From Rabbi Robert L. Wolkoff



At a recent Bar Mitzvah ceremony, I had occasion to mention the rabbinic principle: “Turn it and turn it, for all is in it.” (Taught by Ben Bag Bag—that’s really his name—*Pirkey Avot* 5:24).

All? Seriously? Yes all. Seriously.

To prove this, I would like to address one of the burning questions of our day: Would food from a Star Trek replicator be kosher?

The answer is yes. Here’s why. The Gemara (Sanhedrin 59b) asks: “Is there such a thing as meat that descends from heaven? The Gemara answers: Yes, it is like this incident: As Rabbi Shimon ben Halafta was walking along the way, he encountered lions that were roaring at him, intending to eat him. He said: “The young lions roar after their prey, and seek their food from God” ([Psalms 104:21](#)), and they deserve to receive food. At that point, two thighs of an animal descended from heaven for him. The lions ate one of these thighs, and they left the other one. He took it and entered the yeshiva, and asked about it: Is this thigh kosher or treif? The Sages said to him: Certainly it is kosher, as a non-kosher item does not descend from heaven.”

What principle can we derive from this? That the issue in deciding kashrut is not what the food in question *is*. It’s what the food in question *came from*. Replicator “meat” doesn’t come from animals. It comes from recycled matter, broken down to constituent atoms, and then used to “replicate”—i.e., to resemble—certain foods.

This is in keeping with a halachic principle called “*davar chadash panim hadashot*” literally “new thing, new characteristics.” Quoting from the Rabbinical Assembly teshuvah (legal opinion), “when a substance goes through a transformation that

changes it into something completely new, it also loses its former status in regard to being forbidden food.” Based on this conclusion, “a substance treated by another substance which transforms it chemically thus becomes *panim hadashot*, a substance with new characteristics (including a new kosher status).

Chemical transformation, in this context, is simply the breaking of the original chemical bonds, and the formation of new chemical bonds. Everything a Star Trek replicator makes is therefore a *davar chadash*. So you’re good to go. As Captain Picard would say, “Engage!”

Meanwhile, back on planet Earth, we have a whole variety of “Impossible” burgers, chicken, and even pork. These are not replicated, but instead use a soy-based genetically engineered heme, a kind of molecule found in both meat and plants. In other words, nothing in “Impossible” meat comes from an animal, and hence it is kosher. But the “Impossible Pork” is usually not certified kosher just because, well, kosher pork just does not sound...um...kosher.

The bottom line: Impossible meat is good for July 4. Replicator meat is good for star date 47634.44.

Just what you needed to know. Turn it and turn it, for all is in it.

Have a 4th of July that’s out of this world.

MITZVAH DAY AND MORE



Our second annual Mitzvah Day was attended by 48 members who came together in the service of others on Sunday, June 11th. A special thank you goes to Shelly Talmud, Renee Levin, Steve Talmud, Craig Cohen, Dot Cohen, Carol Eisenberg and Cheryl Crick for planning, leading and schlepping. Big thanks to our youth, Gavin Simon, Lucas Schwalb, Maisy Crick, Miriam Crick, Emma Cohen, Derek Berness, Shane Berness, Max Manson, Bashe Rockman and Rafi Rockman who showed that caring for others and repairing the world is a priority for them. I apologize if I failed to mention someone.

Much gratitude to all those who delivered boxes and bags to the nonprofits we served.

Together we weeded a 2 acre farm plot, cooked 8 trays of baked ziti, packed 100 snack bags, decorated 50 tote bags and filled them with groceries, sorted school supplies and filled 24 backpacks, packed hundreds of CDs/ VHS tapes, counted tzedakah, cleaned lots of toys in a Religious school classroom, and wrote cards to Jewish Ukrainian children. The recipient organizations were JFS, Tikva Odessa, Elijah's Promise, Wilf Campus for Jewish Living, CBT and Interfaith Rise, which has a farm plot at Rutgers organic garden Cook Campus. They offer a CSA, which is a farm share. It is a beautiful way to support them, and receive fresh vegetables weekly. I purchased one myself. To purchase: log onto interfaithrise.org, click on Global Grace marketplace, then put "Farm" in the search bar.

Other notes: we continue to collect Kosher nonperishable food for JFS food pantry. Requested foods are low sugar cereals, pasta, sauce, peanut butter, jelly, canned fruit, canned veggies, canned beans. Place your food in the wicker trunk outside the office.

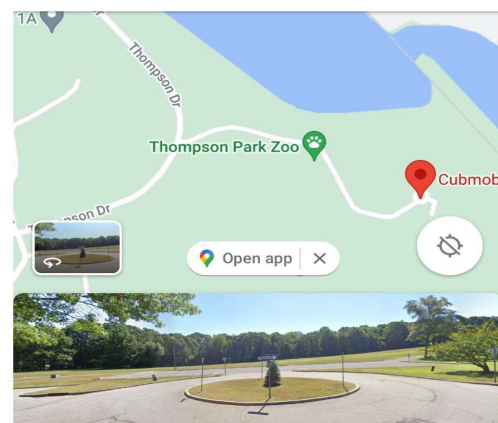
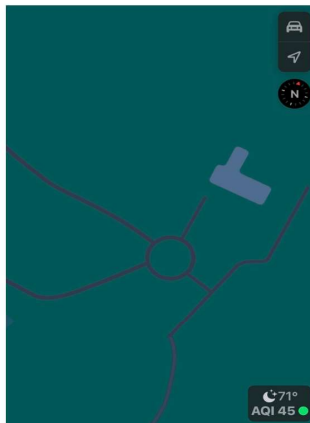
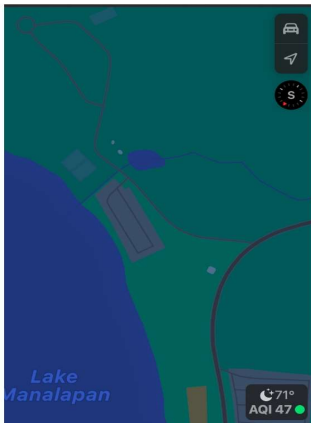

Chronicle of Florida's Jews July 11, 2023—8:30pm via Zoom

The Sunshine State's Jews, working for common good, have been Olympians, Nobel Prize winners, computer pioneers, educators, politicians, leaders in business and the arts and more, while maintaining their heritage to help ensure Jewish continuity for future generations. Today, Florida has the third largest population in the nation and the third largest Jewish community.

