

Let's Get It Together

One of the most remarkable aspects of the Passover celebration is the idea that it determines who is in and who is out of the Jewish community. If you participate, you're in; if you don't, you're out.

Why is this decisive importance attributed to Passover? We don't say the same thing about keeping Shabbat, keeping kosher, or following even the most important moral commandments. To put it simply: you could kill someone and still be part of the Jewish people, but if you don't participate in the seder, you're in trouble.

What's up with all that? Rabbi Chayim Bloch includes the following statement: "It is incumbent upon the true Hasid to lead his people back to unity by making no account of whatever disunites them—the difference between the learned and the vulgar, between the rich and the poor. For God and Israel are one, and their unison above will be restored by a reunion below. Nothing more precious exists in the sight of God than the Unity of His Chosen People—as it is said in Midrash Tanchuma to Deuteronomy, 'If the nation only lives in unity, God will not punish it even for worshipping idols.' In fact, Israel cannot be redeemed until united."

The proof that this is true comes from our history of the Exodus. When it was time to leave Egypt, God didn't check who was rich and who was poor, who was pious and who was not, who was a Republican and who was a Democrat, who was a Giants fan and who was a Cowboys fan (although I'm not so sure about that last part. Maybe it would have been better...but I digress). It was all of us, together, as one. We had suffered together; we were going to be liberated together.

Awareness of our history of suffering, and the lack of that awareness, is the only real dividing line. More than anything else, it influences our views of the past, present, and future.

At this moment in time, there is great turmoil in our country, in Israel, and in the world. Exactly how all of that will impact the Jewish community, I cannot predict. But I have no doubt that it will impact the Jewish community. And I similarly have no doubt that when it does, the thing that will matter most is Jewish unity.

May this Passover, a time when we invite "all that are hungry, all that are in need" into our homes, be a celebration of that unity and a stimulus of it as well.

Enjoy a zissen pesach, a sweet and joyful Passover.





It is understood that you might not be available to drive on the given day that there is a need. Thanks in advance to Shelly Talmud for all her work preparing for and overseeing the March Chaverim meeting.

Save the Date - April 25th - observe Israel's Yom HaZikaron (Memorial Day) and celebrate Yom Ha'atzmaut (Independence Day) with a presentation by our Federation's own Dan Rozett.

Thank you to those who have donated to the Social Action Fund. Your generosity enabled us to give help to our fellow congregants in need this month, as well as provide the presentation/entertainment portion of our new Chaverim program.

A huge thank you to Carol Eisenberg and Jay Scheuer who check the trunk and deliver the food to JFS.

Beginning on April 2nd, through June 4th, we will be collecting Jewish and secular books, CDs, DVDs, VHS tapes, and cassette tapes (yes, you read that correctly!) for the Wilf Campus for Senior Living in Somerset's library and media room. No vinyl. All donations must be in good condition with intact jackets and cases. Please consider that seniors will be the recipients of these items when making your selections. Place your items in sturdy bags or boxes and bring them to nursery room 2. Siddurim, chumashim, and all holy texts should be packed and marked separately and placed on a shelf in the closet.

Please mark your calendars for our 2nd annual Mitzvah Day on June 11th. JFS, Elijah's Promise, and Interfaith Rise will once again be recipient organizations. More are in the works. To be part of the planning or to RSVP that you will attend, please contact me. Last year we had 65 attendees performing mitzvahs. This year let's grow it to 85.


