

#### From Rabbi Robert L. Wolkoff

#### **DUMBER'N FROGS**



This time of year, the month of Av, is associated with jeremiads. Literally. We read repeatedly Jeremiah's condemnations of our people: our greed, our immorality, our betrayal of G-d, our exploitation of the Land, and, in a simple phrase, our stubborn stupidity. All of these led to the disaster of the destruction of the First Temple (and the Second Temple, and related calamities through the ages, all commemorated on Tisha B'Av).

Jeremiah sums it all up perfectly when he writes, "Hear now this, O foolish people, without understanding; which have eyes, and see not; which have ears, and hear not." (5:21). It was probably from this that the popular English proverb was minted: There is none so blind as he who will not see.

These days, Jeremiah would feel right at home. Just as our people faced a catastrophic situation 2500 years ago, the entire planet, the planet we were supposed to tend and nurture, is facing a catastrophe today.

And still, there are some who will not see. And at this point, the question is, "Exactly how much must happen before they decide to actually see?"

#### Consider:

- July 3 saw the hottest average global temperature in the past 125 thousand years. The next three days were even hotter.
- This was the hottest June ever. It broke the record by 0.5 degrees. Usually, records are broken by 0.1 or even 0.01 degrees.
- Heat records are being set more frequently.
- Flooding is increasing in frequency and intensity.
- Rainfall records are being set more frequently.
- Coastal flooding has doubled over a few decades.
- Antarctica sea ice is at record low levels.
- North Atlantic temperatures are at unprecedented levels, up a full 9 degrees.
- One in a thousand year events have a 0.1% chance of occurring in any given year. There were six in July of 2022.

And on and on....

And still you can find people bloviating about "climate hysteria." I don't know all their names, but I do know exactly who they are: the same people who were telling Jeremiah to calm down.

The scientific consensus on anthropogenic climate change (translation: we broke it, we have to buy it) is, literally, higher than 99.9%. But what do they know? And besides, they're in it for the money...and they're bureaucrats...and liberals...communists...tree huggers...Meanwhile, we have bright lights in Congress who think the oceans are rising because rocks fall into them (seriously: check out former Congressman Mo Brooks).

We all know the story of the frog in a pot of water. Increase the temperature gradually, and the frog will stay in until it boils to death. Well, that's what we are doing. Already, 30% of the world's population—2.4 billion people—are at risk for deadly heat waves. (And if the heat don't kill ya, the migration will—think about how poorly the world handles 5 million displaced people a year. Now think about 500 million. Get the picture?)

And here's the joker in the deck. The story about the frogs is a myth. Frogs do know when it's too hot for them, and they hop out of the pot. What does that say about us? And remember, we have no place to hop to.

Dumber'n frogs.

Somewhere, Jeremiah is just shaking his head.

The rabbis taught that the messiah will be born on Tisha B'Av. On the day of our greatest tragedy, when things are at their worst, the power and promise of hope are at their strongest. If we open our eyes, and see the reality around us, and DO SOMETHING ABOUT IT, this time of stubborn stupidity may just give way to the forces that can save the planet for our children and grandchildren. May it only be so.

This year's gathering at Montclair State University, was the first post Covid in person NewCAJE. I've continued to attend NewCAJE because it is a place for spiritual and professional renewal. I always leave with enthusiasm for the year ahead and that would be enough, but I also receive and have been able to share many concrete benefits with our community.

From my earliest experiences at CAJE, I met and developed relationships with the many Jewish musical artists, which inspired the Sons of Tikvah Band and the L'dor Vador concerts. I met or was exposed to Debbie Friedman z"I, Sam Glaser, Craig Taubman, Josh Nelson, Pharaoh's Daughter and others, who shared their exceptional talent with us.



Before Covid in 2019, Stacey joined me at Reed College in Portland, Oregon, where we became a *Better Together* cohort, which has been a bridge for our religious school and is our multi-generational program which continues to thrive under Stacey's direction.

This year I had the opportunity to renew old acquaintances, in particular with Sam Glaser, who himself remains grateful to CAJE for helping forge his career as a Jewish performing and recording artist. Although I did not find another "Better Together", I believe that similar opportunities may develop. More than anything else the magic of CAJE lives on. The awesome vibes that I receive from these conferences are a result of a few 60's idealistic individuals who envisioned a meaningful future for Judaism, Israel and our connections to God and each other. Today we are charged to continue to engage, reimagining our contribution to a better world inspired by our relationships, which are all and will always be spiritual.

#### REFLECTIONS AND LOOKING AHEAD

It is mid summer, and with Rosh Hashanah approaching in exactly two months from the very day I write this, I'm reflecting back on our activities in 5783 and looking forward to doing more *Chesed* as a group, and nurturing our connections with area not-for-profits in 5784.

Social Action helped our members this past year, usually with meals, store gift cards, and doing errands, and remains committed to doing so through your generosity to the Jodi Wexler Marcou Social Action Fund. We held a winter clothing drive to benefit *Homefront* in Lawrenceville (Homefrontnj.org) and *Elijah's Promise* in New Brunswick (Elijahspromise.org), began collecting nonperishable food year round for Jewish Family Service's kosher food pantry, and in February, created *Chaverim*, a monthly lunch and socialization program, with speakers and entertainers for our members over age 60 in collaboration with JFS.

Our second annual *Mitzvah Day* was held on June 12th, with our CBT family coming together to do good for area Jewish and non-Jewish organizations, as well as *Tikva Odessa*, which rescues Ukrainian Jewish children and brings them to Romania, and for CBT.

As you think about giving tzedakah, especially between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, an auspicious time to give charity to merit a good year, I must spread the word about two truly amazing Jewish charities in N.J, (and two other states):

*Olam Chesed- World of Giving* (worldofgiving.org), and *Special Children's Center* (thecenternj.org).

Olam Chesed was started by a Rabbi and Rebbetzin in 2013, who established relationships with large retailers like Target and Amazon to receive their overstock and unsellable items from clothing to furniture, acquired warehouse space, and began giving these items to charities, needy individuals and stepping up to help during natural disasters.

Special Children's Center began over twenty years ago, when two teenage girls helped their neighbors with special needs children by providing respite care. The demand increased and the girls sought to raise funds to provide their services in a central location. Despite their young age, they were successful, and still direct the organization today, which has four locations, and multiple programs including after school, summer camp, an annual winter vacation trip, overnight stays in a homey setting, and job training for adults with special needs.




