is also Foreign Minister of Bulgaria. In contrast to his predecessor, Samir Shihabi of Saudi Arabia, who never lost any opportunity

to be anti-Israel, Ganev praises Jewish contributions to international peace. It should be borne in mind that the Bulgarians and the Bulgarian Orthodox Church played a heroic role during the Holocaust, largely refusing to deport their country's 48,000 Jews. And on March 10, 1943, in an event called "the miracle of the Jewish people," their citizens actually removed Jews from loaded transport trains.

WEST BANK & GAZA -- Little publicized, but nevertheless true, the Israel Electric Corporation is connecting 200 Arab villages in the West Bank to the national grid, and is improving the electricity supply to the Gaza Strip.

SOCCER, ANYONE? -- The European Soccer Union has at last voted to admit Israeli teams to European fields. They will be invited officially to all European competitions, but will not as yet have a vote in any decision making...

SHABBAT TIDINGS -- Israeli scientists have developed a pen that can be used by Orthodox Jews on the Sabbath. Use of the pen, meant primarily for doctors and soldiers, has been sanctioned by the Sephardic Chief Rabbi. It is based on the principle of invisible ink, with the text vanishing after a number of days, by which time it can be photocopied.

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The Holocaust Museum, scheduled to be opened in April, and which is expected to be a runaway best seller, with waiting lists for tickets, has received a milk can which contained archival materials documenting

the daily life and the destruction of the Warsaw Ghetto. The items were placed in the can for preservation by renowned historian Emanuel Ringelblum.

FISHES FROM HEAVEN -- The Israeli Air Force has a specially equipped bird unit tracking flocks of birds flying to and from Europe and Africa during spring and fall migrations. These flocks are a special danger to aircraft pilots, especially when they enter Israeli air space to rest, nest, catch a bite, or whatever. Recently, the Ramat David airfield found itself floundering (!) in a multitude of dead fish, thereby deactivating the runway. The culprit was a flock of pelicans that stopped at a nearby fish pond for lunch, were startled, took flight, and jettisoned their excess baggage as they departed...open-mouthed of course!