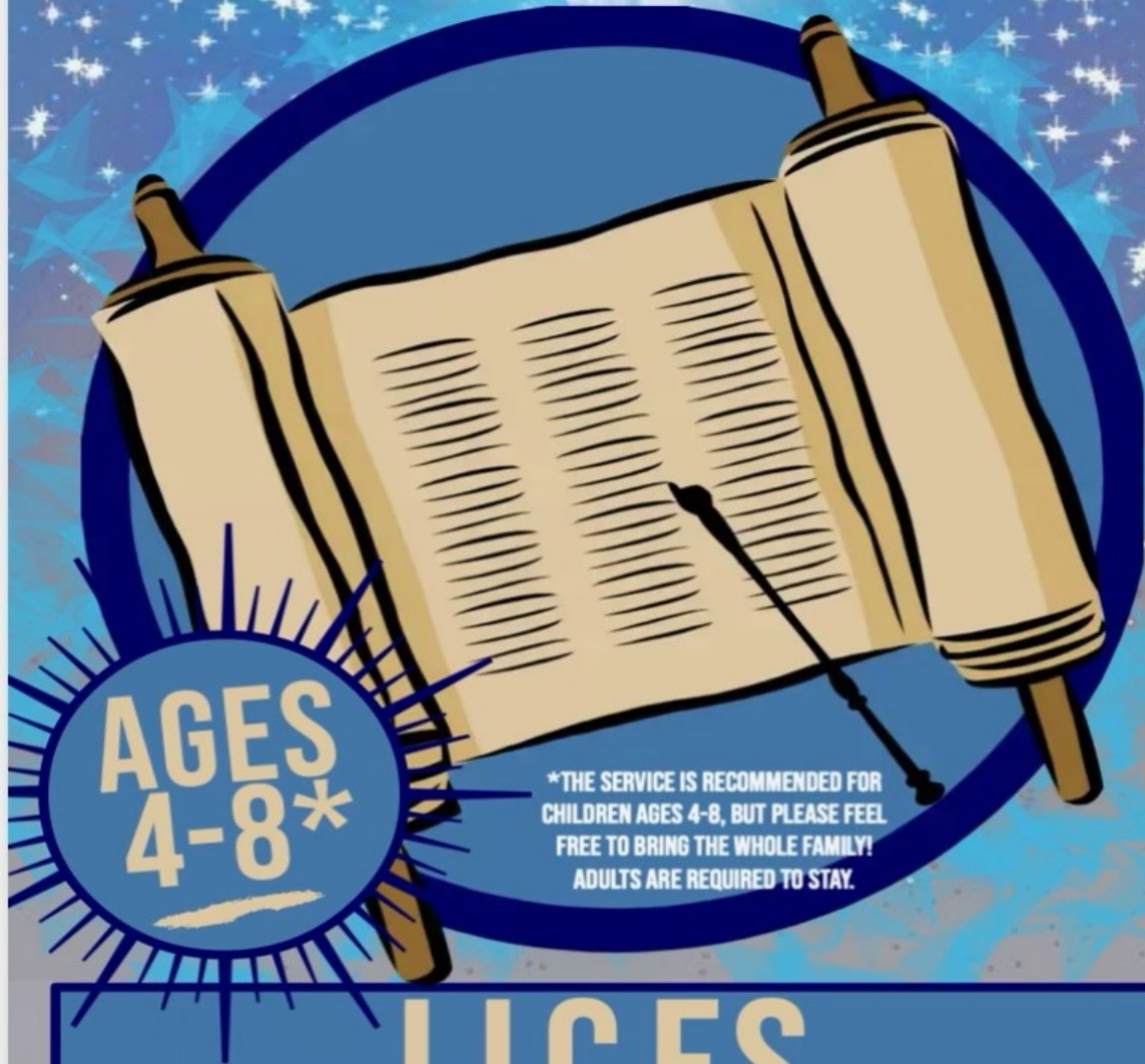

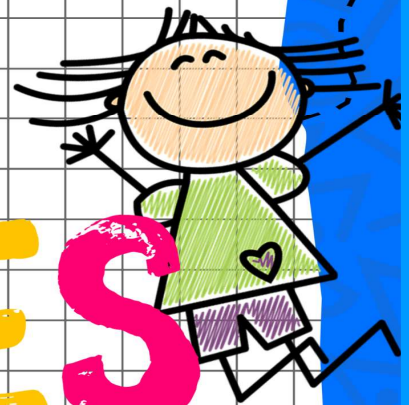
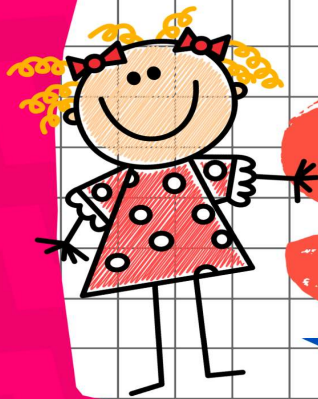
