### RABBI'S MESSAGE

Dear friends,

Every rabbi has certain themes and ideas to which he or she returns again and again. Taken together, they can be said to constitute the vision which the rabbi seeks to impart to the Jewish community in which he or she serves.

For this month's column, my last after nearly 17 years, I have decided to briefly restate ten of the core concerns which have been the focus of my rabbinic work over the years:

1. The most powerful spiritual experiences of life can come in the most commonplace of events. Nothing, for example, is more mysterious or more ordinary than the birth of a child. Nothing infuses life with greater meaning or urgency than the awareness of the inevitability of death.
2. The world is the Lord's in its fullness. All creation bears testimony to the "hand" that shaped it. Judaism offers us a system of commandments, rituals and practices which can enable us to experience God's presence in the world God created.
3. Jews relate to God in the midst of community. A synagogue must, therefore, be a welcoming place where Jews feel at home and nurture one another. All the other objectives of the synagogue—prayer, study, etc.— can best be achieved in a loving community

where people feel like they are part of an extended family.

4. A synagogue is neither a business nor a social club. Synagogue dues are not a fee to be paid for services rendered. The synagogue is a holy institution which seeks to do God's work in the world; supporting it is a privilege, an opportunity and an obligation.
5. God created an imperfect world and then created men and women to be God's partners in perfecting creation. The task isn't ours to complete, neither are we free to desist from it.
6. The Torah is God's love letter to the Jewish people. We read Torah in order to be shaped by it. Its riches are inexhaustible. No matter how many times you read a

7. Judaism can't be understood through study alone, it must be lived. For example: you can study about observing shabbat or keeping kosher but you will never really understand them until you do them.

8. Shabbat is the antidote to the stresses of modern living. It is a restorative spiritual oasis waiting to be discovered. Those who say they don't have time for shabbat, are the ones who need it most of all.

9. Serve the Lord in joy! While kaddish and yizkor have their place, Judaism is a religion of life not death. Ours is joyous, life affirming tradition rich in holidays and celebrations.

10. Judaism isn't just a hobby. It is the essence. It provides the most meaningful response to life's ultimate questions.

In the Hebrew language, it is impossible to say goodbye, only "shalom veh lehitraot", "peace, until we see one another again."

## ABOUT US

**Einstein.** Turkey has just issued an Albert Einstein postage stamp, the 50th country to do so. Zaire, St. Thomas, Uganda, China, Vietnam, are among them.

**Chagall.** Famed artist Marc Chagall, another Jewish son, has also been honored with a stamp as a native son of Belarus (look at the map for location, if you must). Chagall was born on the outskirts of Vitebsk in 1887. His stamp has a depiction of one of his 1913 paintings.

**DNA.** It's not just for criminal cases. An interesting application of the genetic code is being used by scholars, who hope to piece together thousands of Dead Sea Scroll fragments, since traces of animal DNA have been discovered on the scrolls. The genetic code for the ancient manuscripts has been preserved for 2,000 years.

**Martin Luther King's Birthday.** At a World Jewish Congress ceremony marking his 66th birthday, widow Coretta Scott King stated, "Just as Jewish leaders have condemned racism, like Martin Luther King, Jr., I feel I have a moral obligation to deplore the expressions of anti-Semitism that have polluted our society." And, "Anti-Semitism is as vile and contemptible as racism. Anyone who supports it, including African Americans, does a disservice to his people, his country, and his God."

**IKEA.** This popular store was founded by Swede Ingver Kampred, who is also the current chairman. As a youth, he had fascist ties. He has since expressed his regrets, but Swedish leaders believe he should also declare his opposition to all forms of anti-Semitism. Now, word has been received that IKEA is planning to open a branch in Israel. His apology?

Naturally, on our own West Coast, USA, there has been some effort to establish legitimacy for Jewish use, and on good authority, we hear that a Jewish clinical psychologist has suggested substituting "menorah", "hashem" and "Sabbath candles" for the more usual mantras. Some authorities, however, debate that we Jews already have a 3500-year old tradition of meditation. So, how about yoga?

## Old Business

**Rock & Roll Concert (Tinkel)** Cancelled -- too few tickets sold.

**School Tuition Payment (Tinkel)** Articles in Newsflyer and HaKol will explain that nonpayment of tuition is a big problem.

**Motion Asnis.** Religious School billed separately from dues. Members to make four payments by credit card or by check. Members must complete credit card authorization and if they miss a payment by check, they will be informed that their credit cards will be billed. plaques and made only small payments. Directed Kane to order memorial boards and we'll collect outstanding balances.

**Parent transportation** -- Kasdin asked Kadima and USY parents to drive to events. Will need signed permission slips.

Rabbi discussed going to Temple Emanuel at end of contract and will continue to do his best until he leaves. Is eager to help B'nai Tikvah with search process.
