Was Anything Okay?



There's the old joke about a group of picky people at a restaurant. As they finish the meal, the waiter comes up to them and says, "Well, folks, was anything okay?"

Those of us who care about Israel—whose 74th birthday we celebrate on Yom Haatzmaut— sometimes feel like that waiter. With all the complaints about Israel, it's easy to forget what an amazing place it actually is.

To underscore the point, I bring to your attention a number of intriguing facts about Israel, taken from a list of 74 which you can find at Israel21c.com:

- Scientists in Israel managed to grow fresh dates from <u>sixth</u> <u>century seeds</u> found at Masada and Qumran.
- The Israel Postal service has a special Letters to God department, for all the letters arriving in Jerusalem from around the world addressed to God. They are opened and placed into the <u>cracks of the Western Wall</u>.
- Israel dramatically leads the world in share of the total population that received at least one dose of the <u>Covid-19</u> <u>vaccine</u> and in the number of vaccination doses administered per 100 people in the total population.
- Israel is a global leader in medical clowning, and was the first country in the world to send <u>medical clowns into Covid-19</u> wards.
- In 2007, Israeli businesswoman Shari Arison initiated <u>Good</u> <u>Deeds Day</u> to encourage people to help each other. That year, 7,000 people took part in Israel. In 2019, 3.9 million people took part in 108 countries around the world.
- Israel is piloting a new locally-developed <u>AI system to help</u> <u>lifeguards protect swimmers on the beaches</u> and give realtime data on wind, waves and other possible hazards.
- Israel recycles 90% of the waste water it creates, making it the leading nation in the world for water recycling. In the United States, only 1% of wastewater is recycled.
- An Israeli company has developed a <u>revolutionary spray-on</u> <u>skin made of nanofiber</u> to help heal wounds.
- Babies in Israel are 10 times less likely to be allergic to peanuts than in other countries. Studies suggest it's because they eat <u>Bamba peanut snacks</u> from an early age.
- Israel has over 50 alternative meat startups a

disproportionately high number compared to elsewhere around the world – making it a <u>fake meat powerhouse</u>. Perhaps it's no surprise, given that the country has <u>more</u> <u>vegans per capita</u>.

- An Israeli company has developed a <u>paint that uses sunlight</u> <u>to activate a cooling mechanism</u> on cars, buildings, planes and even clothing, providing air conditioning without electricity. The hotter it is, the more the coating cools.
- Israel takes in more immigrants than any other country in the world per capita. Since it was founded in 1948, <u>3.3 million</u> people have immigrated to Israel.
- Israel has more museums per capita than any other country in the world <u>230 and counting</u>. A new museum dedicated to women is <u>opening soon</u>.
- The <u>Mount of Olives</u> is the oldest continuously used cemetery in the world. It's been in use for over 3,000 years.
- An Israeli company has developed an atmospheric water generator that can create <u>clean drinking water from the air</u>. It has been deployed in disaster situations all over the world.
- Israel has the largest underground hospital in the world: the 2,000-bed Sammy Ofer Fortified Underground Emergency Hospital at Rambam Health Care Campus in Haifa.
- A Tel Aviv company has invented <u>a folding car</u> that can retract its wheels for narrow streets and snug spots, but still can reach speeds of 55 miles an hour.
- An Israeli company provides off-grid, <u>solar-powered</u> <u>automatic handwashing stations</u> to developing countries, using water pulled from the atmosphere mixed with a precise dose of soap, to fight the spread of life-threatening infections.
- A revolutionary "<u>human on a chip</u>" developed at Hebrew University aims to replace animal testing for new pharmaceuticals.
- Archeologists recently discovered the <u>world's oldest woven</u> <u>basket</u>, in the Judean Desert.
- The <u>oldest-ever cave tool</u>, dating back 350,000 years, was found in Israel.
- The <u>field of video therapy</u> was invented at Jerusalem's Ma'aleh School of Television, Film and the Arts.
- Israeli companies raised a <u>record-breaking \$10 billion in</u> <u>investments</u> during 2020, despite the uncertainty and instability caused by the worldwide pandemic.
- 85 percent of Israeli households get hot water from rooftop solar heaters, compared to less than 1 percent in the United States.
- Israel has more than <u>300 wineries</u>, 70 of which harvest at least 50 tons of grapes per year. Approximately 60,000 tons of wine grapes are harvested in Israel annually. VP Kamala Harris had wine for her seder from P'sagot, one of our CBT wine club's favorite wineries.

And in case you're still hungry:

• Matzot Aviv in Bnei Brak baked the <u>world's largest matzah</u> this year: 13.2 pounds (6 kilograms), nearly 20 feet (six meters) long, 3.5 feet (1.06 meters) wide, and 0.16 inches (4 millimeters) thick.






